

**BACKGROUND:**

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Valley View Foundation-** \$5,000- The funding will be utilized to assist with the capital project to improve the roof of the Historic Hemet Theatre and to install solar panels for better energy efficiency.
2. **Riverside Recovery Resources-**\$10,800- The Funding will be used to support the "Know your Limit Program". This program seeks to raise awareness of blood alcohol levels of participants at public events. To educate the public on how little alcohol it takes to raise Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) levels in the blood system.
3. **Boojum Institute for Outdoor Education-**\$10,000- The funding will be utilized to assist with outdoor education programming and equipment purchase for a hands-on learning experience at Camp Emerson in collaboration with the Boy Scouts of America.

4. **Menifee Union School District**-\$2,500- The Funding will be used to support local educators and mentors in the Menifee Union School District. The Educators of the Year Annual Awards seeks to recognize exceptional achievements and contributions of educators in the school district.
5. **Project Touch**-\$10,000- The funding will be utilized to support the continual operation of the transitional housing program that houses homeless individuals who are referred to the program by first responders, and the Riverside County Department of Public Social Services, Adult's Children's Protective Services divisions.
6. **Michelle's Place-Cancer Resource Center**-\$10,000- The funding will be used for mental health services for cancer patients and teens. Michelle's place is working with Pepperdine University to offer the counseling services. Patients receive 10 counseling sessions; children of patients participate in 10 family nights.
7. **Rotary Club of Temecula**-\$7,500- The funds will be used for two different programs: A) \$5,000 for monthly food baskets for low-income seniors in Temecula, Murrieta, and Wildomar. B) Items needed for single moms with children/ homeless individuals, and for transitional housing and foster children.
8. **Alternatives to Domestic Violence**-\$10,000- The funding will be utilized to support the general operations of the women's shelter facility and its clients. The facility provides clients with safety planning, emergency shelter, meals, and counseling services.
9. **Community Mission of Hope**-\$10,000- The funding will be utilized to support the Empowerment Village Housing Program. This program assists at-risk struggling single mothers and their children.
10. **Community Food Pantry of Murrieta**-\$10,000- The funding will be used to purchase nutritious food, dairy, fresh produce, staples, and proteins for low-income residents living in Murrieta and the French Valley corridor. The pantry assists 200 families weekly. In addition, food supply is delivered to senior shut-ins.
11. **Rose Again Foundation**-\$5,000- The funding will be used to develop a new website on the WordPress platform for better integration of customer management software that assists foster families, who host foster children in their homes.
