

SUBJECT: DEPARTMENT OF WASTE RESOURCES: Public Hearing for Adoption of Riverside County Ordinance No. 779.24, Amending Ordinance No. 779, Relating to County Solid Waste Facilities and Establishing Fees; All Districts. [\$0 Total Cost - Waste Resources Enterprise Funds] (CEQA Exempt)

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Find that the Project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15273 (Rates, Tolls, Fares, and Charges), and Section 15061(b)(3) (General Rules for Exemption);
2. Adopt Ordinance No. 779.24, an ordinance of the County of Riverside, at the close of the public hearing on May 9, 2023, with changes to the appendices to be effective July 1, 2023;
3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish Ordinance No 779.24 pursuant to Government Code Section 25124 within fifteen days of adoption by the Board of Supervisors; and
4. Direct the Department of Waste Resources (Department) to post the Notice of Exemption (NOE) upon approval of the Project.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

In addition to establishing fees and penalties, Ordinance No. 779, **Attachment A** includes the basis for operating regulations that include waste inspection, salvaging and safety. In order to verify that the current refuse rates are appropriate to offset expenses, the Department prudently reviews its operations annually and forecasts capital improvements, expansion projects, and future expenses and liabilities with a projection of 20 years. Since revenue from in-county tonnage delivered to the landfills represents the majority of the Enterprise Fund's total revenue, it is important to accurately project future tonnage growth or decline. Because of stricter regulatory compliance requirements to increase landfill diversion to 75%, we anticipate zero tonnage growth in coming years.

Additionally, the Department's operating costs have increased significantly due to inflation and other market factors, including increases to capital improvement projects, salary increases, stricter regulatory compliance requirements, increased fuel costs, permitting fees and heavy equipment costs. Another significant factor is the cost the County is contractually required to pay Waste Management Inc. to dispose of over 40% of the County's waste at the El Sobrante landfill, which is adjusted by 90% of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) each year.

While not projecting tonnage growth, it is anticipated that traffic volume will continue to rise as residential customers take advantage of the County's low disposal rates and home development continues to encroach closer to landfills.

For the reasons outlined above, the Department proposes to increase landfill disposal fees by the percentage change in CPI for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario index for the 12-month period ending January 2023. The percentage change in CPI is calculated to be 7.33%. The proposed rates are summarized below. Additionally, long-term contractual Waste Delivery Agreements, which represent approximately 70% of the total in-county waste stream, will be adjusted as stipulated in the contracts and summarized in **Attachment B – Contracted Rates**. It is important to note that the Department's proposed non-contract rates (per ton rate and flat rate fees) are still lower in comparison to neighboring counties, **Attachment C – Landfill Rate Comparison**.

Due to the significant increase in the number of vehicles attributed to residential customers and the resulting long traffic queues, the Department established flat rates effective FY22/23 for three different vehicle types as allowed by the California Code of Regulations (14 CCR

§18815.9 (g)(3)(A)). Establishing flat rates eliminated the need to weigh back empty residential vehicles exiting the landfill and successfully resulted in reduced transaction processing times, thus reducing congestion at the scale house.

With the implementation of the new flat rates for FY 22/23, the Department eliminated minimum load rates that were in place in prior years. To maintain equity across all vehicle load types, the Department proposes to establish a non-flat rate minimum charge. The proposed minimum charge is equivalent to residential truck and trailer flat rate loads.

The Department proposes to increase tire fees from \$4.00/tire to \$6.00/tire due to an increase in handling/processing costs. In June 2022, BJ's Tires, the department's tire recycler, increased their recycling costs by 65% causing the Department's subsidy rate to increase to 72%. The Department will continue to work towards stabilizing the subsidy rate. The proposed increase will reduce the subsidy to 60%. Tire acceptance at the landfills provides an outlet to the public and is anticipated to continue to curb/prevent illegal dumping.

The Department proposes to increase appliance fees from \$5.00/appliance to \$6.00/appliance due to an increase in handling/processing costs. It currently costs the Department \$16.60/appliance. The Department subsidized 70% of this cost in 2022 and will continue to work towards stabilizing the subsidy rate. Appliance acceptance at the landfills provides an outlet to the public and is anticipated to continue to curb/prevent illegal dumping of these items.

The Department continues to operate the compost facility at the Lamb Canyon landfill and has plans to start a composting facility at the Badlands Landfill. The composting process requires a continuous supply of clean green material to feed the compost pile. The Department proposes to provide a discounted rate of \$15.00 per ton for processed ground material from approved commercial haulers. Receiving green material that has already been processed provides a cost savings to the Department in labor and equipment costs.

