BACKGROUND:

Summary

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 (H.R. 1319) in to law. The \$1.9 trillion package is intended to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, including the public health and economic impacts.

As part of the \$362 billion in federal fiscal recovery aid for state and local governments, \$65.1 billion is provided in direct aid to counties. Riverside County's share of the ARPA funding is \$479,874,599, of which the first installment of \$239,937,299 was received on May 10, 2021, and the second installment in the same amount was received on June 6, 2022. The funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026.

On October 4, 2022, (Agenda Item 3.44) the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the ARPA second installment funding allocation which distributed \$33 million per district to be obligated towards infrastructure, housing and homelessness, workforce development, neighborhood revitalization, business revitalization, childcare facilities, and non-profits.

The following project has been recommended for ARPA funding by the Fourth District and was determined to be in compliance with ARPA funding objectives and US Treasury eligibility criteria by the Executive Office. The Desert Recreation District will administer, construct, and maintain the following Neighborhood Revitalization project, which will be completed on or before December of 2026, utilizing the proposed ARPA Neighborhood Revitalization funding:

• Thermal Community Park - \$4,500,000 - The Desert Recreation District proposes the construction of the 10-acre Thermal Community Park in the unincorporated community of Thermal, CA. The proposed park would be constructed on what is currently a date palm orchard at the corner of Church Street and Olive Street. The project site is located across the street from La Familia High School, John Kelly Elementary School, and the Migrant Head Start Thermal Center. Through the community outreach process, the residents expressed a desire to have playgrounds court, ball fields, picnic areas/gathering spaces, restrooms with a snack bar, and lighting and landscaping throughout the park.
