

**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Animal Town Sanctuary will use funding to rescue un-adoptable Siberian Huskies and Malamutes and provide medical and dental care. The Senior, Special needs, and hospice animals will be provided cancer treatments, reverse osmosis water, specialized diets, natural foods, canine supplements, aroma and music therapy along with the proper amount of exercise.
2. T.H.E. Center Inc. will use funding to acquire additional therapy horses, ensuring their wellbeing, and appropriate training to be used as therapy for children and adults with disabilities and special needs in a professional environment. Therapeutic Horseback Riding will offer physical therapy, exercise and recreation and will also promote in Health Fairs, Chamber Events, City Workshops, and school presentations.
3. Soroptimist International-San Jacinto Hemet Valley Club will use funding to sponsor their annual "Girl Power Conference" for young ladies currently attending sixth and seventh grade. Many professional women from various walks of life have volunteered to serve as guides to our anticipated 200+ young attendees. Meals and snacks will be provided along with shirts and an event backpack.

4. Nuview Union School District donation will be used towards a community movie night project at the Valley View Elementary School in Nuevo. This event will be free to the students, families and surrounding communities within District 5.
5. Inland Empire Hispanic Leadership Council (IEHLC) donation will support projects that enhance civil understanding, provide leadership and financial support throughout their various community leadership series, scholarships and annual summits.
