BACKGROUND:

Summary

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (H.R. 1319) into law. The \$1.9 trillion package is intended to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, including the public health and economic impacts.

As part of the \$362 billion in federal fiscal recovery aid for state and local governments, \$65.1 billion is provided in direct aid to counties. Riverside County's share of the American Rescue Plan Act funding is \$479 million, of which the first installment of \$239.9 million was received on May 10, 2021, and the second equal installment was received on June 6, 2022. According to federal guidelines, funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024 and expended by December 31, 2026.

On April 27, 2021, the Executive Office presented the Board of Supervisors with a 1st ARPA installment funding allocation and on October 19, 2021, presented a revised funding allocation after the U.S. Treasury released the ARPA funding guidelines. The funding allocation obligates funds to seven categories: Infrastructure, Housing, Homelessness, and Neighborhood Revitalization, Economic Recovery, County Departments Response, Non-Profit Assistance, Child Care and Revenue Backfill.

On October 4, 2022, the Board approved the distribution of the ARPA 2nd installment to a Countywide allocation (\$49 million) divided into five categories, allocation by district (\$165 million/\$33 per district) and a Future Allocation (\$25 million). On July 11, 2023, the Board approved the Harmony Haven Children and Youth Center in the amount of \$26.8 million. This important project providing transitional housing for foster children and youth was paid from the Countywide Department Response category. To accomplish this, \$21 million was transferred from the Future Allocation and added to the Countywide allocation. This increased the Countywide allocation to \$70 million.

In November of 2022, the U.S. Department of the Treasury announced the release of the first round of Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Fund (LATCF) payments,

providing \$1.5 billion in two equal payments of \$750 million to eligible counties for fiscal years 2022 and 2023. The fund is a general revenue enhancement program that provides additional assistance to eligible revenue sharing counties and eligible Tribal governments under the ARPA. Riverside County was allocated \$12 million of which \$6 million was received in March 2023 and the second allocation of \$6 million in July 2023. The LATCF funds are combined with the Future Allocation category for the Board's future programming.

As of August 31, 2023, the County has obligated \$368.1 million for ARPA eligible projects and programs and \$102 million has been spent. The ARPA funds to date have accumulated interest earnings in the amount of \$12 million. With LATCF and remaining funds, the Future Allocation category has a balance of \$29 million.

As infrastructure projects have been awarded there has been a need for construction contingencies to be funded. It is the Executive Office's recommendation to set aside \$15 million of the Future Allocation for these contingencies. This \$15 million is being moved to the Countywide Department Response allocation and increases the overall Countywide allocation to \$85 million. The Future Allocation decreased to \$14 million.

ARPA 1st Installment Allocation Summary, by *Category as of August 31, 2023:

<u>Infrastructure</u>

As reported in the March 2023 report, the overall Infrastructure category was reduced by \$6.25 million, transferring the allocation to the Housing, Homelessness and Neighborhood Revitalization category for District 2. The total allocation is \$75.8 million of which the County has now obligated \$69.4 million (92%) to county-wide water, sewer, and broadband projects.

Housing, Homelessness and Neighborhood Revitalization

With an increased allocation from the Infrastructure category the new allocation is \$56.3 million. The County has obligated \$51.1 million (91%) of its to projects aimed to expand emergency shelter, permanent supportive housing, and affordable housing countywide in addition to two neighborhood revitalization projects in Districts 1 & 2.

Economic Recovery

Of the \$36 million allocated to Economic Recovery the County has obligated \$31.2 million (87%) in support of county-wide Tourism Recovery Campaign, Business Revitalization, Edward Dean Museum Revitalization, Innovation Centers, Trail Improvements and Paving projects.

County Departments Response

Of the \$30.9 million allocated to County Department Response the County has obligated \$23.8 million (77%) and \$19.3 million has been spent. The majority of the funding, \$18 million, has been spent on COVID-19 testing kits for asylum seekers, salary reimbursements for re-purposed labor associated with the ARPA funding administration effort and uninsured costs for COVID care, vaccination, supplies and personal protective equipment incurred in FY 21/22. A small portion is used for ARPA eligible administrative expenses.

Non-profit Assistance

Our non-profits provide essential community support services that will assist in our recovery and increase our resiliency as a County moving forward. The Board approved the allocation of \$1 million for the establishment of the Coronavirus Recovery Community Improvement Designation Funds to support non-profit organizations responding to the public health emergency or the negative economic impacts of COVID-19 within Riverside County. As of August 31, 2023, the Board approved 87 non-profits ARPA CID applications in the amount of \$874,500.

