BACKGROUND:

<u>Summary</u>

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 (H.R. 1319) in to law. The \$1.9 trillion package is intended to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, including the public health and economic impacts.

As part of the \$362 billion in federal fiscal recovery aid for state and local governments, \$65.1 billion is provided in direct aid to counties. Riverside County's share of the ARPA funding is \$479,874,599, of which the first installment of \$239,937,299 was received on May 10, 2021, and the second installment in the same amount was received on June 6, 2022. The funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024 and expended by December 31, 2026.

On October 4, 2022, (Agenda Item 3.44) the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the ARPA second installment funding allocation which distributed \$33 million per district to be obligated towards infrastructure, housing and homelessness, workforce development, neighborhood revitalization, business revitalization, childcare facilities, and non-profits.

On December 13, 2022 (Agenda Item 3.2), the Board approved the First Districts suballocation of \$18,400,000 from their second ARPA allocation to various County Departments, of which \$12,050,000 was obligated for projects administered by the Transportation and Land Management Agency (TLMA):

- Lakeland Village community projects:
 - Signalized crosswalk at the intersection of Grand Avenue and Sangston Drive D30109.
 - Construct new sidewalk on Grand Avenue between Gregory Place and Corydon Street – D30085. Please note, due to revised Supervisorial District boundary limits implemented in January 2023, this project is now within the newly established Supervisorial District 2 that was previously identified as Supervisorial District 1.

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- Good Hope community projects:
 - Construct new sidewalk on Theda Street between Floral Avenue and Mountain Avenue – D20110.
 - Construct new sidewalk on Mountain Avenue between Theda Street and Spring Street – D30110.
 - Construct new sidewalk on Palm Street between Mountain Avenue and Steele Peak Drive – D30110.
 - Construct new sidewalk on Steele Peak Drive between Palm Street and the Community Center – D30110.
- Mead Valley community projects:
 - Construct new sidewalk on the north side only of Oleander Avenue between Haines Street and Clark Street – D20109.
 - Construct new sidewalk on Clark Street between Oleander Avenue and Martin Street – D30111.

This item is to authorize the use of ARPA funds for the projects stated above in an aggregate amount of \$12,050,000 as a response to the Board's agenda on December 13, 2022 (Agenda Item 3.2), and to approve the budget adjustment. Future items brought before the Board for construction advertisement and construction award will delve further into specific details for each project listed above.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

These projects are intended to provide improvements to the Good Hope, Mead Valley, and Lakeland Village communities by constructing an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant path, enhancing public health, increasing mobility for non-motorized users, increasing public safety, and reducing greenhouse gases through active modes of transportation.
