BACKGROUND:

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Rotary Club of Temecula - \$7,500.00 - The funds will be used for two different programs:
 - a) \$5,000 for monthly food baskets for low-income seniors in Temecula, Murrieta and Wildomar.
 - b) Items needed for single moms w/ children/homeless, and for transitional housing, and foster children.

2. Michelle’s Place - \$10,000.00 – Funding will be utilized for mental health services for cancer patients and teens. Michelle’s Place is working with Pepperdine University to offer the counseling services. This is a new program. Patients receive 10 counseling sessions; children of patients participate in 10 family nights.

3. Santa Rosa Plateau Foundation - \$10,000.00 - Funds will be used for Promoting Environmental Protection through Education (PEPE) for High School students. This program will support students with the study of phenology (science of the environment and climate changes).

4. Rotary Club of Murrieta Foundation - \$5,000.00 – Funding will be used to support the Murrieta Field of Honor Event in November. This event commemorates and honors all branches of the United States Military.
5. Women Organizing Women, Inc. - \$5,000.00 - The funds are for the Lydia Project, a program designed to educate, equip and prepare women to become self-reliant on the ability to utilize their creative gifts as a means to develop grass root or micro businesses.
6. Inland Empire Blue Belles - \$1,000.00 - The funds will support the Blue Ribbon Breakfast, which honors Law Enforcement Agencies and their Officers/Deputies of the Year, in Riverside County.
7. Green Acres Interactive Therapy (GAIT) - \$10,000.00 - Funds to be used for the GAIT Interactive Therapy Program, which serves disabled children and veterans in the community, enriching the lives by providing physical and emotional therapy through horses and animal interaction.