The Department continues to pilot the operation of a Waste Recycling Reuse Store (WRRS) at the Lamb Canyon Landfill. Program staff remove goods that have remaining useful life from the waste streams to resell to the public. The Department's goal is to provide affordable used items that would have otherwise been disposed in the landfill, thus saving landfill space. The WRRS will:

- Reduce/divert solid waste from the landfill;
- Reduce carbon emissions generated through landfilling solid waste;
- Promote a sustainable lifestyle;
- Provide low-cost goods/products to the public;
- Reduce the demand for raw material;
- Conserve existing landfill airspace to extend the life of the landfill;

The WRRS falls within the same business category as thrift stores, which have unique pricing unlike retail stores. Prices may be based on similar commodity categories or pricing by quality

or brand. The Department will follow the pricing options and guidelines below when pricing items for sale in the WRRS.

1. Pricing by Category – Set a price on a group of items that fall into a similar category, such as:
 - Antiques
 - Appliances
 - Automotive Parts/Accessories
 - Bicycles
 - Electronics
 - Exercise equipment
 - Furniture
 - Other Sporting Goods
 - Tools – Lawn & Garden

2. Pricing by Quality or Brand. Pricing items according to their brand, condition, and quality. Average pricing of items will be 30% below original retail price.

Waste Recycling Reuse Store staff will utilize the internet to help determine the price range. Websites that may be used to assist in identifying pricing of items include:

Other websites such as OfferUp, Craigslist, etc. may be used when pricing cannot be identified using thrift store pricing guidelines. When using these websites, the lowest pricing range found will be used to price items. The Department will continue to pilot the operation of a Materials Reuse program to identify additional program costs.

Attachment A, Appendix D – Schedule of Miscellaneous Fees: As part of its Composting Program, the Department subsidizes the cost of compost bins to Riverside County residents. Due to an increase in the unit costs per bin as well as shipping costs, the Department proposes to increase the sale price from \$13.00/bin to \$18.00/bin, which is a 46% subsidy. Composting helps keep the high volume of organic material out of our landfills, the goal of SB1383, and turns the material into a useful product. The Department’s cost for materials to create worm bin kits is passed through class participants. Material costs increased from \$26.08 to \$35.40 in FY 22/23, thus the Department proposes to increase the fee for worm bin kits by \$9.00. The Lend-A-Bin Cleaning Fee and Late Fee cost increase is proposed to cover the increase in staff costs.

CEQA Findings

The Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) (General Rule for Exemption), as it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this Project would have a direct, indirect, or cumulatively significant effect on the environment; therefore, the activity is exempt under CEQA. Furthermore, pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15273 (Rates, Tolls, Fares, and Charges), the Project is found to be statutorily exempt from CEQA, because the proposed changes are for the purpose of:

- Meeting operating expenses, including employee wage rates and fringe benefits;
- Purchasing or leasing supplies, equipment, or materials;
- Meeting financial reserve needs and requirements; and
- Obtaining funds for existing capital projects, necessary to maintain service within existing service areas.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Waste Disposal Fees are reviewed annually, and are subject to CPI adjustment which, for this period, is 7.33%. Fee increases are needed in order to offset impacts due to inflationary factors while meeting the need for capital improvements, expansion projects at County landfills, equipment purchases, increasing program expenses which allow for the continued protection of the general public health and welfare by efficient management of Riverside County's solid waste system. The Waste Disposal Fees charged under Ordinance No. 779.24 continue to be the lowest in the Southern California region, and the Department does not anticipate an increase in illegal dumping as a result of these fee increases.





RESIDENTIAL CARD REGULATIONS:

Authority: Riverside County Ordinance No. 745 requires that, "Every tenant, occupier, operator, or owner of a residence...not less than once a week all Solid Waste created, produced or brought upon the property shall be moved to an approved disposal facility."

1. **Number of Uses** - Monthly Residential Self-Haul Card allows up to 4-400 lb. standard load uses per month.
2. **Expiration Date** - The expiration date for the yearly card is the last day of the fiscal year, June 30. The expiration date for monthly cards is the last day of the month. Any unused punches in a month will expire on the last day of that month.
3. **No Refunds** - There will be no refunds on partially used cards.
4. **Standard Load** - The maximum load allowed access to the landfill with one use of the Residential Self-Haul Card will be four hundred (400) pounds, which is equivalent to one punch on the card. If the Gate Services Assistant judges a load to be over this Standard Load limit, two or more punches will be made to the card.
5. **Cost** - The Residential Self-Haul Card discounted rate is eighteen dollars and ninety nine cents (\$18.99) per month.
6. **Payment for Card** - Residential cards may only be purchased at the landfill. Acceptable forms of payment include money order or cashier's check in the exact amount of purchase, and credit/debit card. Credit/debit card payments include a processing fee of 1.5% of the transaction amount.

The Rural Site Access Commercial Card shall be necessary for admittance to the Oasis Landfill for all non-permitted/contracted entities hauling commercial waste. For use by commercial entities of Oasis, Mecca, North Shore, and Thermal. Business address must be provided at time of commercial card purchase.

