BACKGROUND:

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The Riverside University Health System Medical Center (RUHS MC) is a licensed and accredited acute care hospital serving the needs of County residents since 1893. RUHS MC currently has two campuses – one in Moreno Valley and one off of County Farm Road in the City of Riverside.

As an acute care hospital RUHS MC is required by the State of California to have a "governing body" separate from its administrative leaders and medical staff leadership. The "governing body" is "the person, persons, board of trustees, directors or other body in whom the final authority and responsibility is vested for conduct of the hospital." 22 CCR §70035. (See also 42 CFR 482.12 and Joint Commission Standard LD.01.03.01). The Board of Supervisors serves as the "governing body" for the hospital.

Good governance of the Medical Center, along with various regulatory requirements, mandates that the Governing Board participate in the leadership and decision-making of the Medical Center relating to various topics, including:

Oversight of Accreditation and Compliance related Activities

Review and approval of certain policies

Review of controls for Ethics and Quality of Care established by the Medical Staff

Review of contractor performance

Oversight of Grievance process

Review of operations of Quality Assurance and Performance Improvement processes

Review of reports on system / process failures, follow-up on such events

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Participation in Community Health planning

The attached reports provide information related to these topics. Their presentation and review by the Board of Supervisors not only helps the Medical Center to meet regulatory requirements but also to be transparent about its operations, successes, and challenges.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The RUHS Medical Center offers a 439-bed providing adult, Pediatric and Neonatal Services, including a Level 1 Trauma Center, the county's only Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, a Stroke Center, with over 40 specialty care clinics, as well as a Medical and Surgical Center featuring state-of-the-art Outpatient Surgical, Diagnostic and Imaging Equipment, Rehabilitation Services, and an Outpatient Pharmacy. The RUHS Emergency Treatment Services/Inpatient Treatment Facility at the Arlington Campus located in Riverside is a 77-bed inpatient Psychiatric Treatment Facility. The integrated healthcare continuum is fortified with 14 RUHS-CHCs conveniently located throughout the county which work in close partnership with RUHS-BH and RUHS-PH to offer access to comprehensive high-quality and integrated primary, Behavioral Health, Specialty Care, Dental Care and Health Promotion services.

Training future healthcare leaders is fundamental to our commitment to serving our community as well as our mission as a safety net institution. An efficient, well-functioning medical center providing care of high quality creates many positive benefits for Riverside County citizens and its businesses.






FY 2023/24 Budget - \$2,470,269,974






FY 2023/24 Budget – Net County Costs & Contributions




- Our system, one of 21 public health systems in California, provides critical safety net care to at risk communities
- Provide more than hospital care to Medi-Cal and uninsured patients
 - Primary Care
 - Specialty Care
 - Behavioral Health
- Operate majority of trauma, burn centers in California
- Train half of the physicians in California, as well as nurses and other providers



Though just **6% of all hospitals** in the state, public hospitals serve **35% of all Medi-Cal** and uninsured care statewide.

On average, **60% of patients are Medi-Cal or uninsured**. In some systems, it's nearly 80% of patients.






How PHS are Currently Funded

- PHS are primarily funded through federal dollars that require a state match:
 - Medi-Cal
 - Medicaid waivers for specific programs
 - Medicaid Disproportionate Share Hospital (DSH) funding
 - Other supplemental payments
- For PHS, "supplementals" now represent 2/3 of their Medi-Cal & uninsured payments, with PHS paying the state's share of those payments



Public Health Systems are Paying Most of State's Share of Medi-Cal





Convergence of Factors Creating a Financial Crisis

Base Medi-Cal payments have never been enough to cover costs

Because of our mission and payor mix, it is not an option for PHS to offset these losses with commercial payors

Waivers and supplemental payments provide significant additional revenues, but those sources of revenue are either declining or are hitting limits



Expansion of Medi-Cal managed care reduces the net financial return to DPHs because FFS is cost-based, and managed care rates are so low

Other factors: inflation, workforce shortages, ongoing pandemic services



Three Key Strategies to Stabilize Funding






Workflow Process

- 1. RECOGNITION Patient is recognized as severe sepsis and/or septic shock
- BPAs, Sepsis Screening, MD/RN evaluations
- 2. ACTIVATION Patient is internally activated as a rapid response
- Code Team is activated through internal page and arrives at bedside within 15 minutes
- 3. TREATMENT Timely bundle treatment is initiated and/or continued
- Benchmark times are hour 1, 3, and 6
- 4. DISPOSITION During treatment patient's disposition will be determined after collaboration
- Primary physician will consult with several teams and deem if patient needs to be admitted, upgraded, or discharged
- 5. CONTINUATION OF CARE If admitted, the patient will be monitoring by the code team RNs
- The code team will continue the standard of care for all activated patients that are admitted.







