BACKGROUND:

Summary

The purpose of the State Homeland Security Program Grant (SHSP) is to support state and local efforts to prevent terrorism and other catastrophic events and to prepare the Nation for the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk to the security of the United States. The SHSP assists state, Tribal and local preparedness activities that address high-priority preparedness gaps across all core capabilities where a nexus to terrorism exist. Riverside County, functioning as the Operational Area (OA), applies for the SHSP each year and sub-grants to cities within the County.

The amount applied for has been pre-determined by CalOES through a funding formula which considers both a base and the county population. On October 24, 2022, CalOES awarded the Riverside OA federal pass-through funding in the amount of \$2,398,206 to enhance the OA's abilities to prevent, deter, respond to, and recover from threats and incidents of terrorism and other catastrophic events.

EMD, on behalf of the Riverside County OA, is the lead agency for the SHSP grant and will submit the application as requested by CalOES. As the lead agency, EMD will retain \$189,321 to manage and administer this grant. The remaining \$2,208,885 is distributed among the approved projects. The expenditure period for these funds is from September 1, 2022 through May 31, 2025. A new Signature Authority Resolution is required with each year's application.

On December 18, 2002, Item 3.26, the Board of Supervisors appointed the Anti-Terrorism Approval Authority (ATAA) as the review board used for determining the utilization and distribution of SHSP funds. The ATAA board has recommended, and the Riverside County OA has been awarded, funding for the projects listed below. The benefit of these projects will be realized among 25 cities/agencies throughout Riverside County:

Impact on Residents and Businesses

SHSP funds are used to sustain capabilities for the entire OA. These funds have no adverse effect on citizens or businesses. The impact to our citizens is that through training, equipping our first responders, and planning, the communities are better served and protected. The OA also offers training directly to the communities through the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program which provides training to our communities on how to be self-sustaining and have the ability to help their neighbor during a catastrophic incident. The OA also participates in many emergency preparedness groups that are made up of residents and businesses and provides emergency preparedness materials and training through outreach activities such as safety fairs.

Additional Fiscal Information

The SHSP grant is federally funded through CalOES and is 100% reimbursable upon approval of the application.
