BACKGROUND:

Riverside County Workforce Development Board (WDB) is a private sector led policy and oversight body that supports the expansion and development of the regional workforce. The WDB is governed by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA) which mandates that more than 50% of the WDB's members must come from the business community. In addition, WDBs are required to have representation from universities or community colleges, economic development, and workforce representatives including labor organizations. This ensures that federal funds for workforce development activities are expended on training and career coaching that meets the needs of the business community. Pursuant to WIOA, the Board of Supervisors, led by the Board Chairman who serves as the Chief Local Elected Official (CLEO), is responsible for appointing the WDB members for two-year terms.

Dr. Hillary Jenks, Co-Executive Director of the Inland Empire Labor Institute (IELI), is a leader with over 15 years of dedicated experience in managing complex organizations and serving

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diverse stakeholders in the fields of education and workforce development. At IELI she directs Plug In IE, a High Road Training Partnership in Sustainable Logistics, co-convenes the region's California Jobs First collaborative (Thrive Inland SoCal) with IEGO, and oversees the Institute's strategic planning and financial management. Previously she directed professional development programs for over 3500 graduate students at UCR, led the Center for Social Justice and Civil Liberties for the Riverside Community College District, and taught at Portland State University. She received her PhD from the University of Southern California. Hilary Jenks is filling the vacancy of previous Board member Ken Orr.
