BACKGROUND:

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Oak Grove Institute Foundation, Inc.** - \$1,500-The funds will support the Vocational Arts Program, a program that equips youth with job skills and training in the culinary field.
2. **Wildomar Community and Parks Foundation, Inc.** -\$50,000- The funds will be used to support the Wildomar Park Safety Upgrade Program. This program seeks to enhance safety and accessibility to the park by installing resilient rubber surfaces in the designated play areas to minimize the risk of injury from falls or accidents.
3. **Community Access Center** -\$32,000- Funding will be used to support two programs: (1) the Residential Access and Modification Program (RAMP), a program that empowers people with disabilities to control their own lives by removing obstacles such as steps and replacing them with a ramp and (2) The Golf Knolls Community Gate project, a project that will improve response times by allowing firetrucks, ambulances, and other public safety personnel to serve the surrounding area residents faster.
4. **Santa Rosa Plateau Foundation, Inc. DBA The Nature Education Foundation**-\$5,000- The funding will be used to support the Promoting Environmental Protection Through Education (PEPE) Program. PEPE educates students in grades 3-12 about climate change and habitat loss, by allowing the students to study specific habitat areas in the Santa Rosa Plateau and providing them supplies such as journals, clipboards, round trip transportation to and from the fieldwork sites, and iPad for recordation of data.
5. **Mary S. Roberts Pet Adoption Center**-\$5,000- The funding will be used to pay transfer fees for animals at the Riverside County Department of Animals Services to the Mary S. Roberts Pet Adoption Center, spay/neuter, and vaccines.
6. **All From the Heart**-\$15,000- The funding will be used to provide refurbished power wheelchairs and scooters to disabled veterans in the third district.
7. **Temecula Valley Chamber of Commerce**-\$3,500-The funding will be used to support two different programs: (1) the Temecula Student of the Month program,

a program that recognizes and provides scholarships to local Temecula High school students, and (2) the 58th Annual Awards Gala, an annual presentation that honors and supports businesses in the Temecula area that demonstrate strong community involvement.