ORC was created to enhance and improve the scientific productivity of faculty, trainees, and students, at the clinical departments of RUHS Medical ter. CECORC opened officially in July 2018. Since then, many developments have occurred, which we want to share with you in this 5-year report.

ORC initially had a core of individuals primarily serving the research needs of two major areas: surgical and medical specialties. 

Dr. Raul Coimbra is the Director of the Comparative Effectiveness and Clinical Outcomes Research Center at RUHS Medical Center, and Professor of Surgery at Loma Linda University School of Medicine Previously, Dr. Coimbra was the Director of the UCSD Level-1 Trauma Center and the Chief of the Division of Trauma, Surgical Critical Care, Burns, and Acute Care Surgery for more than two decades.

His participation in global health and international outreach is enormous. Dr. Coimbra is President of the Board of Directors for the World Coalition for Trauma Care, as well as a member of the Global Alliance for the Care of the Injured within the Division of Trauma and Injury Prevention of the World Health Organization.

In addition, Dr. Coimbra is a Past Vice-Chairman of the Committee on Trauma of the American College of Surgeons (ACS), Past President of the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma, Past President of the Panamerican Trauma Society, and Editor Emeritus of the European Journal of Trauma and Emergency Surgery.

Currently, Dr. Coimbra is the Editor-in-Chief of the prestigious Journal of Trauma and Acute Care Surgery, a Governor of the American College of Surgeons, and the Chairman of the Emergency General Surgery Verification Program of the American College of Surgeons.

Dr. Coimbra has more than 730 scientific publications and 18 books on most clinical and experimental aspects of Trauma, Emergency General Surgery, and Surgical Critical Care.

ANTHONY FIREK, MD, MS

DIRECTOR OF RESEARCH - MEDICINE

Dr. Anthony Firek is the Director of Medical Research at CECORC. He is board certified in both Internal Medicine and Endocrinology and is a member of the clinical staff at RUHS. He is Associate Clinical Professor of Medicine at the UCR School of Medicine and a faculty member of Loma Linda University School of Medicine.

Dr. Firek has over 30 years of experience in clinical trials and clinical research studies. He is also working as a collaborative scientist in basic science projects in diabetes and thyroid cancer at LLU. He currently serves as both a PI and sub PI on a number of ongoing research projects. His interests include developing research skills in associated faculty, residents and students, care for the transgender population, nutrition health disparities, diabetes, endocrine cancers, and metabolic related conditions.

NAVPREET DHILLON, MD DIRECTOR OF SURGICAL RESEARCH

Dr. Navpreet Dhillon is a trauma and acute care surgeon at Riverside University Health System Medical Center. She completed her medical education and general surgery training in Southern California and went on to complete a Surgical Critical Care fellowship followed by a Trauma and Acute Care Surgery fellowship at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center at the University of Maryland. Dr. Dhillon will be assuming the role of the Director of Surgical Research at CECORC.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MOLECULAR MICROBIOLOGY AND RESEARCH

Dr. Adriana Rosato is the Executive Director of the Molecular Microbiology Laboratory, Department of Pathology at Riverside University Health System. She is a Clinical Professor of Surgery at the University of California, Riverside, CA and adjunct Professor at the Division of Biomedical Sciences, Division of Microbiology at Loma Linda University. She is a member of the Gulf Coast Consortia (GCC) Cluster for Antimicrobial Resistance (GCC AMR), member of American Society of Microbiology (ASM), and the Infectious Diseases Society of America. She has received multiple awards, including Faculty Award and outstanding service as mentor including minorities. Dr. Rosato earned her MSc and Ph.D. at the University Paris XI, Pasteur Institute, Paris, France. She is an internationally recognized expert on molecular mechanisms of antibiotic resistance with emphasis in multi-drug resistant pathogens (MDR), clinical impact of resistance, and the molecular epidemiology and evolution of MDR, the host human response during MDR infections and the effects of antimicrobials and immunotherapies (e.g. cancer) on the microbiome. Her works have been published extensively (>70). She is Editor in numerous journals of the ASM, former standing reviewer, ad-hoc of NIH and European Agencies in where her input has contributed to important funding decisions.


ALAA BIERMAN, DRPH

NATIONAL SURGICAL QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (NSQIP)


Preoperative risk factors, preoperative laboratory values, intraoperative variables, 30-day postoperative mortality, and 30-day morbidity on all patients undergoing major operations which meet program criteria are collected by a trained Surgical Clinical Reviewer (SCR), who enters the data into a secure online quality data platform. Quarterly, detailed risk-adjusted reports are distributed to the participating centers. These reports allow each facility to benchmark their outcomes in real time against ACS NSQIP participants. The American College of Surgeons NSQIP Platform can also be formatted for research purposes containing de-identified data from all participating hospitals. The NSQIP research dataset is available to RUHS-MC researchers and clinicians.
