BACKGROUND:

<u>Summary</u>

The County of Riverside Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the Five-Year Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the Riverside Auto-Theft Interdiction Detail (RAID) in Minute Order 3.29 dated February 26, 2019. On January 7, 2020, in Minute Order 3.16, the Board ratified and approved the First Addendum to the MOU for RAID. On May 19, 2020, in Minute Order 3.30, the Board ratified and approved the Second Addendum to the MOU for RAID. Finally, on May 18, 2021, in Minute Order 3.15, the Board ratified and approved the Third Addendum to the MOU for RAID.

During the MOU period, an addendum was issued on June 14, 2022, to revise the MOU based on the following items effective July 1, 2022:

- Section IV, Fiscal Procedures, E. Overtime, was revised to increase the overtime bank per employee from 150 hours annually to 400 hours annually.
- Section XIV, Signatures, was revised to update signature block for Border Division Chief Scott J. Parker from the California Highway Patrol (5), Investigations Division Deputy Director Christina Michael from Department of Motor Vehicles (12), and Chief of Police Anthony Conrad from the Murrieta Police Department (7). The section was also revised to remove signature block for Director of Operations Tom Downey from the National Insurance Crime Bureau.

The overtime bank increased to allow RAID task force personnel to work special operations that normally occur after business hours.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The RAID task force will continue their collective efforts to deter vehicle theft, increase the apprehension and identification of the professional vehicle thief, increase the recovery of stolen vehicles, and educate the citizens of Riverside County in vehicle theft prevention.

Additional Fiscal Information

Funding is from the Riverside Auto Theft Interdiction Detail sub-fund. There will be no impact on County's General Fund.

ADDENDUM TO THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE RIVERSIDE AUTO-THEFT INTERDICTION DETAIL (June 14, 2022)

Italics note past or pending revisions. Bold italics note proposed language change.

1 Whereas on July 1, 2022, this addendum to the Memorandum of Understanding for the Riverside 2 Auto-Theft Interdiction Detail (RAID) was revised to reflect changes in Section IV (Fiscal 3 Procedures), Subsection E (Overtime), and to amend signatures of the Executive Committee and 4 remove signatures of participants not on the Executive Committee. 5 6 This addendum shall reflect the agreement discussed at the June 14, 2022, RAID Executive Board 7 Meeting and will remain in effect until amended by the Executive Committee. 8 9 **Revise Section IV, FISCAL PROCEDURES** 10 11 E. Overtime 12 Effective July 1, 2022, and at the start of each fiscal year, an overtime bank of four hundred 13 (400) hours per employee will be established. Reimbursement claims for actual task force 14 overtime hours worked may be submitted for approval by the Task Force Coordinator on a form provided by the Sheriff's Department, Office of Accounting and Finance. no later than the 15th 15 16 day of the month following the end of the quarter the participant worked. These claims will be 17 reimbursed through task force funding based on the established rate of each employee. The 18 Task Force Supervisor, with oversight of the coordinator, will control the overtime use. All 19 overtime use will require preapproval and justification. If operational necessity should exceed 20 the *four hundred (400)* hour bank, each participating agency agrees to absorb the costs for their 21 respective employee. Reimbursement for overtime incurred by CHP participants will be paid 22 pursuant to a separate agreement between CHP and the County of Riverside. 23 24 (This change reflects an increase of the overtime bank per employee from 150 hours annually to 25 400 hours annually.) 26 27
