BACKGROUND:

Summary

On March 8, 2022, Item 3.7, the Board authorized the exception option to Facilities Management and related Board Policies to allow consideration for departments that demonstrate the ability and capacity to oversee their own facilities management activities, including custodial, maintenance, project management, and real estate services.

The Office of Economic Development (OED) is a unique County Department with a mission of fostering economic development for long-term growth. Activities in support of this mission include operation of the Riverside County Library System, small community water and sewer systems, a cemetery district, administration of maintenance-based community facilities districts, and operation and maintenance of county service area parks, roads, landscaping and lighting. The department therefore employs a variety of professional, technical and skilled labor staff including project managers, and maintenance staff for OED existing facilities. OED project managers have extensive experience in delivering public works capital projects of all sizes and complexity including ground-up construction, renovations and expansions on: County buildings and libraries, parks, roads, etc. The OED maintenance group currently operates and maintains the following facilities including, but not limited to, eighteen (18) County Service Area (CSA) Parks, Lake Tamarisk Golf Course, the historic Edward Dean Museum, and CSA Water and Sewer Treatment Facilities, Perris Valley Cemetery, CSA road maintenance, landscaping, and, trails, thirty-six (36) Riverside County Library branches, etc.

As a result of the department's capacity and resources listed above, OED has submitted the Building Official Exemption Form to the Executive Office and now requests formal approval from the Board of Supervisors for an ongoing Departmental Exemption in the area of project management to allow OED to perform project management, including predevelopment and planning, scheduling, estimating, phasing, design procurement and administration, construction bid/award above Purchasing department authority, record keeping, construction management and administration, and Furniture, Fixtures, and Equipment (FF&E) procurement, for future OED projects, as specified in Attachment B.

OED, in accordance with applicable Board Policies, plans to utilize a combination of existing staff and licensed contractors for the aforementioned project management activities; plan check

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and inspection services will continue to be coordinated with Facilities Management pursuant to Board Policy H-27. OED is anticipating approximately two projects per year, to be managed by approximately four staff members. OED has worked with the Facilities Management department to create this mutually agreed upon plan to ensure a smooth transition, with no significant impact to Facilities Management staffing, workload, or funding. OED has not requested to be exempted from real estate services for any facilities as part of this submission, will continue to utilize Facilities Management as needed for standard maintenance, and will pay for its share of county-wide vacant space and maintenance cost for shared facilities.

The exemption request includes OED authorization as an "Authorized Entity" on the following board policies:

- **Board Policy B-11:** Award of Public Works Contracts Pertaining to County Facilities and Certain Other Improvements, and
- Board Policy H-7: Selection of Architectural, Engineering and Appraisal Services.

Board Policy B-11 exemption authorization, as an "Authorized Entity," will allow OED to perform project management related services on all future OED public works projects. This modification is expected to equate to individual projects savings. This exemption request also includes authorization for the Director of OED to act on behalf of the Board of Supervisors as it relates to emergency actions specified in Board Policy B-11, Section IV, to allow for emergency response procurement relative to CSA water facilities, sewer facilities, and CSA park district operations. Emergency means a sudden, unexpected occurrence that poses a clear and imminent danger, requiring immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss or impairment of life, health, property, or essential public services, as defined by Public Contract Code Section 1102. Granting OED this authority, through proposed attached Board Resolution No. 2023-093, will allow the department the ability to conduct emergency repairs and replacement within OED's CSA facilities without giving notice for bids to let contracts.

Board Policy H-7 authorization, as an "Authorized Entity," will allow OED to procure design professionals, from an established County pre-qualified list, for the following services: architectural, engineering, landscape design, geotechnical services, water quality management, construction project management, labor and compliance, materials testing and inspection, environmental assessment, master planning, or other regulatory compliance services are not stand- alone capital projects. To meet ongoing cost and time constraints, this authorization expedites smaller tenant improvement projects under \$100,000, permitting planning or design to start immediately without requiring a lengthy publicly advertised Request for Qualifications process and formal Board approval. Informal use of the H-7 pre-qualified list, when allowed and appropriate per Board Policy H-7, saves the County approximately four months on the project schedule, multiple board actions, and associated costs.

