3. Authorize \$2,000,000 for First Five from District 2- 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> ARPA allocations, to be obligated for the Lakeland Village Child Care Facility;
4. Authorize \$200,000 from District 2 - 2<sup>nd</sup> ARPA allocation, to be obligated for ARPA CID Non-Profits;
5. Authorize \$6,050,000 to Housing, Homelessness and Workforce Solutions from District 2 – 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> ARPA allocations, to be obligated for the Corona Del-Rey and Corona Del-Oro Apartments Rehabilitation; and
6. Authorize \$2,000,000 to Western Municipal Water District (WMWD) from District 2- 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> ARPA allocations, to be obligated for the Rural Riverside Fire Hydrants and Resiliency project.

**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 (H.R. 1319) in to law. The \$1.9 trillion package is intended to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, including the public health and economic impacts.

As part of the \$362 billion in federal fiscal recovery aid for state and local governments, \$65.1 billion is provided in direct aid to counties. Riverside County's share of the American Rescue Plan funding is \$479,874,599, of which the first installment of \$239,937,299 was received on May 10, 2021, and the second installment in the same amount was received on June 6, 2022. The funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026.

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On October 4, 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved the ARPA 2<sup>nd</sup> installment funding allocation which allocated \$33 million per district to be obligated towards infrastructure, housing and homelessness, workforce development, neighborhood revitalization, business revitalization, childcare facilities, and non-profits.

District 2 has started the process of prioritizing and identifying eligible projects, to be delivered by County Departments and external agencies and is requesting to obligate a total of \$26,500,000 from its remaining 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> ARPA allocations to the below eligible ARPA projects:

- Santa Ana River Trail Enhancements - Parks - \$1,000,000
- Santa Ana River bottom Homeless Encampment Remediation – Parks - \$5,000,000
- Rancho Esperanza DPSS Housing - Parks - \$4,500,000
- Temescal Road Improvements (Environmental and Design) - TLMA - \$4,300,000
- El Cariso Fire Station Sidewalk - TLMA - \$250,000
- Rancho Jurupa Park Repavement - TLMA- \$1,200,000
- Lakeland Village Childcare Facility – First Five - \$2,000,000
- Community Improvement Designation Fund - ARPA Non-Profits - \$200,000
- Corona Del-Rey Apartments Rehabilitation - Housing & Homelessness - \$5,050,000
- Corona Del-Oro Apartments Rehabilitation - Housing & Homelessness - \$1,000,000
- Rural Riverside Fire Hydrants and Resiliency Project- WMWD - \$2,000,000

The County lead departments shall be returning to the Board in the future with actions to implement the projects referenced above with further related budget adjustments. The Executive Office will be returning to the Board to present the agreement with WMWD.
