2. Authorize the EMD Director to sign amendments to the agreement that extend the term for a period of up to 5 years, as approved by County Counsel.



BACKGROUND:

Summary

On July 20, 2021, Item 3.10, the Board of Supervisors approved the Emergency Management Department to offer Emergency Management Services to city partners.

This Partnership Agreement offers a successful Emergency Management (EM) Program that includes all four phases of Emergency Management. The EM Services include but are not limited to the four phases in Emergency Management of mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery. The options allow each city to create their ideal level of service while enabling the county to achieve a full cost recovery for services as they are provided.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Emergency services personnel dedicated to serving the cities will enhance the preparedness, response, and recovery capabilities of the cities and residents in case of an emergency or natural disaster.

Additional Fiscal Information

This agreement will support salary and benefits for the Emergency Services Coordinator under the Program. The total awarded amount for this fiscal year will be included in the FY23/24 Midyear Report.
