

BACKGROUND:

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Riverside County Department of Public Social Services, Adult Services Division- \$4,000 -The funding will be utilized to sponsor the 2024 Elder and Dependent Adult Abuse Symposium. The purpose of the symposium is to continue to raise awareness about elder and dependent adult abuse, but also to highlight innovative approaches, programs and strategies that aim to prevent and protect elder or dependent adults.
2. Shuttles 4 Soldiers- \$10,000- The funding will be used to provide transportation services for low-income veterans living in the third district. Certified drivers will take veterans with severe chronic or physical disabilities to medical or life dependent related appointments.
3. Volunteers for Public Service, Inc.- \$2,500 – The funding will be used to distribute food provisions to local food banks in the third district serving Homeland, East Hemet, Temecula, and Anza areas.
4. Greater Menifee Valley Chamber of Commerce- \$1,000 – The funding will be used for recognition and scholarships for local Menifee high school students.
5. Murrieta Valley Nighthawk Marching Band Boosters- \$2,500 – The funding will be used to assist low-income students with the costs of uniforms and travel expenses so that they can participate in the 2024 National Veterans Day Parade.
6. Menifee Mustangs Track and Field Club- \$7,500- The funding will be used to provide low to medium income students the opportunity to participate in track and field activities. The program is specifically targeted for youth dealing with domestic violence, homelessness, or disabilities. The goal of the program is to provide a safe space where youth can develop a strong mind and body so they can build resilience and achieve their highest potential.
7. Western Eagle Foundation-\$10,000 – The funding will be utilized to provide emergency food bags for low to moderate income third district recipients. Food is distributed at the store location 26 weeks a year (every other week). The emergency food bag includes pantry staples, fresh vegetables, and other donated foods.
