

BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The donation to Jurupa Valley Citizens Patrol (\$4,000.00) will be used for the Jurupa Valley Station Volunteer Program. It will help purchase the necessary supplies and equipment like deep cycle batteries and supplies for the equipment trailer, 12V 300 Ah Lithium Batteries to allow the volunteers to run lighting and equipment, solar panels to charge the batteries, and EZ Up canopy to give shade and protection that will assist the volunteers in all aspects of their services to the community.
2. The donation to the Riverside University Health System Foundation (RUHS) (\$6,000.00) will be used for the RUHS Festival of Trees...for the love of a child! RUHS Foundation's Festival of Trees is dedicated to supporting RUHS divisions that serve pediatric patients in Riverside County.
3. The donation to Family Services Association (\$4,000.00) will be used to help fund HOPE for the Holidays. HOPE for the Holidays was specially designed to make the holidays brighter for many of the children in the foster care system. Through this grant, FSA will provide a range of toys, books, clothing, and/or hygiene items for children and teenagers in foster care.
4. The donation to Assistance League of Temecula Valley (\$2,500.00) will be used for the Operation School Bell (OSB) program which improves the lives of students in SW Riverside County by providing new school clothing to students (TK-12th grade).
5. The donation to ABC Hopes, Inc. (\$4,000.00) will be used for the 2023 Cornhole Tournament and the 2024 Casino Night which the funds from these events benefit the community to better the lives of persons with intellectual disabilities through the development of social, physical and life skills programs.
6. The donation to Riverside Medical Clinic Charitable Foundation (\$2,500.00) will help fund their 8th Annual Bullying Prevention Conference which offers education to administrators, community members and youth to further engage and support the community. Their mission is to end bullying in their community.