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Impact on Residents and Businesses

This exemption, allowing OED to oversee OED facility project management activities and authorizing the Director of the Office of Economic Development to let contracts in emergency situations as described in the abovementioned Board Policies will improve the safety of County residents, save time by reducing delays due to resource availability, and cost savings by minimizing administrative layers and associated administrative costs for project management.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-093

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE DELEGATING AUTHORITY TO ORDER EMERGENCY ACTION PERTAINING TO RIVERSIDE COUNTY OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UNDER THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE SECTIONS 20134, 22035 AND 22050.

WHEREAS, in accordance with California State Senate Bill 1458 (2008), County Services Area Law, amended the original County Service Area law in 1953 and reaffirmed County Services Areas as a type of local government similar to a special district with its own governing board (Board of Supervisors), services and facilities, and a defined boundary; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County Office of Economic Development, Community & Cultural Services Division oversees the operation of more than sixty (60) County Services Areas, maintains eighteen (18) county owned parks, two (2) water treatment facilities and over eight million square feet of landscaping; and

WHEREAS, section 20134 (a) and section 22035, of the California Public Contract Code authorize a public agency to proceed at once to replace or repair any public facility without adopting plans, specifications, strain sheets, or working details, or giving notice for bids to let contracts. The work may be done by day labor under the direction of the governing body, by contractor, or by a combination of the two. In case of an emergency, if notice for bids to let contracts will not be given, the Board shall comply with Chapter 2.5, (commencing with Section 22050); and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2.5, Emergency Contracting Procedures, of the California Public Contract Code, commencing with Section 22050, authorizes a public agency, by a four-fifths vote of the governing body, may repair or replace a public facility, take any directly related and immediate action required by that emergency, and procure the

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necessary equipment, services and supplies for those purposes, without giving notice for bids to let contracts. Before the Board takes any action, it shall make a finding, based on substantial evidence set forth in the minutes of the meeting, that the emergency will not permit a delay resulting from a competitive solicitation for bids, and that the action is necessary to respond to the emergency.

WHEREAS, Chapter 2.5, of the California Public Contract Code, commencing with Section 22050, authorizes a public agency, by a four-fifths vote, may delegate by resolution or ordinance, to the appropriate county executive officer, or other nonelected agency officer, the authority to order any action directly related and immediate action required by that emergency. If a person with delegated authority orders any action specified in Chapter 2.5, of the California Public Contract Code, that person shall report to the Board, at its next meeting, no later than 14 days after the action, the reason justifying why the emergency will not permit a delay resulting from a competitive solicitation for bids and why the action is necessary to respond to the emergency. The Board will review the emergency action every 14 days thereafter, until the action is terminated, to determine, by a four fifths vote, that there is a need to continue the action, unless the person with delegated authority has terminated that action prior to the Board of Supervisors reviewing the emergency action. When the Board reviews the emergency action, it shall terminate the action at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant so that the reminder of the emergency action may be completed by giving notice for bids to let contracts.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on March 28, 2023, at 9:30 a.m. or soon thereafter, in the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors located on the 1st floor of the County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California as follows:

On-going exemption request to allow the Riverside County Office of Economic Development (OED) to self-perform project management services including planning, design procurement, design administration and management, construction procurement, construction management and construction administration, estimating, FF&E, scheduling, etc.; on future OED projects including all CSA, Library, Cemetery, Edward Dean Museum and Economic Development projects. OED will ensure that all OED facilities are designed, constructed, recorded, administered, and managed per applicable Board Policies B-11, H-7 and B-22, and will utilize the Department of Facilities Management (FM) for all plan check and inspection services.

If Board Policy or staffing changes occur that amend this exemption form we will immediately amend this request accordingly. OED may on a case by case basis still elect to utilize FM for the services requested within this exemption. Exemption will apply to Board Policies identified in March 8, 2022, Item 3.7, specifically Board Policy B-11 and H-7.

