



BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Riverside University Health System will host the 34th Annual Festival of Trees on November 21, 2023. This event raises funds to support the critical work at RUHS Pediatric Unit, Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Pediatric Intensive Care Unit and the Child Abuse a Neglect Unit. CID funds will be used to support a range of initiatives including, converting exam rooms into safe space for kids in crisis and revitalizing classroom and play areas.
2. Building Resilient Communities (BRC) hosted their first Health & Wellness Fair in Palm Springs at the James O. Jessie Highland Unity Center. The event provided information on disaster preparedness, hosted various vaccine clinics, and provided access to resources and tools to the most vulnerable. BRC partnered with several agencies including EMD, Public Health, City of Palm Springs and more. CID funds will help cover the cost of decorations, and security.