COMMERCIAL CARD REGULATIONS:

A Rural Site Access Commercial Card provides for disposal of commercial waste generated within the remote service areas and is required unless a permitted waste hauler or other large commercial users have negotiated a separate contract for disposal access to rural landfills with the County.

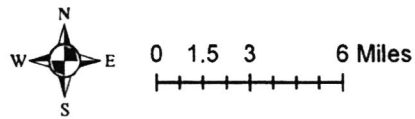
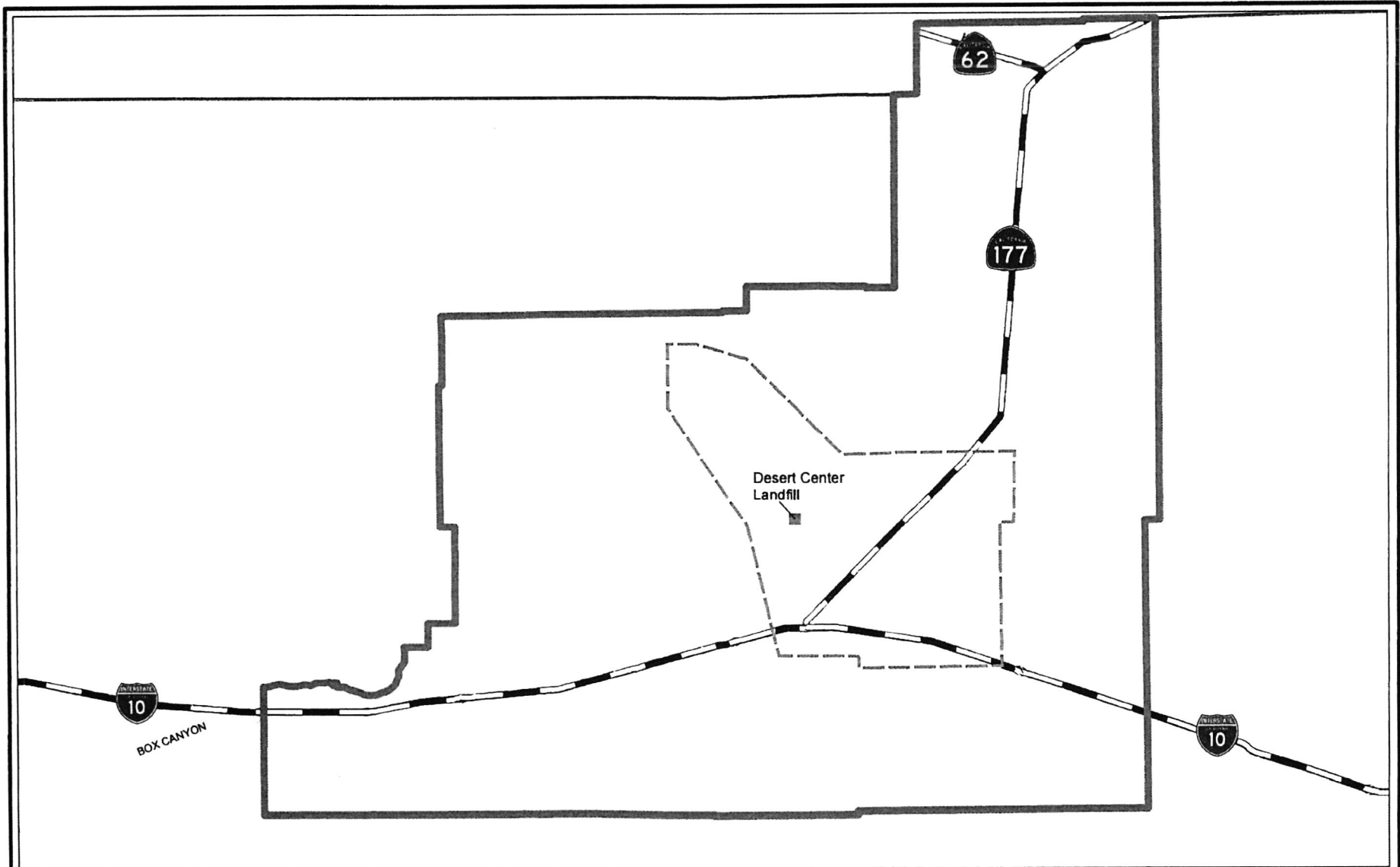
1. **Number of Uses** - The Commercial Card allows twenty-four (24) ½ ton available uses.
2. **Expiration Date** - There is no expiration date for the Commercial Card.
3. **No Refunds** - There are no refunds on partially used cards. If a commercial operator goes out of business, there shall be no refund for the unused card punches.
4. **Cost** - The Commercial Card fee is five hundred ninety-six dollars and eighty-eight cents (\$596.88).
5. **Payment for Card** - The card shall be purchased in advance of usage. Cards may be purchased at any time of the year. Acceptable forms of payment at the landfill include money order, cashier's check, and credit/debit card. Credit/debit card payments include a processing fee of 1.5% of the transaction amount. Additional forms of payment, including cash and personal/business checks, are accepted at the Department's business office.
6. **Lost Cards** - Lost cards are to be reported immediately. The customer will not be responsible for unauthorized use of a card after it is reported lost to the Waste Resources business office located at 14310 Frederick St., Moreno Valley, CA. (951) 486-3200.
7. **Uncovered/Unsecured Load Fee** - A fee of \$10.00 will be assessed per uncovered/unsecured load of refuse which has exposed material which in the opinion of the General Manager-Chief Engineer or his/her designee may litter roadways to the landfill or along landfill roads to the dumping pad. Load must arrive at the pay window covered and/or tied/strapped down.
8. **Restrictions on Use of Card** - Hazardous waste, tires, or other hard-to-handle waste will not be accepted at the Oasis landfill from commercial haulers.
9. **Alternative Riverside County Landfill Usage** - In the event that the Oasis landfill is unable to accept waste on a normal operating day, customers will be directed to a scaled Riverside County landfill and may use their Rural Site Commercial Card.

