BACKGROUND:

Summary

Riverside University Health System - Behavioral Health (RUHS-BH) operates a continuum of care system that consists of County-operated and contracted service providers delivering a variety of mental health treatment services within each geographic region of Riverside County.

The County Behavioral Health Directors Association of California (CBHDA) is a nonprofit advocacy association representing the behavioral health directors from each of California's 58 counties, as well as two cities. The CBHDA team strives to shape proposed policy and fiscal changes at the State level, while providing each member with valuable, up-to-date information regarding policy changes that affect local services. Through the Governing Board and over a dozen committees and task forces, CBHDA has provided directors and their county staff many opportunities throughout the past year to stay informed, influence State policy, and obtain the support and advice of colleagues.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

These services are a component of Behavioral Health's system of care aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.

The membership with CBHDA continues to be beneficial to the Department. Currently, CBHDA is aggressively advocating to Department of Health Care Services (DCHS), on behalf of Riverside County Behavioral Health and the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC ODS), for the California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) reform. CalAIM is a multi-year initiative by DHCS to improve the quality of life and health outcomes of our population by implementing broad delivery system, program and payment reform across the Medi-Cal program. The behavioral health components of CalAIM are designed to support whole-person, integrated care; move the administration of Medi-Cal behavioral health to a more consistent and seamless system by reducing complexity and increasing flexibility; and improve quality outcomes, reduce health disparities, and drive delivery system transformation and innovation through improvements to behavioral health policies and the launch of behavioral health payment reform.

CBHDA is currently helping the Department shape and comply with the following policies:

Additional Fiscal Information

The membership dues combine the County's CBHDA, Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Supplemental Assessment, and Alcohol & Other Drug (AOD) dues Assessments.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

Ordinance 459 allows for the payment of memberships, sponsorships, and registrations without bidding as these costs are pre-established fees or dues associated with the prescribed service.

On December 13, 2016 (Item 3.35), the Board approved CBHDA dues in the amount of \$71,260 annually through June 30, 2020. For FY 2019/2020, RUHS requested approval for the increase in dues. On November 19, 2019 (Item 3.15), the Board approved CBHDA dues in the amount of \$90,689 for FY 2019/2020, FY 2020/2021 in the amount of \$108,826, and FY 2021/2022 in the amount of \$130,592. On January 24, 2023 (Item 3.43), the Board approved CBHDA dues in the amount of \$130,591 annually through June 30, 2025.

In June 2022, the CBHDA Governing Body approved an increase to Riverside County's CBHDA dues by fifty-four percent (54%) due to program expansion and inflation for FY 2023/2024. Therefore, RUHS-BH is requesting an approval from the Board of Supervisors for payment of dues to CBHDA in the amount of \$201,746 annually through June 30, 2026.
