Budget Changes and Operational Impacts: increased staffing, increased spending on salaries and benefits, and services and supplies, and with increasing costs each year. What is the objective and logic for additional funding? Where does this money come from? Taxes. This is not faceless "government money" — this is money from the people. You are to represent the best interests of your constituents, not simply comply with bureaucratic wishes.

OBJECTIVES and PERFORMANCE MEASURES from ROV

Objective 1: Achieve transparent and fair elections through equal access for all eligible citizens.

Insight: Increasing the number of bilingual poll workers allows for registered voters with limited English proficiency to participate in the electoral process and for community inclusion. (316).

Objective 2: Maintain voter confidence by administering accurate and efficient elections.

Insights: Customer service scores from citizens, candidates, poll workers, and local jurisdictions allow our organization to improve service delivery in areas of election administration, candidate services, voter services and election officer training. Results from our customer service surveys help our department ensure that participation is fair and conducted professionally. (316).

Regarding both objectives: 90% of vote is VBM (Vote By Mail) which DOES NOT have witnessed signatures or secure Chain of Custody by ROV Election Officials. 10% of total votes cast are at vote centers.

Observation regarding Objective 1: the vote center model with multiple days created confusion and has made the process less transparent and accessible for all eligible citizens.

Evidence: Ballot Statement forms filled out by Vote Center Election Employees at the close of polls daily show in the March 2024 election <u>there were days that multiple Vote Centers had NO VOTERS and an average of 1 voter/hour or less across all centers</u> (excluding election day).

Additional Evidence: "County Voter Information Guide" (might have previously been called the sample ballot) — on the back cover at the lower corner is the "location of your vote center" it <u>used to have the address of the precinct poll location so a voter had specific, accessible information of where to go and a date to get it done;</u> now it has "All voters will receive a ballot in the mail. A list of available vote center locations is printed in the Voter Information Guide." This requires the prospective voter to open the booklet and read through the very small type on pages 4-9.

Analysis: <u>Hiring more poll workers will not mitigate the accessibility issue</u>. Having a specific day to vote and a specific location to vote will make it simple for all eligible citizens to cast their vote and have it counted.

Observation regarding objective 2: While there are many wonderful people serving during elections and in the registrar of voters office, those warm feelings do not translate into confidence about the accuracy and efficiency of elections. Examples of inefficiencies are as follows:

- 1. Voter Rolls are inaccurate. \$900,000 was spent in one election for mailing official ballots to people who have not voted in ten years. An inactive voter is [could be but not yet] removed from the voter list and canceled if two federal general elections have passed from the mailing of an address confirmation notice that complies with Section 8(d)(2) of the NVRA (National Voter Registration Act) and the voter has not voted in any election, or responded to the address confirmation notice, or confirmed their residential address in California. State law also contains change of address, inactive, and cancellation procedures in California Elections Code sections 2220 to 2227.
- There is little confidence in VBM OFFICIAL ballots which do not have a secure Chain of Custody
 due to gaps in supervision by the Registrar of Voters Elections Officials. Without that component
 there is no assurance of accuracy and legitimate voter rights being upheld.
- 3. There are three (3) forms of ballots that are being used in each election (duplicate printings and cost overruns) that election workers need to know how to explain and issue and sort:
 - a. The Vote By Mail (VBM) official ballot that is sent out to residences and then can be mailed back or put in a drop box or hand delivered to ROV. Estimated 5,000 ballots in the March 2024 election were not postmarked by election day and therefore not counted (don't know if people dropped them off in a mailbox or post office on election night which may have been before polls closed at 8 PM but past USPS receiving/postmark time so dated day after election and ineligible).
 - b. The Ballot on Demand (BOD) that is printed at the vote center site on special paper and the voter marks with a pen their vote selections.
 - c. The Computer monitor "accessible" ballot that uses a touchscreen and after the voter makes selections a letter size page is printed with words stating who the voter selected for the elected offices along with a QR code that cannot be read by the voter. That paper is not a receipt -- it is the official ballot that is to be scanned.