The project is exempt from the provisions of CEQA, specifically by the State CEQA Guidelines as identified below. The project will not result in any specific or general exceptions to the use of categorical exemptions as detailed under State CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2. The project will not cause any impacts to scenic resources, historic resources, or unique sensitive environments. Further, no unusual circumstances or potential cumulative impacts would occur that may reasonably create a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical environmental impact.

REASONS FOR EXEMPTION:

Section 15061(b)(3) - General Rule Exemption

The activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects, which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA.

This project is exempt under Section 15061(b)(3) because:

The Project proposes to increase landfill disposal fees/rates consistent with the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for certain solid waste streams. Direct haul/non-contracted rate for routine refuse, for example, is proposed to increase from the current \$46.35 per ton to \$49.75 per ton, a 7.33% increase. Additionally, the Project also proposes to increase tire fees from \$4.00/tire to \$6.00/tire due to an increase in handling/processing costs. Various other fee structure changes are also proposed, including hard to handle waste among others (see Attachment A).

The Project would increase waste disposal fees/rates to be consistent with the CPI for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario index for the 12-month period ending January 2023, propose to establish a non-flat rate minimum charge for all vehicle load types, and implement other fee structural changes. Changes in the fee structure would not have an effect on environmental resources.

Based upon the entire record, the Project would not result in the potential for any significant effect on the environment. This determination is an issue of fact and sufficient evidence exists in the record that the activity will not have a significant effect on the environment. As such, the exemption applies and no further evaluation under CEQA is required. See *Muzzy Ranch Co. v. Solano County Airport Land Use Comm'n* (2007) 41 Cal. 4th 372.

Section 15273. Rates, Tolls, Fares, and Charges

CEQA does not apply to the establishment, modification, structuring, restructuring, or approval of rates, tolls, fares, and other charges by public agencies which the public agency finds are for the purpose of:

- Meeting operating expenses, including employee wage rates and fringe benefits,
- Purchasing or leasing supplies, equipment, or materials,
- Meeting financial reserve needs and requirements,
- Obtaining funds for capital projects, necessary to maintain service within existing service areas, or
- Obtaining funds necessary to maintain such intra-city transfers as are authorized by city charter.

This project is exempt under Section 15273 because:

The Project involves the modification and restructuring of fees and approval of rates for the purpose of meeting operating expenses, and other inflation factors including salary increases, stricter regulatory compliance requirements and increased permitting fees. As such, due to the administrative nature of the Project, no environmental resources will be affected; therefore, the Project meets the scope and intent of Section 15273, Statutory Exemption.

FINDINGS:

1. Based upon the identified exemptions and justifications above, the RCDWR, on behalf of the County, hereby concludes that no physical environmental impacts are anticipated to occur and the Project as proposed is exempt under CEQA. No further environmental analysis is warranted.
2. The proposed Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3), and statutorily exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15273.

3. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this Project would have a direct, indirect, or cumulatively significant effect on the environment; therefore, the activity is exempt under CEQA as previously identified.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

In addition to establishing fees and penalties, Ordinance No. 779, **Attachment A** includes the basis for operating regulations that include waste inspection, salvaging and safety. In order to verify that the current refuse rates are appropriate to offset expenses, the Department prudently reviews its operations annually and forecasts capital improvements, expansion projects, and future expenses and liabilities with a projection of 20 years. Since revenue from in-county tonnage delivered to the landfills represents the majority of the Enterprise Fund's total revenue, it is important to accurately project future tonnage growth or decline. Because of stricter regulatory compliance requirements to increase landfill diversion to 75%, we anticipate zero tonnage growth in coming years.

