C.E.O. RECOMMENDATION: Approve

BACKGROUND:

The Agricultural Commissioner's Office provides various services for a 1.3-billion-dollar agricultural industry in Riverside County. This industry includes vegetables and citrus in the Coachella Valley desert, wine grapes in the Temecula Wine Country and cotton, alfalfa and wheat along the Colorado River. The office is entrusted with the mission of promoting and protecting the agricultural industry of the County and its environment, ensuring the health and safety of the County's citizens, and fostering confidence and equity in the marketplace through education and the fair and uniform enforcement of laws, regulation, and ordinances enacted by the people of the State of California and the County of Riverside.

On August 25, 2020, Agenda Item 19.1, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 2020-144, A Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside Adopting An Amended Fee Schedule for Agricultural Services within the County of Riverside. While some fees the Agricultural Commissioner's Office charges are statutorily set, several of the fees the Agricultural Commissioner's Office charges are based on the actual time expended plus mileage accrued. Actual time expended is comprised of the hourly pay rate and benefits of the inspector in effect at the time services are rendered plus department overhead multiplied by the hours or fraction of hours expended in ½ hour increments.

The Agricultural Commissioner's Office, based on departmental cost analysis, deemed it necessary to amend the hourly pay rate and benefits of the inspectors and the department overhead in order to ensure full cost recovery. The hourly pay rate and benefits of the inspectors and the department overhead rate is being updated and amended in accordance with the Board of Supervisor's Policy B-4, "RATES CHARGED FOR CURRENT SERVICES". The proposed rates have been made in collaboration with the Auditor Controller's Office and it is based on departmental revenue and expenditures and current staff and labor cost.

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RESOLUTION NO. 2020-144

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE ADOPTING AN AMENDED FEE SCHEDULE FOR AGRICULTURAL SERVICES WITHIN THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE

WHEREAS, various state statutes and regulations allow for county board of supervisors to set fees to recover costs associated with the agricultural commissioner's office providing certain agricultural services within their county; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside on June 10, 2008, Agenda Item No. 9.1, adopted Resolution No. 2008-219 establishing a fee schedule for agricultural services within the County of Riverside; and

WHEREAS, changed circumstances have made it both practical and appropriate to amend and update the fee schedule for agricultural services within the County of Riverside; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held regarding the proposed amended fee schedule for agricultural services within the County of Riverside and the proposed amended fee schedule for agricultural services within the County of Riverside was considered at a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors on August 25, 2020, at which all present were given an opportunity to be heard on the proposed amended fee schedule for agricultural services within the County of Riverside;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on August 25, 2020, at 9:30 a.m. or soon thereafter, in the meeting room located on the first floor of the County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California, that the Board of Supervisors does hereby adopt the amended fee schedule for agricultural services within the County of Riverside, as follows:

1) When a certificate, as defined in Sections 5201, 47020, 42791 and 42792 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, or permit, as defined in Sections 1430 of the California Code of Regulations, Title

3, requires field inspections, on-site inspections, laboratory analysis, observation of mandatory pesticide treatments, mandatory fumigation, or any other requirement that must be met prior to the issuance of a permit or certificate, or there is any other agricultural related service requested by industry or the public, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined below:

Actual Time = (Hourly Pay Rate & Benefits of the Inspector in Effect at the Time Services are

Rendered* + Department Overhead**) x (Hours or Fraction of Hours Expended in ¼

Hour Increments)

- * The current Hourly Pay Rate & Benefits of the Inspector, as approved by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, can be found on the Agricultural Commissioner's website: https://rivcoawm.org/.
- ** Department Overhead is a three year rolling average calculated by dividing the Agricultural Commissioner's Office indirect costs by its direct personnel cost. The current Department Overhead fee can be found on the Agricultural Commissioner's website: https://rivcoawm.org/.

Mileage = (Number of Miles) x (Current Internal Revenue Service Standard Mileage Rate)

- 2) For the issuance of citrus permits as defined in section 1430 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 3, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.
- 3) For the issuance of fruit and/or vegetable certificates, as defined in Sections 42791, 42792 and 42793 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.
- 4) For the issuance of a certified producer's certificate per calendar year or portion thereof (including amendments to) and a certified farmers' market certificate per calendar year or portion thereof for each location, as defined in Section 1392.7 and 1392.8 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 3, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.
- 5) For the inspection of certain vegetables and fruits, as defined in Riverside County Ordinance No.

