**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. The donation to Sunshine Haven Wildlife (\$4,000.00) will be used to finish the spreading of gravel loads and skip loader work at Robidoux Natural Center. Finishing the gravel work will be more effective for parking vehicles as well as walking on the trails. Sunshine Haven Wildlife's mission is to conduct zoonotic surveillance for the benefit of public health; to provide public education on human-wildlife conflicts, habit restoration and ecosystem at the center.
- 2. The donation to Assistance League of Riverside Corona-Norco Branch (\$2,500.00) will be used for the Wine & Roses Fundraiser Dinner which funds are used for Operation School Bell. The Branch program, Operation School Bell, focuses on students from very low-income families referred to the program by the school district. These students, along with a parent or guardian, meet volunteer members at a Target store and shop for new school clothes.
