

On November 17, 2020, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors (Board) directed the Executive Office to implement an Unincorporated Communities Initiative (UCI). The UCI is a focused, ongoing, and coordinated effort to improve the infrastructure and services provided to the residents of unincorporated communities, with emphasis on Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUC).

In alignment with the objectives of the UCI effort, First and Second Districts determined that additional focused Code Enforcement services are needed in the communities of Good Hope, Meadowbrook, Warm Springs and Lakeland Village to ensure proactive and timely code enforcement response within these four communities. With that, both districts are proposing a shared Code Enforcement Officer who will be located at the Lakeland Village County office and will be primarily focusing on ensuring rapid deployment to priority level one calls and supporting the department with the issue of illegal dumping throughout this region, among other enforcement efforts.

The allocation of \$160,000 (\$80,000 from D1 CID & \$80,000 from D2 CID) to Code Enforcement would be appropriated to 1 full time Code Enforcement Officer and revisited each year for an additional funding allocation.

IMPACTS TO RESIDENTS AND BUSINESS:

The Riverside County Code Enforcement Department has an office located in Lakeland Village and a special assigned designated officer is a good fit at this location. The proposed position will support the enhanced overall quality of life for area residents and businesses owners.
