Notwithstanding any other provisions of these rules, a member of the public shall have the right to address the Board during the mid-morning "Oral Communications" segment of the published agenda. Said purpose for address must pertain to issues which are under the direct jurisdiction of the Board of Supervisors. YOUR TIME WILL BE LIMITED TO THREE (3) MINUTES. Donated time is not permitted during Public Comment.

Power Point Presentations/Printed Material:

Speakers who intend to conduct a formalized Power Point presentation or provide printed material must notify the Clerk of the Board's Office by 12 noon on the Monday preceding the Tuesday Board meeting, insuring that the Clerk's Office has sufficient copies of all printed materials and at least one (1) copy of the Power Point CD. Copies of printed material given to the Clerk (by Monday noon deadline) will be provided to each Supervisor. If you have the need to use the overhead "Elmo" projector at the Board meeting, please ensure your material is clear and with proper contrast, notifying the Clerk well ahead of the meeting, of your intent to use the Elmo.

Individual Speaker Limits:

Individual speakers are limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes. Please step up to the podium when the Chairman calls your name and begin speaking immediately. Pull the microphone to your mouth so that the Board, audience, and audio recording system hear you clearly. Once you start speaking, the "green" podium light will light. The "yellow" light will come on when you have one (1) minute remaining. When you have 30 seconds remaining, the "yellow" light will begin to flash, indicating you must quickly wrap up your comments. Your time is up when the "red" light flashes. The Chairman adheres to a strict three (3) minutes per speaker. **Note: If you intend to give your time to a "Group/Organized Presentation", please state so clearly at the very bottom of the reverse side of this form.**

Group/Organized Presentations:

Group/organized presentations with more than one (1) speaker will be limited to nine (9) minutes at the Chairman's discretion. The organizer of the presentation will automatically receive the first three (3) minutes, with the remaining six (6) minutes relinquished by other speakers, as requested by them on a completed "Request to Speak" form, and clearly indicated at the bottom of the form.

Addressing the Board & Acknowledgement by Chairman:

The Chairman will determine what order the speakers will address the Board, and will call on all speakers in pairs. The first speaker should immediately step to the podium and begin addressing the Board. The second speaker should take up a position in one of the chamber aisles in order to quickly step up to the podium after the preceding speaker. This is to afford an efficient and timely Board meeting, giving all attendees the opportunity to make their case. Speakers are prohibited from making personal attacks, and/or using coarse, crude, profane or vulgar language while speaking to the Board members, staff, the general public and/or meeting participants. Such behavior, at the discretion of the Board Chairman, may result in removal from the Board Chambers by Sheriff Deputies.

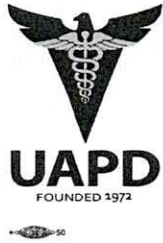

To Whom It May Concern,

In February 2023 Loma Linda University residents petitioned the National Labor Relations Board with the hope to eventually hold a vote across all programs to choose collectively to form a union. As with other resident unions across the country, our aspiration is to use our collective voice to advocate for ourselves and one another and create working conditions that allow us to provide the highest quality care for our patients. It is with great disappointment to us that Loma Linda University unsuccessfully filed suit against the National Labor Relations Board and refuses to acknowledge us, their residents as healthcare providers but willingly belittles them down to “students”.

