- 4. Direct the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to file the Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk for posting within five (5) working days.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

The County of Riverside Transportation Department is proposing to resurface an approximately 1.5-mile segment of Long Canyon Road in the community of Southeast Desert Hot Springs in the Coachella Valley area of Riverside County. The limits on Long Canyon Road are from Dillon Road to Hacienda Avenue.

Long Canyon Road is a two-lane facility that travels in the North-South directions with a road width of 32 feet plus 6 feet graded shoulders and is currently classified as a major highway in the circulation element of the County of Riverside General Plan. The area in the immediate vicinity is currently not developed. Along with Palm Drive and Mountain View Road, Long Canyon Road is an additional route for motorist going to the east side of the City of Desert Hot Springs.

Roadway resurfacing is needed due to the deteriorated pavement conditions. Mainly, the proposed resurfacing project consists of grinding the asphalt concrete in place and then overlaying with Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA). The second treatment that consists of removing the existing asphalt concrete pavement and underlying material and placing back new HMA pavement will be applied on specific segments of the road with a combined length of approximately 750 feet.

Additional improvements include reconstruction of driveways, construction of a concrete dip section where an ephemeral stream crosses the road, placement of safety edge and shoulder backing to protect the outside edge of pavement, safety features include placing of thermoplastic crosswalk and pavement marking, roadside signs, and other associated work.

The submitted plans and specifications have been approved as to form by County Counsel.

The bid documents include the following bid schedules of work:

Base Bid Schedule: Long Canyon Road Resurfacing

Alternative Bid Schedule 1: Mission Springs Water District (MSWD) Facility Adjustments

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The adjustment of the facilities owned by MSWD are also included in the bid package as an alternative bid schedule. If MSWD approves the award of their alternative bid schedule, as bid by the apparent low bidder, the cost for the work will be funded by MSWD through a reimbursement letter Agreement that will be executed by the Director of Transportation. The Director of Transportation has the authority to sign reimbursement Agreements up to \$100,000 per Minute Order dated November 19, 2019 (Agenda Item 3.25).

The Transportation Department will select the contractor based upon the lowest responsive and responsible bid.

Environmental Findings

The proposed project is exempt from CEQA under Section 15301 (c) — Existing Facilities exemption because the Long Canyon Road resurfacing does not create additional traffic lanes and involves negligible or no expansion of existing or former use of the existing roadway and associated facilities.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The purpose of this project is to replace existing deteriorated pavement with new hot mix asphalt for the approximate 1.5-mile segment of Long Canyon Road in the Community of Southeast Desert Hot Springs to provide the public with a smooth paved roadway that will improve the safety and efficiency of vehicular traffic.

Full closure of Long Canyon Road for one scheduled weekend (late Friday afternoon to early Monday morning) will be necessary to complete the construction of the concrete dip section from north of Quail Trail to Hacienda Avenue (City of Desert Hot Springs City Limit). Throughout the weekend work, through traffic and residential access will be provided by way of alternate detour route.

The work is scheduled to begin in spring 2024. The work will be phased to keep the road open during construction as much as possible and will take approximately two months to complete.

Additional Fiscal Information

The construction contract is estimated to cost approximately \$2,109,650. The County improvements will be funded with Gas Tax/SB-1 and MSWD funds.

There are no General Funds used in this project.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The County of Riverside Transportation Department is proposing to resurface approximately 1.48 miles of Long Canyon Road from Dillon Road to the County Limit Line (1,300 feet north of Quail Trail). Long Canyon Road is classified as a Major Highway in the County of Riverside's General Plan. Long Canyon Road is two-lane road that varies between 30 feet and 32 feet wide within 80 feet of right of way. The proposed project will include removing the existing pavement section and placing back Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) at the southern end of the project to adjust the vertical design to improve sight distance and pulverizing the full roadway width and overlaying with HMA for the remainder of the project limits except at the low water crossing where a concrete at-grade crossing section will be constructed at the existing roadway grade. An Archaeologist and Paleontologist will be present during all ground disturbing activities in the event resources are discovered.

Additional improvements include:

- Reconstruction of driveways.
- Construction of shoulder backing and regrading shoulders
- Utility adjustments
- Restriping of roadway, including pavement markers and reflectors
- Salvage/removal and installation of new signs

ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS:

The proposed project will not acquire right-of-way. Temporary construction easements will not be required for the proposed improvements.

This project is subject to compliance with the Coachella Valley MSHCP. In accordance with Section 7 of the Coachella Valley MSHCP, necessary operation and maintenance along existing roadways are considered a covered activity outside/inside of cell criteria area/conservation areas. This project is considered to be operation and maintenance; therefore, it is a covered activity under the Coachella Valley MSHCP.

If tree and/or vegetation removal takes place during the migratory bird breeding season (March 1 - September 1), a preconstruction nesting survey will be conducted pursuant to the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA).

The County of Riverside Transportation Department has found that the above-described project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), based on the following:


Section 15301 (c) - Existing Facilities - The project proposes to resurface approximately 1.48 miles of Long Canyon Road from Dillon Road to the County Limit Line (1,300 feet north of Quail Trail) and placing back Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA) as well as construct a concrete low water at-grade crossing. The project in its entirety is consistent with Section 15301(c) because it does not create additional traffic lanes and involves no expansion of use of the existing roadway and associated facilities.






