BACKGROUND:

Summary

The series of 2023 Winter Storms has impacted the County of Riverside. Since February 23, 2023, winter storms have brought unforeseen and unprecedented snow and rainfall within multiple jurisdictions in the County that caused damage to transportation, water conveyance systems and critical infrastructure, delivering an imminent threat to life, property, and the environment. The Riverside County Flood Control and Conservation District is experiencing sinkholes over storm drains and damage to channels that will require maintenance and repair at various locations in Riverside County. Additionally, the high river flow from record rain and snow melt has caused a breach of the levee on the San Jacinto River, damaging adjacent farmlands, which has been repaired; however, the district continues to bolster the breach. The district is also continuing to address other locations of the levee that was damaged from the previous, as well as the potential of additional damage from the incoming storms. With imminent storms expected to come into foreseeable future, it is requested that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution No. 2023-092 to ratify the Proclamation of Local Emergency as declared by the Director of Emergency Services.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Riverside County Operational Area has requested assistance from the State of California to meet current and potential additional needs.

16 foreseeable future that are capable of exacerbating damage to flood control and critical infrastructure due
17 to more rainfall on the oversaturated ground and melting snow; and,

18 WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services of the County of Riverside did proclaim the
19 existence of a Local Emergency within said County on the 30th day of March; now, therefore,

20 IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that the proclamation of a Local Emergency by
21 the Director of Emergency Services of the County of Riverside is hereby ratified, and that said Local
22 Emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the County Board
23 of Supervisors of the County of Riverside.

PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY
BY THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES

WHEREAS, Ordinance 533.6 of the County of Riverside empowers the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence of a "Local Emergency" when the Board of Supervisors is not in session; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors is not in session at the time of this proclamation, the Director of Emergency Services finds the following:

WHEREAS, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within the County of Riverside caused by extreme winter weather, snow, rain, and a melting snowpack that occurred on March 21 and 22, 2023; and,

WHEREAS, The County Riverside County Flood Control and Conservation District is experiencing sinkholes over storm drains and damage to channels that will require maintenance and repair at various locations in Riverside County; and,

WHEREAS, the high river flow from record rain and snow melt has caused a breach of the levee on the San Jacinto River, damaging adjacent farmlands, which has been repaired; however, the district continues to bolster the breach. The district is also continuing to address other locations of the levy that was damaged from the previous, as well as the potential of additional damage from the incoming storms.

WHEREAS, Initial storm-related damage estimates received from our County Departments, Cities, Tribal Governments, Special Districts, and School Districts of a total of \$4.4 million and is expected to increase as ongoing assessment of storm impacts progresses; and,

WHEREAS, additional storms expected to come into the County this week and in the foreseeable future that is capable of exacerbating damage to flood control and critical infrastructure due to more rainfall on the oversaturated ground and melting snow; and,

WHEREAS, the potential of the aforementioned conditions of extreme peril warrant and necessitate the proclamation of a "Local Emergency."


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED that a "Local Emergency" exists throughout the County of Riverside; and,

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said "Local Emergency," the powers, functions, and duties of the Director of Emergency Services and the Emergency Management Organization of this County shall be those prescribed by State law and the charter, ordinances, resolutions and approved plans of the County of Riverside in order to mitigate the effects of said "Local Emergency"; and,

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that said "Local Emergency" shall be deemed to continue to exist for the next seven (7) days and thereafter by ratification of the Board of Supervisors until its termination is proclaimed by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside; and,

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that a copy of this proclamation be forwarded to the Governor of California with the request that he proclaim the existence of a State of Emergency throughout the impacted areas of Riverside County and provide or request all eligible State and Federal financial assistance to the County and impacted local jurisdictions.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY
OF RIVERSIDE OF INTENTION TO ESTABLISH A COMMUNITY
FACILITIES DISTRICT AND TO AUTHORIZE THE LEVY OF SPECIAL
TAXES AND SETTING A DATE AND TIME FOR A PUBLIC HEARING
THEREON**

This summary is presented pursuant to California Government Code Section 53322. A certified copy of the full text of Resolution No. 2023-105, including a description of services and incidental expenses proposed to be financed and the proposed Amended and Restated Rate and Method of Apportionment, may be examined at the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, located at 4080 Lemon Street, 1st Floor, Riverside, California.

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At the public hearing, testimony of all interested persons or taxpayers for or against the establishment of the District, the extent of the District, or the furnishing of specified types of public facilities or services will be heard. At the hearing, protests against the establishment of the District, the extent of the District, or the furnishing of specified types of public facilities or services may be made orally, or in writing by any interested person. Any protests pertaining to the regularity or sufficiency of the proceedings shall be in writing and shall clearly set forth the irregularities or defects to which objection is made. All written protests not personally presented by the author thereof at the hearing shall be filed with the Clerk of the Board at or before the time fixed for the hearing. The Board may waive any irregularities in the form or content of any written protest and at the hearing may correct minor defects in the proceedings. Written protests may be withdrawn in writing at any time before the conclusion of the hearing.

If 50 percent or more of the registered voters, or six registered voters, whichever is more, residing within the District, or the owners of one-half or more of the area of the land in the territory included in the District and not exempt from the special tax, file written protests against the establishment of the District, and protests are not withdrawn so as to reduce the value of the protests to less than a majority, no further proceedings to create the District or to authorize the specified special tax lien shall be taken for a period of one year from the date of the decision of the legislative body. If the majority protests of the landowners are only against the furnishing of a specified type or types of facilities or services within the district, or against levying a specified special tax, those types of facilities or services or the specified special tax shall be eliminated from the resolution of formation.

The proposed voting procedure for the proposal shall be by mailed or hand-delivered ballot among the landowners in the District, with each owner having one vote for each acre or portion of an acre such owner owns in the District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is directed to give notice hereof as provided in Section 6063 of the Government Code.