Additionally, the Department's operating costs have increased significantly due to inflation and other market factors, including increases to capital improvement projects, salary increases, stricter regulatory compliance requirements, increased fuel costs, permitting fees and heavy equipment costs. Another significant factor is the cost the County is contractually required to pay Waste Management Inc. to dispose of over 40% of the County's waste at the El Sobrante landfill, which is adjusted by 90% of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) each year.

While not projecting tonnage growth, it is anticipated that traffic volume will continue to rise as residential customers take advantage of the County's low disposal rates and home development continues to encroach closer to landfills.

For the reasons outlined above, the Department proposes to increase landfill disposal fees by the percentage change in CPI for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario index for the 12-month period ending January 2023. The percentage change in CPI is calculated to be 7.33%. The proposed rates are summarized below. Additionally, long-term contractual Waste Delivery Agreements, which represent approximately 70% of the total in-county waste stream, will be adjusted as stipulated in the contracts and summarized in **Attachment B – Contracted Rates**. It is important to note that the Department's proposed non-contract rates (per ton rate and flat rate fees) are still lower in comparison to neighboring counties, **Attachment C – Landfill Rate Comparison**.

Due to the significant increase in the number of vehicles attributed to residential customers and the resulting long traffic queues, the Department established flat rates effective FY22/23 for three different vehicle types as allowed by the California Code of Regulations (14 CCR §18815.9 (g)(3)(A)). Establishing flat rates eliminated the need to weigh back empty residential vehicles exiting the landfill and successfully resulted in reduced transaction processing times, thus reducing congestion at the scale house.

With the implementation of the new flat rates for fiscal year 22/23, the Department eliminated minimum load rates that were in place in prior years. To maintain equity across all vehicle load types, the Department proposes to establish a non-flat rate minimum charge. The proposed minimum charge is equivalent to residential truck and trailer flat rate loads.

The Department proposes to increase tire fees from \$4.00/tire to \$6.00/tire due to an increase in handling/processing costs. In June 2022, BJ's Tires, the department's tire recycler, increased their recycling costs by 65% causing the Department's subsidy rate to increase to 72%. The Department will continue to work towards stabilizing the subsidy rate. The proposed increase will reduce the subsidy to 60%. Tire acceptance at the landfills provides an outlet to the public and is anticipated to continue to curb/prevent illegal dumping.

The Department proposes to increase appliance fees from \$5.00/appliance to \$6.00/appliance due to an increase in handling/processing costs. It currently costs the Department \$16.60/appliance. The Department subsidized 70% of this cost in 2022 and will continue to work towards stabilizing the subsidy rate. Appliance acceptance at the landfills provides an outlet to the public and is anticipated to continue to curb/prevent illegal dumping of these items.

The Department continues to operate the compost facility at the Lamb Canyon landfill and has plans to start a composting facility at the Badlands Landfill. The composting process requires a continuous supply of clean green material to feed the compost pile. The Department proposes to provide a discounted rate of \$15.00 per ton for processed ground material from approved commercial haulers. Receiving green material that has already been processed provides a cost savings to the Department in labor and equipment costs.

The Department continues to pilot the operation of a Waste Recycling Reuse Store (WRRS) at the Lamb Canyon Landfill. Program staff remove goods that have remaining useful life from the waste streams to resell to the public. The Department's goal is to provide affordable used items that would have otherwise been disposed in the landfill, thus saving landfill space. The WRRS will:

- Reduce/divert solid waste from the landfill;
- Reduce carbon emissions generated through landfilling solid waste;
- Promote a sustainable lifestyle;

- Provide low-cost goods/products to the public;
- Reduce the demand for raw material;
- Conserve existing landfill airspace to extend the life of the landfill;

The WRRS falls within the same business category as thrift stores, which have unique pricing unlike retail stores. Prices may be based on similar commodity categories or pricing by quality or brand. The Department will follow the pricing options and guidelines below when pricing items for sale in the WRRS.

1. Pricing by Category – Set a price on a group of items that fall into a similar category, such as:
 - Antiques
 - Appliances
 - Automotive Parts/Accessories
 - Bicycles
 - Electronics
 - Exercise equipment
 - Furniture
 - Other Sporting Goods
 - Tools – Lawn & Garden

2. Pricing by Quality or Brand. Pricing items according to their brand, condition, and quality. Average pricing of items will be 30% below original retail price.

