On motion of Supervisor Perez, seconded by Supervisor Spiegel, and duly carried by unanimous vote, **IT WAS ORDERED** that the meeting of Tuesday, October 17, 2023, be adjourned in memory of the victims of the terrorist attack on Israel.

As President Biden said in his remarks following the Hamas terrorist attack on Israelis that occurred Saturday, October 7, 2023, “There are moments in this life – and I mean this literally – when the pure, unadulterated evil is unleashed on this world. The people of Israel lived through one such moment this weekend... This was an act of sheer evil. More than 1,000 civilians slaughtered – not just killed, slaughtered – in Israel...”

We cannot even begin to fathom what occurred. The latest information is that about 1,400 people were killed in Israel in these attacks. Militants from Gaza fired thousands of rockets towards Israeli towns, broke through the border fence, and gunmen came through killing civilians such as music festival-goers and soldiers and taking 199 hostages, from children through the elderly. Among the 1,400 fatalities are Americans and citizens of many nations.

It was the deadliest day for Jewish people since the Holocaust. The violence was devastating, tragic and atrocious. And there are still hostages at large who need to be returned to safety.

As we process these events, we are starting to see stories about some of the individuals who were lost. They were innocent people whose faces and names should be remembered.

We adjourn in the memories of those killed in this terrorist attack.

And we stand against these attacks, and, as policymakers, we also have an obligation to stand against antisemitism, and we must ensure that this tragedy does not spread more hate in this world.