On February 27, 2024 the BOS approved 5-0 to allocate an ADDITIONAL \$12,000,000 (TWELVE MILLION DOLLARS) a week before the March 5, 2024 Primary Election for this past (2023/24) fiscal year. Will the BOS again be pressured during the upcoming fiscal year (2024/25) a week before the November 5, 2024 General Election to approve a request for additional funds due to lack of efficiency due to an inaccurate voter roll, inflated printing costs due to excessive ballots, and the additional staff for longer duration due to the vote center model and getting approval for vague, nonspecific expenses?

Making a statement about "increased staffing, increased spending on salaries and benefits, and services and supplies, and with increasing costs each year" are not specific actions to meet the stated objectives to: "Achieve transparent and fair elections through equal access for all eligible citizens and maintain voter confidence by administering accurate and efficient elections." Instead BOS should move to allocate funding to have local, accessible precinct voting on a specific day and ensure voter rolls are current and accurate, and that there is a secure chain of custody by ROV to gain and maintain confidence in the election accuracy and efficiency.

To Chairman Washington, Supervisor Jeffries, Supervisor Gutierrez, Supervisor Perez and Supervisor Spiegel,

Let me use an example from today's agenda and current events to express my concern about board procedures and events in our county that are not being done in a transparent and orderly manner or in response to constituent concerns.

There are a dozen items on the consent calendar and fifty-five items on the policy calendar. Unless a board member or the public requests to <u>pull for discussion</u> a specific item -- these are not brought forward for THE PUBLIC TO HEAR - it is a written form and report on the agenda - that requires locating on the website, clicking and downloading (not just opening to read) the forms and reports or documents. It is an unwieldy and not easily accessible system.

You are participating in an open meeting as a group to deliberate or take action on public business. The lack of audible discussion at these meetings shows a disregard for your compensated elected role and for the citizens you are to represent and who wish to stay informed. An open meeting is the only time you ALL can speak together (Brown Act). Use that time wisely to communicate.

Engage more people in the government process -- provide visuals and staff reports aloud, not just a file to read e.g. today's audit reports and the fund summary report.

Example: According to today's Auditor-Controller Internal Audit Report 2024-325: Riverside County Executive Office, Follow-up Audit [District: All]; [\$0] regarding California Governance Code § 25129, states, 'after the code has been adopted all ordinances thereafter adopted pertaining to the subjects in the code shall be amendatory or revisory fo the code.' A process to initiate a periodic review of board policies that is not specifically requested by county departments, or the Board of Supervisors, is currently not in place. As such, board policies might not be timely updated when changes in government codes or county ordinances occur. Periodic review and update of board policies ensures adopted policies are correct, accurate, and are aligned to changes in legal regulatory and industry standards."

Concern: While this report shows current status as "The unidentified policies are presently undergoing comprehensive review and updates by the responsible departments..." and the recommendation 1.1 is to "establish policies and procedures to set and maintain sunset review dates to ensure information contained in board policies are current, relevant, and accurate."

The description of the corrective action taken (or pending...): The Standard Operating Procedure for Board Policies was updated to incorporate a sunset review date of five (5 years). While this may be a typical specific period, the purpose is to be a mechanism for government agencies and programs to be held accountable for their performance and to ensure that they remain relevant and effective in SERVING THE PUBLIC INTEREST.

