BACKGROUND:

Summary

RUHS-BH's overall goal is to create a strong and effective behavioral health care continuum to serve the most vulnerable populations. It intends to do so by increasing infrastructure capacity. Through the Behavioral Health Bridge Housing (BHBH) Program, the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) will provide a total of \$1.5 billion in funding to county behavioral health agencies to operate bridge housing settings to address the immediate and sustainable housing needs of people experiencing homelessness who have serious behavioral health conditions, including serious mental illness (SMI) and/or substance use disorder (SUD). The program, which was signed into law in September 2022 under Assembly Bill 179 (Ting, Chapter 249, Statutes of 2022), provides funding through June 30, 2027.

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RUHS-BH submitted a grant application to DHCS for the BHBH Grant, and was awarded \$24,004,293 by DHCS, in which a total of \$12.4 million will fund operational costs of Recovery Residences and \$5.6 million will fund operational costs of an Adult Residential Facility (ARF) through FY 26/27. The remaining \$6 million will go toward the renovation of the county-owned building located at 3021 Franklin Avenue in the City of Riverside to convert it into an 81-bed ARF (ARF at Franklin). The total cost of the renovation is estimated at \$38 million.

Recovery Residences are community-like settings for individuals with a SUD or a co-occurring disorder. An ARF is an augmented board and care facility providing 24-hour care and intensive support services in a homelike setting for adults with behavioral health disabilities, who are being transitioned from a higher level of care who require special care and intensive support needs. This facility will consist of single and double occupancy rooms, a nurse station/medication room, exam rooms, consultation room, office space, commercial kitchen/dining area, restrooms/showers, laundry facility, group rooms, recreational space, living room space and outdoor space.

The ARF at Franklin was presented as a potential project at the Riverside City Housing and Homeless Committee and as a result, the City and County will work in partnership on this project.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Recovery Residences and ARF at Franklin will provide Riverside County residents with the means to provide these needed services to some of the county's most vulnerable populations.

Additional Fiscal Information

RUHS-BH will use the BHBH funds for the operational costs and a portion of renovation costs with the balance being funded through state revenue. No county funds will be required.

WHEREAS, the California Department of Health Care Services, through its contractor Advocates for Human Potential, Inc., ("**Department**") issued a Request for Applications, dated February 24, 2023 ("**RFA**"), for the BHCIP Program ("**Program**"). The Department issued the RFA for Program grant funds pursuant to Assembly Bill (AB) 179 (Ting, Chapter 249, Statutes of 2022); and

WHEREAS, the Department is authorized to administer the Program pursuant to AB 179. Program funding allocations are subject to the terms and conditions of the RFA, the Application, a Standard Agreement ("Standard Agreement"), and all other legal requirements of the Program; and

WHEREAS, On September 5, 2023 the Department issued Notices of Final Award totaling \$24,004,293 relating to operational costs for Shelter & Interim Housing and Auxiliary in Assisted Living, and costs to renovated a county-owned building into an Adult Residential Facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, in regular session assembled on October 3, 2023, in the meeting room of the Board of Supervisors, located on the first floor of the County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California, that, the Board:
