BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Political Reform Act prohibits a public official from using his or her position to influence a government decision in which he or she has a financial interest. Government Code section 87300 requires local government agencies to adopt and promulgate a Conflict of Interest Code identifying officials and employees required to file statements of economic interest based on the positions they hold. A local government agency, as defined by Government Code section 82041, includes the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority.

Each even-numbered year, Government Code section 87306.5 requires local government agencies to review their Conflict of Interest Code, make appropriate revisions, if necessary, and submit an amended Conflict of Interest Code to the code reviewing body. Government Code section 82011(b) identifies the Board of Supervisors for the County of Riverside as the code reviewing body for a local government agency within its county.

The Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority recently amended its Conflict of Interest Code on September 22, 2022 to add and revise titles of existing positions that participate in making governmental decisions. The Board of Directors for Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority has adopted Resolution No. 22-006, amending its Conflict of Interest Code. The Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority has submitted its amended Conflict of Interest Code for approval by the Board of Supervisors as the code reviewing body.

This office has reviewed the Conflict of Interest Code of the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority and has found that it complies with statutory requirements. A complete copy of the Conflict of Interest Code of the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority is attached.

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors approve the Conflict of Interest Code of the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority and direct the Clerk of the Board to notify the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority of the action taken.

RESOLUTION 22-006

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNTY REGIONAL WASTEWATER AUTHORITY AMENDING THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE PURSUANT TO THE POLITICAL REFORM ACT OF 1974

WHEREAS, the State of California enacted the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code section 81000 et seq. (the "Act"), which contains provisions relating to conflicts of interest which potentially affect all officers, employees and consultants of the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority ("WRCRWA") and requires all public agencies to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors adopted a Conflict of Interest Code (the "Code") which was amended by the Board on September 24, 2020; and

WHEREAS, subsequent changed circumstances within WRCRWA have made it advisable and necessary pursuant to Sections 87306 and 87307 of the Act to amend and update WRCRWA's Code; and

WHEREAS, the potential penalties for violation of the provisions of the Act are substantial and may include criminal and civil liability, as well as equitable relief which could result in WRCRWA being restrained or prevented from acting in cases where the provisions of the Act may have been violated; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public meeting on, and of consideration by the Board of Directors of, the proposed amended Code was provided each affected designated position and publicly posted for review; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held upon the proposed amended Code at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors on September 22, 2022, at which all present were given an opportunity to be heard on the proposed amended Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority that the Board of Directors does hereby adopt the proposed amended Conflict of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be on file with the Board Secretary and available to the public for inspection and copying during regular business hours;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said amended Code shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors of Riverside County for approval and said Code shall become effective immediately upon approval of the Code as submitted.

(Amended September 22, 2022)

The Political Reform Act (Gov. Code § 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. § 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing Section 18730 may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This incorporation page, Regulation 18730 and the attached Appendix designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the Western Riverside County Regional Wastewater Authority (WRCRWA).

All officials and designated positions required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the Board Secretary as WRCRWA's Filing Officer. The Board Secretary shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by the Board of Directors and Administrator and forward the originals of such statements to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside. The Board Secretary shall retain the original statements filed by all other officials and designated positions and will make all

retained statements available for public inspection and reproduction during regular business hours. (Gov. Code § 81008.)

The Administrator's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code. (Gov. Code § 81008.)

EXHIBIT "B"

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of economic interests that the designated position must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned. ³ "Investment" means financial interest in any business entity (including a consulting business or other independent contracting business) and are reportable if they are either located in, doing business in, planning to do business in, or have done business during the previous two years in the jurisdiction of the WRCRWA.

<u>Category 1:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that are located in, that do business in or own real property within the jurisdiction of WRCRWA.

<u>Category 2:</u> All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the jurisdiction of WRCRWA, including any leasehold, beneficial or ownership interest or option to acquire property.

<u>Category 3:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that are engaged in land development, construction or the acquisition or sale of real property within the jurisdiction of WRCRWA.

<u>Category 4:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by WRCRWA.

<u>Category 5:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the designated position's department, unit or division.

<u>Category 6:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, subject to the regulatory, permit, or licensing authority of the designated position's department, unit or division.

<u>Category 7:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, from sources, that filed a claim against WRCRWA during the previous two years, or have a claim pending against WRCRWA.

³ This Conflict of Interest Code does not require the reporting of gifts from outside this agency's jurisdiction if the source does not have some connection with or bearing upon the functions or duties of the position. (Reg. 18730.1)

<u>Category 8:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, or income from a nonprofit organization, if the entity or source is of the type to receive grants or other monies from or through WRCRWA.