Waste Recycling Reuse Store staff will utilize the internet to help determine the price range. Websites that may be used to assist in identifying pricing of items include:

Attachment A, Appendix D – Schedule of Miscellaneous Fees: As part of its Composting Program, the Department subsidizes the cost of compost bins to Riverside County residents. Due to an increase in the unit costs per bin as well as shipping costs, the Department proposes to increase the sale price from \$13.00/bin to \$18.00/bin, which is a 46% subsidy. Composting helps keep the high volume of organic material out of our landfills, the goal of SB1383, and turns the material into a useful product. The Department’s cost for materials to create worm bin kits is passed through class participants. Material costs increased from \$26.08 to \$35.40 in FY 22/23, thus the Department proposes to increase the fee for worm bin kits by \$9.00. The Lend-A-Bin Cleaning Fee and Late Fee cost increase is proposed to cover the increase in staff costs.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Waste Disposal Fees are reviewed annually, and are subject to CPI adjustment which, for this period, is 7.33%. Fee increases are needed in order to offset impacts due to inflationary factors while meeting the need for capital improvements, expansion projects at County landfills, equipment purchases, increasing program expenses which allow for the continued protection of the general public health and welfare by efficient management of Riverside County's solid waste system. The Waste Disposal Fees charged under Ordinance No. 779.24 continue to be the lowest in the Southern California region, and the Department does not anticipate an increase in illegal dumping as a result of these fee increases.



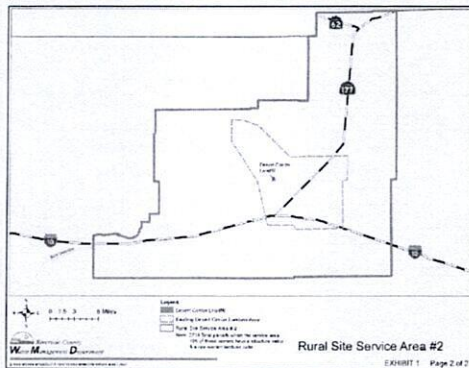
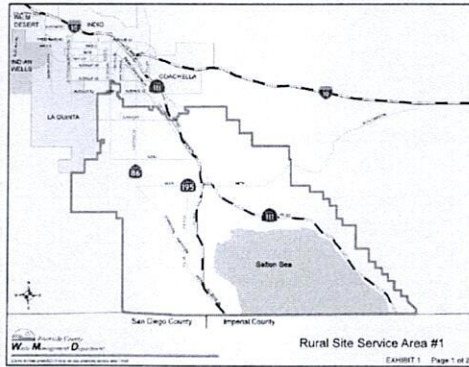

The Residential Self-Haul Card shall be necessary for admittance to the Oasis Landfill for all residential haulers. For use by residents of Oasis, Mecca, North Shore, and Thermal. Residential address and proof of residency must be provided at time of residential self-haul card purchase.

RESIDENTIAL CARD REGULATIONS:
 Authority: Riverside County Ordinance No. 745 requires that, "Every licensed, bonded, operator, or owner of a residence... not less than once a week, all solid waste created, produced or brought into the property shall be removed to an approved disposal facility."

- Number of Uses - Monthly Residential Self-Haul Card allows up to 4000 lbs. standard load units per month.
- Expiration Date - The expiration date for the self-haul card is the last day of the fiscal year, June 30. The expiration date for monthly cards is the last day of the month. Any unused purchases in a month will expire on the last day of that month.
- No Refunds - There will be no refunds on partially used cards.
- Standard Load - The maximum load allowed access to the landfill with one use of the Residential Self-Haul Card will be four hundred (400) pounds, which is equivalent to one punch on the card. If the Gate Services Assistant judges a load to be over the Standard Load limit, two or more punches will be made to the card.
- Cost - The Residential Self-Haul Card discounted rate is eighteen dollars and ninety-nine cents (\$18.99) per month.
- Payment for Card - Residential cards may only be purchased at the landfill. Acceptable forms of payment include money order or cashier's check in the exact amount of purchase, and Credit/debit card. Credit/debit card payments include a processing fee of 1.5% of the transaction amount.

Uncovered/Unsecured Load Fee - A fee of \$10 will be assessed per uncovered/unsecured load of refuse which has exposed material which in the opinion of the General Manager/Chief Engineer or Healer/Designee may interfere with the landfill or affect landfill roads to the dumping site. Load must arrive to the pay window covered and/or be strapped down.

10. Passenger/Light Duty Fees - Limited to five (5) tons per residential customer per day. No semi-truck tires. \$6,000 per tire.

11. Restrictions on Use of Card - Hazardous waste, other hard-to-handle waste, or commercial waste will not be accepted on this card. Card may only be used by persons residing at the purchase address on file.

12. Alternative Riverside County Landfill Usage - In the event that the rural landfill is unable to accept waste on a normal operating day, customers will be directed to a local Riverside County landfill and may use their Residential Self-Haul Card.

