BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The mission of Culturas Music & Arts is to form strong, positive community values, cultural understanding, tolerance, diversity, and artistic appreciation by ensuring a safe, healthy, educational environment through the arts. CID funds will be used towards the

cost to refurbish its building space to be able to offer programming on site.

2. The mission of the James O. Jessie Desert Highland Unity Center is to create a healthier society; contribute to civic pride in a livable community; and decrease youth delinquency by providing safe and inviting parks, and inclusive programming. CID funds will be used towards their Youth Encouragement Program.
3. Raices Cultura provides access to the visual and performing arts, educational opportunities, and cultural events and excursions. The Dia de Los Muertos community celebration is centered at downtown Coachella office. The arts & culture program honors the ancient indigenous traditions of Mesoamerican peoples combined with Mexican and Spanish cultural influences that celebrates the lives of loved ones who are no longer within the living world. CID funds will be used towards the expenses of the Dia de Los Muertos Arts & Culture Program.
4. The CVHS Athletic Booster Club supports the Coachella Valley High School Baseball program. Funds will be used towards the purchase of uniforms, equipment, and tournament fees.
5. The Coachella Valley History Museum is working to develop a 15,000 sq ft lot into an outdoor garden and railway exhibit, dedicated to preserve the railway history and water conservation. The project is currently under phase one which is the acquisition of the car and construction plans. CID funds will support the outdoor garden project.
6. Lake Cahuilla Veterans Regional Park offers fishing in the 135-acre lake, hiking and horseback riding on nearby trails. A proposed fishing derby will be held in September 2023, which will provide outdoor recreation experience for all ages. Rivco Parks will stock the site with fish and provide technical guidance for event participants. CID funds will be used towards the fishing derby.
7. Habitat for Humanity's Housing Insecurity Prevention Program provides a multi-faced approach to reduce housing and financial insecurity risks and address issues for low-income households. CID funds will be used towards the three components of this program: A Brush with Kindness, Emergency Household Needs Assistance, and Wellness Checks, Linkages and Referrals.
8. The Boys and Girls Club of Cathedral City provides programs based on life skills and character development. The outcomes ensure academic success, healthy lifestyles, and builds good character and citizenship for our youth. CID funds will be used towards the Team Workforce Development program.
9. The Coachella Senior Center helps connect its older adults to vital community services that can help them stay healthy and independent. They offer a myriad of resources such as wellness programs, nutritional support, recreational programs, counseling referrals, as well as assistance with helping them make connections with housing, financial resources, and home safety. The Senior Center's commercial kitchen is in much need of renovation as the seniors use the kitchen daily. CID funds will be used towards renovating the Coachella Senior Center's kitchen.