 Operational benefits include utilization of existing qualified staff to complete the same tasks otherwise outsourced.
- 3. Explain the financial and operational impacts to the ISF department (Facilities Management) if the exemption is granted.

 OED is anticipating 1-2 new projects per year, which based on Facilities Management's current workload on an average of 20 projects per project manager, OED 's projects will not significantly impact Facilities Management financially or operationally and should actually benefit the department. Facilities Management maintains projects over a wide range of clients including County Departments, Federal (United States Bankruptcy and District Courts, U.S. Attorneys), non-profits and private tenants, etc.
- 4. State how the services will be provided and your staff capacity/experience to perform or oversee this work.
 Project Management services will be provided by OED 's personnel, consisting of four staff,

who are performing project management services including planning, design procurement, design administration and management, construction procurement, construction management and administration, estimating, FF&E, scheduling, on currently managed Public Works projects with a combined value over \$20,000,000. See question 7 for specific project information.

Two County departments, Environmental Health and Facilities Management, have provided plan check services to date. OED anticipates utilizing the Riverside County Fire Marshal on the Edward Dean Museum, and Lakeland Village and Calimesa Branch Library Projects. OED will also continue to utilize these departments for construction inspection services.

5. Provide a proposed timeline and transition plan for the absorption of facilities operations.

Regarding Project Management services, OED is currently performing project management services on 100% of the OED projects and has sought Board approval on a project-by-project basis to gain this authority, specifically seeking project management authorization as a managing department and authorized entity per applicable Board Policies.

6. Provide your continuing education plan for facilities operation staff. Explain how maintenance of the facility will be done (staffing, third-party etc.), and how your department will assure that the facility is properly maintained and operated in accordance with County and industry guidelines.

Not applicable. This request is not proposing to alter facility maintenance operations and is specifically for project management. Regarding existing CSA maintenance on OED water and sewer facilities, golf course, and parks, maintenance typically occurs through existing CSA staff, existing partnerships with TLMA, etc.

7. Submit examples of relevant public works projects that your Department has delivered in the last 3 years which would demonstrate your ability to perform this work. Include listing of each project, total cost, and total timeframe.

In February 2020, the former Economic Development Agency was dissolved into three new departments, currently identified as: Facilities Management (FM), Housing and Workforce Solutions (HWS), and the Office of Economic Development (OED). Facilities Management maintained the majority of the public works projects and project management services, but OED has managed minor upgrade projects to the water and sewer facilities, cemetery, FF&E design and install, road maintenance, etc. OED currently employs a former Facilities Management Project Manager with over 16 years of Riverside County project management and building experience.

In addition, OED currently performs project management services on County Public Works projects with a combined value over \$24,000,000, including the following:

- Lakeland Village and Calimesa Branch Library Project: \$3,918,760 Design Build of two new libraries in Calimesa and Lakeland Village. Current Status: Design.
- Deleo Regional Sports Park Improvement Project- \$3,000,000 New Bike Park, Pickleball Courts, Exercise stations, etc. Current Status: Design
- Business Revitalization Program- \$5,500,000- Façade Improvements to unincorporated Riverside County businesses. Approximately 20 individual projects/property owners. Current Status: Design Procurement.
- Woodcrest Community Park Improvement Project- \$1,000,000 new park, pickleball courts, and walking trail behind the existing Woodcrest Library. Current Status: Construction Bidding.
- Ripley Interconnection Pipeline Project-\$8,000,000 Install approximately 6 miles of new waterline to provide clean water to the unincorporated community of Ripley. Current Status: Design/Plan Check.
- Idyllwild Public Restroom Facility Project- \$450,000 Design and construction of a new ADA public restroom in the unincorporated community of Idyllwild. Current Status: Construction Bidding.
- American Rescue Plan Act Edward Dean Museum Revitalization Project- \$3,100,000 –
 Tourism related improvements to the EDM. Current Status: Design Procurement.

With respect to past experience, OED staff have personally managed, as a part of the former Economic Development Agency and experience at other departments, over 100 completed projects of various scopes and sizes, including but not limited to the following project samples:
