3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish Ordinance No. 452.251 pursuant to Government Code Section 25124.

## BACKGROUND:

## Summary

The County of Riverside Transportation Department conducted Engineering and Traffic Surveys (E\&TS) in accordance with the California Vehicle Code (CVC), Sections 627 and 40802, for various county-maintained roads in the Perris, Good Hope, Temescal Canyon, Temecula, Thermal, and Nuevo areas of Riverside County.

Based upon the results of the E\&TS for these roads, the Transportation Department recommends designated radar-enforceable speed limits along the road segments summarized in the List of Speed Zone tables and has determined these speed limits to be appropriate to facilitate the safe and orderly movement of vehicular traffic.

Transportation Department staff has contacted the Indio, Riverside, San Gorgonio, and Temecula area offices of the California Highway Patrol (CHP) regarding the recommended speed zones.

## Compliance with CEQA

Ordinance No. 452.251 is exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the Ordinance will have significant effect on the environment.

## Impact on Residents and Businesses

The establishing and posting of appropriate speed limits promote safe and orderly movements of vehicular traffic and enable the CHP to use radar equipment to enforce the speed limits. Since the recommended speed limits were determined based on actual speed surveys, the majority of the motorists are already driving at or below the recommended speed limits. Posted speed limits also guide motorists to drive at a reasonable speed in unfamiliar locations.

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## Additional Fiscal Information

The cost for establishing the recommended speed limits is primarily for the installation of speed limit signs, which is estimated at about $\$ 3,500$.

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE

AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 452

## RELATING TO PRIMA FACIE SPEED LIMITS

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside ordains as follows:
Section 1. Section 2.2 of Ordinance No. 452, entitled "Thirty miles per hour," is hereby amended to add new subsection 47 to read as follows:
"47. On Middleton Street from a point 1,290 feet south of SH-89 / Harrison Street to $66^{\text {th }}$ Avenue / Tyler Street, a total distance of approximately 0.90 miles, in the Thermal area."

Section 2. Section 2.3 of Ordinance No. 452, entitled "Thirty-five miles per hour," is hereby amended to add new subsection 145 to read as follows:
"145. On Contour Avenue between Maurice Street and Peters Lane, a total distance of approximately 0.21 miles, in the Nuevo area."

Section 3. Section 2.5 of Ordinance No. 452, entitled "forty-five miles per hour," is hereby amended to add new subsections 200, 201, 202, 203, and 204 to read as follows:
"200. On Contour Avenue between Peters Lane and Juniper Flats Road, a total distance of approximately 0.57 miles, in the Nuevo area.
201. On Cajalco Road between Day Street and Seaton Avenue, a total distance of approximately 0.93 miles, in the Perris area.
202. On Cajalco Road between Seaton Avenue and Nevada Avenue, a total distance of approximately 0.95 miles, in the Perris area.
203. On De Palma Road between Indian Truck Trail and a point 1,750 feet east of Santiago Canyon Road, a total distance of approximately 0.48 miles, in the Temescal Canyon area.
204. On Mapes Road between Sophie Street and McPherson Road, a total distance of approximately 0.5 miles, in the Good Hope area."

Section 4. Section 2.7 of Ordinance No. 452, entitled "fifty-five miles per hour," is hereby amended to add new subsection 34 to read as follows:
"34. On Washington Street between Benton Road and Winchester Road / Highway 79, a total distance of approximately 3.68 miles, in the Temecula area."

Section 5. Subsection 55 of Section 2.3 of Ordinance No. 452 is hereby amended to read as follows:
"55. On Bay Drive between State Highway 111 and $72^{\text {nd }}$ Avenue, for a total distance of approximately 0.5 miles, in the North Shore area."

Section 6. Subsection 75 of Section 2.3 of Ordinance No. 452 is hereby amended to read as follows:
"75. On Mountain Road between Hidden Creek Drive and Horsethief Canyon Road, a total distance of 1.6 miles, in the Horsethief Canyon area."

Section 7. Subsection 107 of Section 2.3 of Ordinance No. 452 is hereby amended to read as follows:
"107. On Acacia Avenue between a point 230 feet east of San Jacinto Avenue and the centerline of Cornell Street, a total distance of approximately 0.9 miles, in the Hemet area."

Section 8. Section 2.5 of Ordinance No. 452 is hereby amended to read as follows:
"193. On Sea View Way between $72^{\text {nd }}$ Avenue and $70^{\text {th }}$ Avenue, a total distance of approximately 1.1 miles, in the Mecca area.
194. On Watkins Drive between 250 feet north of Gernert Road (City of Riverside limits) and I-215 westbound offramp, a total distance of approximately 0.15 miles, in the University City arca.
195. On the full width of Country Club Drive between Washington Street and 2400 feet west of $42^{\text {nd }}$ Avenue, and on the southerly half of Country Club Drive between 2400 feet west of $42^{\text {nd }}$ Avenue and $42^{\text {nd }}$ Avenue, a total distance of approximately 2.20 miles, in the Bermuda Dunes area.
196. On the northerly half of Orange Avenue between 1750 feet west of Evans Road and Dunlap Road, a total distance of approximately 0.80 miles, in the Perris area.
197. On Pico Avenue between Ellis Avenue and San Jacinto Avenue, a total distance of approximately 1.00 mile, in the Nuevo area.
198. On Richard Street between Highway 74 and Theda Street, a total distance of approximately 0.60 miles, in the Perris area.
199. On Via Las Palmas between Ramon Road and $30^{\text {th }}$ Avenue, a total distance Of approximately 1.00 mile, in the Thousand Palms area."
Section 9. Subsection 128 of Section 2.3 of Ordinance 452 adopted on April 28, 2015, pursuant to Ordinance No. 452.238, is repealed in its entirety. Subsection 128 of Section 2.3 established a thirty-five miles per hour speed limit on Middleton Street from a point 1,290 feet south of SH-86/Harrison Street to $66^{\text {th }}$ Avenue/Tyler Street, a total distance of 0.9 miles, in the Thermal area.

Section 10. Subsection 72 of Section 2.6 of Ordinance 452 adopted on January 28, 2014, pursuant to Ordinance No. 452.235 , is repealed in its entirety. Subsection 72 of Section 2.6 established a fifty miles per hour speed limit on Contour Avenue between Citrus Street and Juniper Flats Road, a total distance of approximately 0.78 mile, in the Nuevo area.

Section 11. Subsection 75 of Section 2.6 of Ordinance 452 adopted on April 22, 2014, pursuant to Ordinance No. 452.236, is repealed in its entirety. Subsection 75 of Section 2.6 established a fifty miles per hour speed limit on De Palma Road between Indian Truck Trail and a point 1,750 feet east of Santiago Canyon Road, a total distance of 0.48 miles, in the Temescal Canyon area.

Section 12. Subsection 81 of Section 2.6 of Ordinance 452 adopted on October 27, 2015, pursuant to Ordinance No. 452.239 , is repealed in its entirety. Subsection 81 of Section 2.6 established a fifty miles per hour speed limit on Cajalco Road between Day Street and Seaton Avenue, a total distance of approximately 1.0 mile, in the Perris area.

Section 13. Subsection 82 of Section 2.6 of Ordinance 452 adopted on October 27, 2015, pursuant to Ordinance No. 452.239 , is repealed in its entirety. Subsection 82 of Section 2.6 established a fifty miles per hour speed limit on Cajalco Expressway between Seaton Avenue and Nevada Avenue, a total
distance of approximately 0.88 miles, in the Perris area.
Section 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.
