I am specifically working with the members of the We Are 90 for Riverside campaign, which is a community focused and led effort by constituents of Riverside County to engage with both you and the public to support of the Riverside County Department of Animal Services in their goal to reach a 90% lifesaving rate.

I have come before you supervisors four times in the past 35 weeks (8 months) to speak with you about our lack of confidence in the County's Election System. I am just one of many voices -- but I will continue to speak up for those who came before me, those who continue with me, and those who will continue to speak up for the rights of American citizens living in Riverside County.

The people of this State do not yield their sovereignty to the agencies which serve them. ... [Gov. Code § 54950]. While Sacramento may do things behind closed doors, we expect you (Supervisors), as our lesser magistrates, to uphold your oath to the US constitution and to protect our civil rights for a fair and honest election.

Two months ago Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Van Wagenen directed Registrar of Voters (ROV) Tinoco to provide a timely written response and follow up meeting to address significant discrepancies in the 2022 elections [see page 2] ROV did not provide a written response until weeks after the CEO said it would be provided and the meeting is yet to happen.

NOTE: These significant discrepancies were pointed out to the previous ROV Spencer and then-Asst.ROV Tinoco prior to the 2022 certification but no response or explanation to the public inquiry was given at that time. THIS IS A HUGE PROBLEM - especially with the UPCOMING ELECTION NEXT MONTH... these past SIGNIFICANT DISCREPANCIES have NOT BEEN RESOLVED. There is no confidence that a fair and honest election will occur. Supervisors may not have been aware in 2022 that there were SIGNIFICANT DISCREPANCIES and proceeded with certifying that election, but now that you are aware -- it is your duty to investigate this in a timely manner to correct the problem and restore confidence in our election system.

Also, Riverside County has refused to release the election audit logs which are public records. Other counties in California post their election audit logs or have them readily available for public review. The audit logs provide evidence that could show how fair and honest elections are here in Riverside County or how our county is being manipulated by the state.

Don't delay - 1) investigate the significant discrepancies so they don't occur again! 2) Make the audit logs public. 3) Update the contract for voting machines so they are inspected to confirm they are in compliance as DHS identified "critical infrastructure" which must be produced and manufactured in the USA. Machines can be hacked and signatures can be forged. You are responsible for repairing this corrupted system. Stand up to the bullies in Sacramento. Direct our ROV to take charge of elections in Riverside County with an honest and fair election system. JUST DO IT!!!

*June 7th primary election:

- 22,564 in-person votes were cast (per ballot statements and ROV report). The machines tabulated 36,033 in-person votes in the election night results. **That is an additional 13,469 in-person votes that were added to election night results.**
- The registrar reported receiving 252,661 VBMs (Vote By Mail) from the USPS; however, the USPS receipts show that no more than 217K VMB's were billed to the ROV. Where did the extra 36K VBMs come from that the ROV reported?

*Nov 8th general election:

- 44,347 in-person votes were cast on election day (per ballot statements and ROV report).
 The machines tabulated 24, 894 in-person votes in the election night results. That means
 19,453 in person votes were NOT reported in the election night results.
- The registrar reported receiving 316,710 VBMs from the USPS; however, the USPS receipts show only 282K VBMs were billed to the ROV. Where did the extra 35K VBMs come from that the ROV reported?

2022 ELECTIONS

- Why did the ROV not identify duplicate voters? RUnbeck mailed out over 5K erroneous duplicate ballots yet not one double voter was identified.
- Why does Dominion Voting Systems have complete access to the tabulators with no
 oversight? (Dominion contractors in the tabulator room on and before election day. Seals
 changed and Dominion did "unscheduled servicing" on a Saturday. Records of seal log show
 date of Dominion's visit was changed to the following Monday. No record of the work they
 performed could be provided.[other irregularities need to be resolved]
- How are the citizens of Riverside County able to view the counting or their votes when the counting is done inside of a computer? CA law requires voting systems to be tested and certified by an accredited Voting System Test Lab, VSTL, per election Codes 19200-19233. VSTLs are certified by the election Assistance Commission, EAC. Lab certification is valid for two years. After two years, the lab must re-submit an application for re-certification and a new contractual agreement is created. Re-certification is granted pending review of the lab based on the standards and guidelines. It was discovered in 2021, California and other states continued to certify electronic voting systems via Voting System Test Laboratory Pro V&V despite it having no active accreditation during 2020. During this time, the EAC certified Dominion systems and other voting systems for use in the 2020 election. There were two significant issues:
 - a. The certificate of accreditation had expired 3 years earlier in February 2017. It was not renewed until February 2021. The renewal does not meet EAC certification requirements.
 - b. The original certificate of accreditation was signed by a EAC Director, not the EAC Chair, as designated by law, meaning their original certificate was legally invalid.
 Thus the <u>current certification of the Riverside Dominion system is void</u> and requires re-certification. This information was shared during our meeting with Supervisor Jeffries in November, 2023.