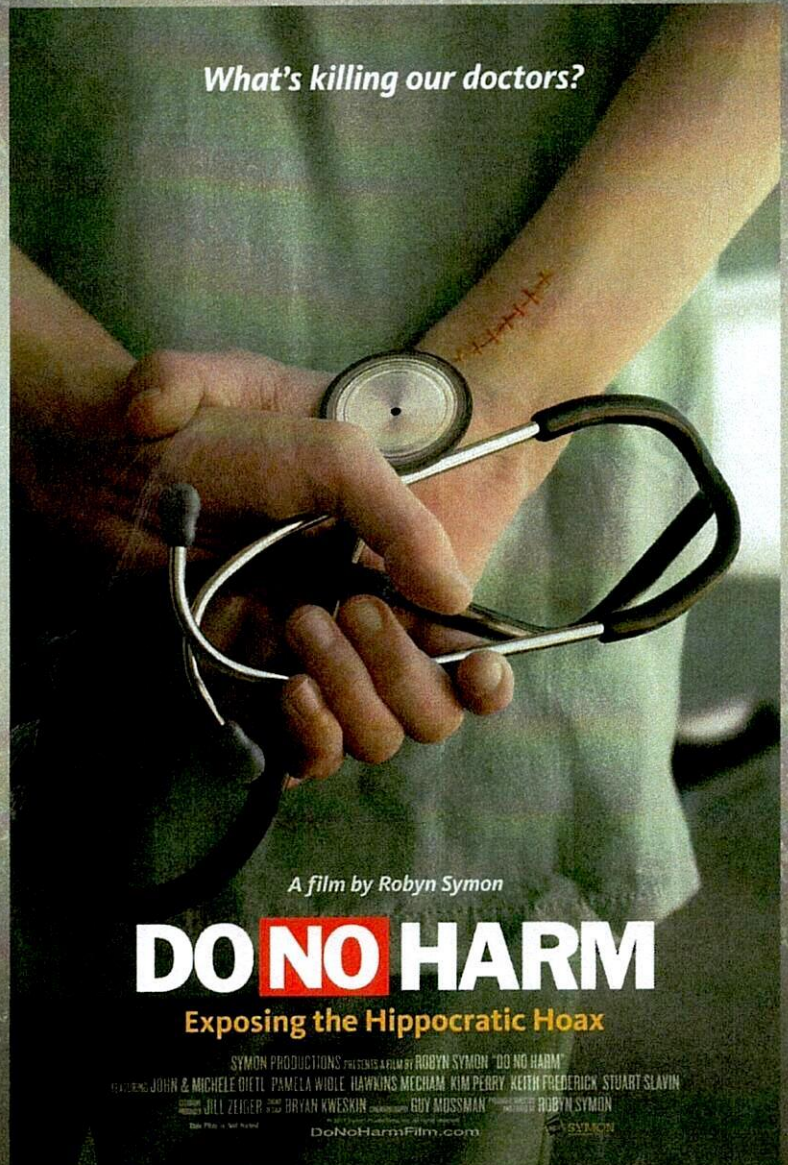

According to Claudia Alvarado of Ranchos United group and others who spoke at a BOS meeting April 18th, they are complaining about Ordinance 847 saying it isn't fair that they receive notices from Code Enforcement left on their doors. Perhaps if they complied with the law, they would not receive these notices. Their events handle 200+ people at a time. These 200+ attendees are called "family" by Claudia.

The current ordinance 847 is clear as written, outlining the distance that sound should not be audible.

The Ranchos group wants perceived notion of "noise". Okay, here it is.

Perception of volume is always subjective and depends on one's own hearing but typically an increase of 10 dB roughly corresponds to the perceived volume doubling in intensity. So 60 dB are perceived as twice as loud as 50 dB.

The Ranchos group should conduct their own noise study using exterior noise monitors and employ methods that Code Enforcement officers outline.

They should also explore having events indoors and consult with noise mitigation experts.

Ranchos should explore doing construction to reduce noise to surrounding properties.

The Ranchos United group would benefit from being law-abiding citizens vs fighting ordinances which the rest of Riverside County follows.

This Ranchos United group is making their problem our problem. We do not condone their demands to change Ord.847 to suit their lifestyle. They should be good neighbors and comply with existing laws as does the 2.4 million residents of Riverside County.

Dear County Planners and Supervisors

Please consider the following feedback regarding the proposed changes to the Sound Ordinance being considered for Riverside County specifically the Coachella Valley.

All citizens should obey the law and abide by the current Riverside County noise ordinance. Changes to the county ordinance should not be put in place for the demands of one particular group. Their desires do not outweigh the expectations of other members of the community for peaceful living. Everyone needs to be a good neighbor.

Increasing the allowable noise is not an acceptable nor a long term fix. Noise mitigation measures need to be put in place to protect surrounding properties from noise intrusion. Proper sound studies, buildings for indoor events, sound walls, and no amplified music should all be considered and discussed before a vote to change levels is considered.

We do feel the sound ordinance must include specific measurable limits as currently used in the Wine Country Plan. A subjective measure using the human ear is inadequate therefor the use of a portable sound meter is suggested. A photo of the sound measurement can be taken at the time of monitoring to be used as evidence of the violation and the location.

A good solution to explore is an overlay plan similar to the Wine Country Community Plan to address the specific issues in Coachella Valley but the county wide noise ordinance should not be revised.

I understand there is consideration to amending Ord. 847 at the request of a group of residents that go by (I believe) the name of the Ranchos group.

There are several reasons why this request should be **denied**.

- 1-The ordinance is working. Why should the county spend valuable resources to change an ordinance that is working?
- 2-Why would we condone a group of citizens who want to defy the ordinance for their own selfish purposes? Imagine a group of us who have been stopped by the CHP for speeding 80 mph in a 70-mph zone going to the legislature to request that they change the speed limit so that we can stop paying fines and court costs. That makes no sense. I am sure they would tell us to just slow down and obey the law.
- 3-Code enforcement is doing the job they were hired to do. We should support these people rather than caving into a vocal group of citizens.
- 4-The Ranchos group could spend their time more effectively working on ways to comply with the ordinance rather than asking the county and the rest of the residents to bend to their demands.
