BACKGROUND:

Summary

Riverside University Health System - Public Health (RUHS-PH) has been awarded funding for the implementation of strengthening Riverside County Public Health infrastructure, workforce, systems, and project by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This includes the creation of public health workforce development plans focusing on recruitment and resilience. RUHS-PH will also increase capacity for grant management and support local community organizations with technical assistance to grow future partnerships. In addition, RUHS-PH will expand Epidemiology and Program Evaluation capacity, develop, train, and implement a dedicated Community Health Worker (CHW) team to support ongoing outreach and education to the community. Finally, through the development and implementation of a violence prevention program, public health re-accreditation efforts, quality improvement and lean process improvement efforts, this project allows RUHS-PH to broaden and further support the existing health equity work and develop dedicated units for community health work and bioinformatics. All planned activities are grounded in data driven planning and implementation, the critical role of partnerships to inform workforce development and key infrastructure improvements, and the absolute imperative that resources be directed, managed, and utilized in a manner that supports the needs of county residents.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The main beneficiaries of this project will be residents, community organizations and RUHS-PH for strengthening infrastructure, workforce, systems, and public health projects.

Additional Fiscal Information

The Strengthening Riverside County Public Health Infrastructure Workforce, and Systems Federal Award is a new funding opportunity with an annual distribution issued from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; the total aggregate amount of funds shall be distributed as detailed in the table below. There is no impact to County General Funds.