 RURAL SITE ACCESS - COMMERCIAL CARDS - OASIS LANDFILL
 RIVERSIDE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF WASTE RESOURCES

The Rural Site Access Commercial Card shall be necessary for admittance to the Oasis Landfill for all non-residential contracted entities hauling commercial waste. For use by commercial entities of Oasis, Mecca, North Shore, and Thermal. Business address must be provided at time of commercial card purchase.

COMMERCIAL CARD REGULATIONS:
 A Rural Site Access Commercial Card provides the disposal of commercial waste generated within the remote service areas and is required unless a permitted waste hauler or other type commercial users have negotiated a separate contract for disposal access to rural landfills with the County.

- Number of Uses - The Commercial Card allows twenty-four (24) ton available uses.
- Expiration Date - There is no expiration date for the Commercial Card.
- No Refunds - There are no refunds on partially used cards. If a commercial operator goes out of business, there shall be no refund for the unused card punches.
- Cost - The Commercial Card fee is five hundred ninety-six dollars and eighty-eight cents (\$596.88).
- Payment for Card - The card will be purchased in advance of usage. Cards may be purchased at any time of the year. Acceptable forms of payment at the landfill include money order, cashier's check, and credit/debit card. Credit/debit card payments include a processing fee of 1.5% of the transaction amount. Additional forms of payment, including cash and personal/business checks, are accepted at the Department's business office.
- Lost Cards - Lost cards are to be reported immediately. The customer will not be responsible for unauthorized use of a card after it is reported lost to the Waste Resources business office located at 14310 Frederick St., Moreno Valley, CA 92553, (951) 486-3206.
- Uncovered/Unsecured Load Fee - A fee of \$10 will be assessed per uncovered/unsecured load of refuse which has exposed material which in the opinion of the General Manager/Chief Engineer or Healer/Designee may interfere with the landfill or affect landfill roads to the dumping site. Load must arrive at the pay window covered and/or be strapped down.
- Restrictions on Use of Card - Hazardous waste, tires, or other hard-to-handle waste will not be accepted at the Oasis landfill from commercial haulers.
- Alternative Riverside County Landfill Usage - In the event that the Oasis landfill is unable to accept waste on a normal operating day, customers will be directed to a local Riverside County landfill and may use their Rural Site Commercial Card.

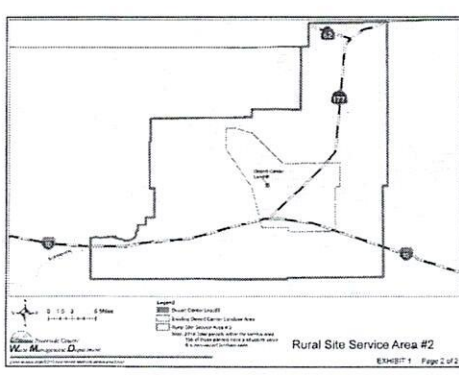
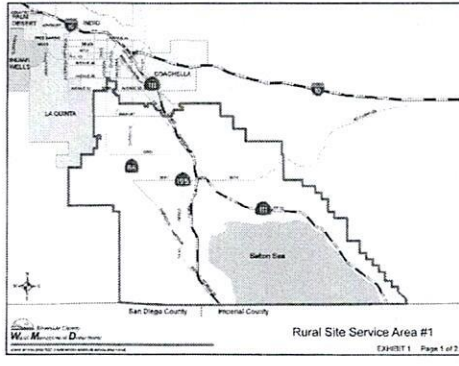

APPENDIX B TO ORDINANCE NO. 779.24
RESIDENTIAL SELF-HAUL CARDS AND OTHER FEES - GAVIS LANDFILL
RIVERSIDE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF WASTE RESOURCES
 Effective July 1, 2023

The Residential Self-Haul Card shall be necessary for admittance to the Gavis Landfill for all residential haulers. For use by residents of Oasis, Mecca, North Shore, and Thermal only. Residential address and proof of residency must be provided at time of residential self-haul card purchase.

RESIDENTIAL CARD REGULATIONS:
 Authority: Riverside County Ordinance No. 745 requires that "Every tenant, occupant, operator or owner of a residence... not less than once a week at Solid Waste transfer, produce or bring" upon the property, shall be necessary to an approved disposal facility".