610 and Section 42792.1 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge the following fees:

Head lettuce – per standard container	
Cantaloupe melons – per standard container	1.5 cents
Other melons – per carton	1.5 cents
Watermelons – per ton	
Cantaloupe, honeydews, other melons (Experimental containers) 50.0	cents per bin
Head lettuce (for shredding)50.0	cents per bin

6) For the inspection of green corn, as defined in Riverside County Ordinance No. 566 and Section 42792.1 of the California Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge the following fees:

- 7) For the service of certifying plant and plant product shipments, as requested by industry, and as defined in Sections 5201 and 5202 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1. There shall be a minimum fee of \$13.50 for commodity fumigation under an authorized "Compliance Agreement." There shall be a minimum fee of \$60.00 for commodity inspection under an authorized "Compliance Agreement." A \$24.00 fee shall be charged for each duplicate of a certified certificate.
- 8) Services related to apiaries:
 - A. For bee colony strength inspection and certification, as defined in Sections 29193 and 29195 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.
 - B. For apiary American Foulbrood Disease inspections, as defined in Section 29201 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.
 - C. For abatement of American Foulbrood Disease, as defined in Sections 29207 and 29209 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.

- D. For apiary pest inspection, as defined in Section 29201 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.
- E. For apiary pest abatement, as defined in Section 29209 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.
- F. For apiary registration as defined in Section 29044 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge an annual registration fee of ten dollars (\$10.00).
- 9) For services related to cultivation, sampling, testing and abatement of industrial hemp as defined in Chapter 8, Division 4, Title 3 of the California Code of Regulations, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1.
- 10) For registration with the Agricultural Commissioner's Office by a licensed Branch 1 Structural Pest Control Business, as defined in Section 15204.5 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$25.00.
- 11) For registration with the Agricultural Commissioner's Office by a licensed Branch 2 or 3 Structural Pest Control Business, as defined in Section 15204 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$10.00.
- 12) For each amendment to the registration with the Agricultural Commissioner's Office by a licensed Branch 1 Structural Pest Control Business, as defined in Section 15204.5 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$10.00.
- 13) For each amendment to the registration with the Agricultural Commissioner's Office by a licensed Branch 2 or 3 Structural Pest Control Business, as defined in Section 15204 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$10.00.
- 14) For registration of a licensed pest control operator, as defined in Sections 11701, 11732 and 11734 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$60.00.

- 15) For registration of a maintenance gardener to do licensed pest control work, as defined in Sections 11704 and 11734 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$25.00.
- 16) For registration of an agricultural pest control advisor, as defined in Sections 11410, 12002, 12031, and 12034 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$10.00. However, for registration of an agricultural pest control advisor already registered in another county, as defined in Sections 11410, 12002, 12031, and 12034 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$5.00.
- 17) For registration of an agricultural pest control aircraft pilot, as defined in Sections 11901, 11921, and 11923 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$10.00. However, for registration of an agricultural pest control aircraft pilot already registered in another county, as defined in Sections 11901, 11921, and 11923 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$5.00.
- 18) For registering a licensed farm labor contractor, as defined in Section 1695 of the California Labor Code, who contracts with growers in Riverside County for farm labor, for each calendar year or fraction thereof, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$40.00.
- 19) For a permit or wood receipt for native plants, as defined in Sections 80063, 80064, and 80101 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge the following minimum fee and per plant/per cord fee, as applicable:

Minimum Fee	\$10.00
Per cord of live or dead mesquite, palo verde, or ironwood species of trees,	cut or removed
for wood	\$1.00
Per native plant except Yucca breviofolia (Joshua Tree)	. \$1.00
Per Yucca brevifolia (Joshua tree)	\$2.00

20) Pursuant to Section 12829 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, if a person has a research authorization for a pesticide issued pursuant to Section 6260 of Title 3 of the California Code of Regulations for the purpose of testing the pesticide, and the produce on which the pesticide was tested is required to be destroyed, any actual costs incurred by the Agricultural Commissioner to

investigate and confirm the destruction of the produce shall be paid for by the person who has the research authorization. To investigate and confirm the destruction of the produce, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1, not to exceed \$125.00 per test site.

- 21) For requested inspections/consultations, training sessions, records research (crop information or otherwise) not supported by fees otherwise provided for in this Resolution, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge a fee based on the Actual Time expended plus Mileage accrued, as defined in Section 1, with a two hour minimum.
- 22) For requested photocopying services, the Agricultural Commissioner may charge \$0.50 per page.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED that that the foregoing fees established in each case are not more than the actual cost of the services rendered.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED that the authority and guidelines for the above fee schedule comes from the following: California Food and Agricultural Code Sections 5201, 5202, 6303(d), 11410, 11701, 11704, 11732, 11734, 11901, 11921, 11923, 12002, 12031, 12034, 12829, 15204, 15204.5, 29044, 29195, 29201, 29207, 29209, 42791, 42792, 42792.1, 42793, 47020, 80063, 80064, 80101, and 81005; California Code of Regulations, Title 3, Sections 1392.7, 1392.8, 1430, 3160, and 6260; California Labor Code Section 1695; and Riverside County Ordinance Numbers 484, 566, and 610.