On July 26, 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved the allocations of \$15 million in ARPA funding to establish the Riverside County Non-Profit Roundtable to build a public-private-community partnership that would ensure a strong local network of services to address the ongoing needs of the county's most vulnerable residents and communities. As of August 2023, \$5.4 million has been expended as projects are moving forward.

Child Care

ARPA also provides eligibility for programs and efforts supporting the return of working parents to the workforce including early care and education retention, recruitment, and expansion of workforce, providers, and facilities. On September 14, 2021, the Board approved the allocation of \$15 million for the establishment of Early Care & Education (ECE) Recovery Fund to stabilize and expand availability of ECE to support the return of working parents to the workforce.

As of February 22, 2023, the entire \$10 million from the ARPA 1st allocation has been paid to 6,822 early childhood educators. As it relates to Child Care infrastructure, the Board of Supervisors approved obligating \$2 million in ARPA Child Care funds to District 1 & 2 – Lakeland Village Child Care project. The Executive Office, First Five and Facilities Management are currently developing the bid strategy that would potentially allow for a variety of competitive bids.

Revenue Backfill

The County elected to receive the standard \$10 million revenue backfill allowance which was expended towards ARPA eligible County services for Homelessness, RUHS-FQHCs and Economic Development.

ARPA 2nd Installment Allocation Summary, by *Category as of August 31, 2023:

The Board of Supervisor's District Offices have obligated a combined \$97 million in projects and programs. They are working with the Executive Office to allocate the remaining \$68 million within the next few months. Details of the funding by project are listed in Attachment C.

Countywide Department Response

On July 11, 2023, the Board approved the Harmony Haven Children and Youth Center in the amount of \$26.8 million. This important project provides transitional housing for foster children and youth until they can be placed in foster homes. To fund this out of the Countywide Department Response category \$21 million was moved from the Future Allocation category.

As a result of approved infrastructure projects, a need for construction contingency funding arose. From the interest earnings to date of \$12 million, along with a portion of the remaining Future Allocation, \$15 million was moved to the Countywide Department Response category to fund the construction contingencies. As of August 31, 2023 there remains \$12.2 million unobligated in the Countywide Department Response category.

Countywide Economic Resilience/Shelter

Of the original \$49 million Countywide allocation, Economic Resilience/Shelter category was given \$10 million. Of the \$10 million, each District was given \$2 million for this effort. To date \$7.6 million has been obligated.

Countywide Child Care

On January 24, 2023, the Board of Supervisors approved \$8 million in Countywide Childcare from the ARPA 2nd allocation for Early Care & Education (ECE) Recovery Fund to stabilize and expand availability of ECE to support the workforce. As of August 31, 2023, \$3 million has been paid out to 1178 early childhood educators.

Additional Fiscal Information

As of August 31, 2023, the County has obligated \$213.5 million (89%) of its ARPA 1st allocation and \$154.6 million (59%) of its ARPA 2nd allocation.

Donated time is not permitted during Public Comment.

Power Point Presentations/Printed Material:

Speakers who intend to conduct a formalized Power Point presentation or provide printed material must notify the Clerk of the Board's Office by 12 noon on the Monday preceding the Tuesday Board meeting, insuring that the Clerk's Office has sufficient copies of all printed materials and at least one (1) copy of the Power Point CD. Copies of printed material given to the Clerk (by Monday noon deadline) will be provided to each Supervisor. If you have the need to use the overhead "Elmo" projector at the Board meeting, please ensure your material is clear and with proper contrast, notifying the Clerk well ahead of the meeting, of your intent to use the Elmo.

Individual Speaker Limits:

Individual speakers are limited to a maximum of three (3) minutes. Please step up to the podium when the Chairman calls your name and begin speaking immediately. Pull the microphone to your mouth so that the Board, audience, and audio recording system hear you clearly. Once you start speaking, the "green" podium light will light. 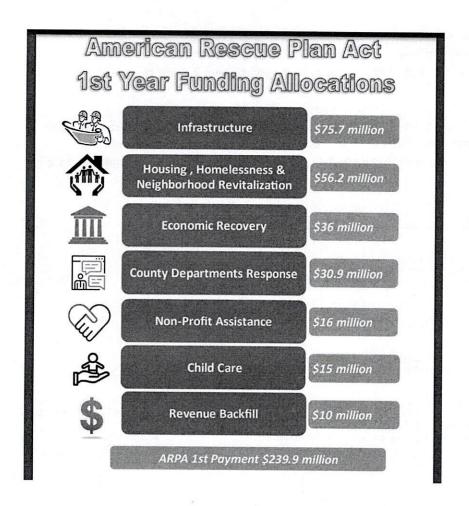