- Number of Uses - Monthly Residential Self-Haul Card allows up to 4-400 lb. standard/ton loads per month.
- Expiration Date - The expiration date for the yearly card is the last day of the fiscal year (June 30). The expiration date for monthly cards is the last day of the month. Any unused portion in a month will expire on the last day of that month.
- No Refunds - There will be no refunds on partially used cards.
- Standard Load - The maximum load allowed access to the landfill with one use of the Residential Self-Haul Card will be four hundred (400) pounds, which is equivalent to one pickup on the card. If the fee services Applicant justify a load to be over the Standard Load limit, but not more than twice the Standard Load.
- Cost - The Residential Self-Haul Card (discounted rate is eighteen dollars and ninety nine cents (\$18.99) per month).
- Payment for Card - Residential Cards may be purchased at the landfill. Acceptable forms of payment include money order or cashier's check in the exact amount of purchase and credit/debit card. Credit/debit card payments include a processing fee of 1.5% of the transaction amount.
- Payment Options - Cards may be purchased:

- Land Cards - Land cards are to be repaired immediately. The customer will not be responsible for unweighed use of a card after it is reported lost to the Waste Resources business office located at 14310 Frederick St., Moreno Valley, CA 92553. (951) 486-2300.
- Unweighed/Measured Load Fee - A fee of \$10 will be assessed per unweighed/Measured load of refuse which has exposed material which in the opinion of the General Manager/Chief Engineer or his/her Designee may offer rebates to the landfill or Mining Landfill basis to the dumping fee. Load must arrive to the pay window covered and/or be strapped down.
- Passenger Light Duty Trucks - Limited to five (5) tires per residential customer per day. No semi-truck fees. \$6.00 per tire.
- Restrictions on Use of Card - Household hazardous waste, other hard-to-handle waste, or commercial business waste will not be accepted on this card. Card may only be used by persons residing at the purchaser's address on file.
- Alternative Riverside County Landfill Usage - In the event that the rural landfill is unable to accept waste on a normal operating day, customers will be directed to a nearby Riverside County landfill and may use the Residential Self-Haul Card.

APPENDIX C TO ORDINANCE NO. 779.24
RURAL SITE ACCESS - COMMERCIAL CARDS - GAVIS LANDFILL
RIVERSIDE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF WASTE RESOURCES
 Effective July 1, 2023

The Rural Site Access Commercial Card shall be necessary for admittance to the Gavis Landfill for all unweighed/Measured loads hauling commercial waste. For use by commercial entities of Oasis, Mecca, North Shore, and Thermal. Business address must be provided at time of commercial card purchase.

COMMERCIAL CARD REGULATIONS:
 A Rural Site Access Commercial Card provides for disposal of commercial waste generated within the service area and is required unless a permitted waste hauler or other large commercial users have negotiated a separate contract for disposal access to rural landfills with the County.

- Number of Uses - The Commercial Card allows twenty-four (24) is for available uses.
- Expiration Date - There is no expiration date for the Commercial Card.
- No Refunds - There are no refunds on partially used cards. If a commercial applicant goes out of business, there will be no refund for the unused card purchase.
- Cost - The Commercial Card fee is the hundred ninety-nine dollars and eighty-eight cents (\$199.88).
- Payment for Card - The card may be purchased in advance of usage. Cards may be purchased at any time of the year. Acceptable forms of payment in the landfill include money order, cashier's check, and credit/debit card. Credit/debit card payments include a processing fee of 1.5% of the transaction amount. Additional forms of payment including cash and personal/business checks are accepted at the Department's business office.
- Land Cards - Land cards are to be repaired immediately. The customer will not be responsible for unweighed use of a card after it is reported lost to the Waste Resources business office located at 14310 Frederick St., Moreno Valley, CA 92553. (951) 486-2300.
- Unweighed/Measured Load Fee - A fee of \$10 will be assessed per unweighed/Measured load of refuse which has exposed material which in the opinion of the General Manager/Chief Engineer or his/her Designee may offer rebates to the landfill or Mining Landfill basis to the dumping fee. Load must arrive at the pay window covered and/or be strapped down.
- Restrictions on Use of Card - Household waste, trash, or other hard-to-handle waste will not be accepted at the Gavis landfill from commercial haulers.
- Alternative Riverside County Landfill Usage - In the event that the Gavis landfill is unable to accept waste on a normal operating day, customers will be directed to a nearby Riverside County landfill and may use their Rural Site Access Commercial Card.

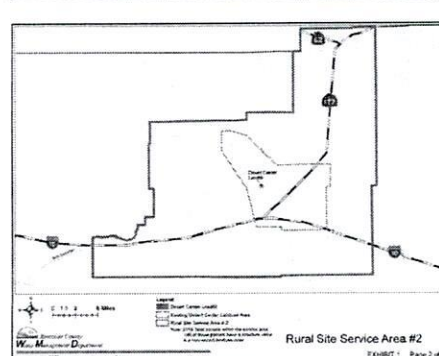
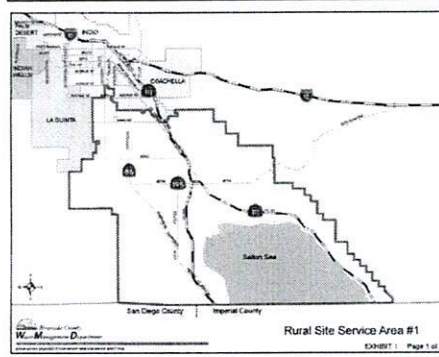
