#### **BACKGROUND:**

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. Rancho Damacitas & Community Mission of Hope \$25,000.00 The funding will be utilized to support the Empowerment Village Housing Program. This program supports at-risk struggling single mothers and their children.
- 2. Boys & Girls Club of Southwest County \$10,000.00 The funding will support the Summer Day Camp for children in the Southwest area.
- 3. Big Brothers Big Sisters of Orange County & The Inland Empire \$14,000.00 Funding will be used to support a mental health and wellness initiative to combat the mental health crisis of the youth we serve with Big Brothers and Big Sisters program.
- 4. Murrieta Arts Council- \$5,500 The funding will be utilized to purchase a portable stage to enhance the local arts and cultural events for the Downtown Murrieta and Murrieta Market Nights which builds the eco

- 5. Habitat for Humanity Inland Valley- \$2,000.00- The funding will be used for a fundraiser to support the Home Repair Preservation Program. The program assists residents in the Third District to make repairs and preserve their homes.
- 6. Rotary Club of Temecula Sunrise- \$7,500.00- The funding will be used to support two programs: 1) "Safety Town" which teaches children ages 5- to 8-year-olds lifesaving lessons, stranger danger, 911, fire safety and bicycle safety. 2) Literacy program that focuses it efforts with 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students.
- 7. Community Food Pantry of Murrieta- \$10,000.00- The funding will be used to purchase nutritious food, dairy, fresh produce, staples, and proteins for low-income residents living in Murrieta and the French Valley corridor. The pantry assists 200 families weekly. In addition, food is delivered to senior shut-ins.