CONNECTION to "not on agenda" concern: <u>The California Secretary of State Supplementary</u> Report: *UCLA Voter's Choice Act (VCA) Report on Race and Ethnicity in the 2022 Primary Election* Using Bayesian Improved Surname Geocoding (BISG) on the 2020 Primary Election Voter File. The CA VCA election model (signed into law 2016) was used by Riverside County and 21 other counties in California during the 2022 Primary election. It was designed to provide greater flexibility and convenience for voters, and allow voters to choose how, when, and where

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to cast their ballot and provide more early voting opportunities and methods for voters to return their ballots. The conclusion of this Bayesian (census surname analysis and census block-level racial demographics) report is there are turnout gaps between racial, age, and language groups that need to be reduced/lessened. The top recommendations are:

- 1. Invest in mobilization through social contact.
- 2. Expand civic education
- 3. Increase community outreach and partnerships

Perspective: How is it working for Riverside County?

- 1. The Voter's Choice Act model utilizes larger vote centers rather than local precincts. Look at the "County Voter Information Guide" (might have previously been called the sample ballot) -- on the back cover at the lower corner is the "location of your vote center" it used to have the address of the precinct so a voter had specific, accessible information of where to go and a date to get it done; now it has "All voters will receive a ballot in the mail. A list of available vote center locations is printed in the Voter Information Guide." This requires the prospective voter to open the booklet and read through the very small type on pages 4-9. Vote Center locations are of a smaller type size than the Ballot Drop Off locations. Precincts were within walking distance of home and we would see our neighbors walking and at the polls. We talked about it and got out to vote.
- 2. The California Department of Education writes state standards that may or may not support civic education and understanding.
- The community has been coming to board meetings for more than a year yet we do not see an increase in community outreach and partnership but a need for meaningful discussion and action.

Point: In the March 2022 election there were days that multiple vote centers had no voters and an average of 1 voter per hour or less across all centers (excluding election day). See attached hand-written data compiled from ballot statements for 11 days prior to election at vote centers. Note the X meant the ballot statement was not legible on the document provided to the public from the Registrar of Voter's office. There were some errors on the form with information missing or illegible form. THIS IS A HUGE COST for staffing vote centers that are overwhelmingly underutilized. Also the cost of having staff at the ROV warehouse to look at Vote By Mail (VBM) signatures and then open and process the VBM ballots is in addition to the staffing at Vote Centers. Look at previous costs versus this new model — there is no bang for the big bucks. PLEASE AUDIT for expenditures and show the cost comparison and voter turnout.

There is also a significant lack of basic infrastructure such as shaded sidewalks, potable water, and electricity.

I hope the county takes these needs into account when deciding on the budget, so we can build a stronger and healthier community for everyone.

I have seen a significant lack of fair, low-cost affordable housing and a severe lack of basic infrastructure such as water, sewage, and electricity. The communities in the eastern Coachella Valley have always been the most neglected in budgets and funding. I would like to see funds ensured for these communities, such as

Thermal, Oasis, Mecca, and North Shore, as the majority of these communities are farmworkers who lack resources. I would also like to see a traffic light installed at Avenue 81 and the Express Freeway since many accidents have occurred there. Additionally, another traffic light is needed at Avenue 66 and Cesar Chavez, and at Avenue 70 and Cesar Chavez, as during the summer and the harvest season of chili and grapes, the traffic is heavy, and these intersections are not safe. I would like to see improvements at these intersections because, since 2006, I have witnessed too many accidents there due to the lack of traffic lights. I would greatly appreciate it if attention could be given to these intersections. Returning to the topic of housing, which is the most challenging issue in this area due to our resources, we need fair and dignified housing. We understand that there are allocated funds for certain projects, but we also understand that there are funds that have not been assigned to specific projects. I would like to see that money invested, with the county purchasing land where affordable housing can be built for low-income or homeless people.

I am disappointed to see that out of the nearly \$1.2 billion available in discretionary funding, 67% is allocated to Public Safety including the Sheriff, while only .2% is dedicated to housing and homelessness initiatives.

The proposed discretionary budget funds are directed towards criminal prosecution, probation services, and the Sheriff's Department, while severely underfunding critical areas such as housing and homelessness initiatives, mental health and rehabilitation, economic development and infrastructure, and programs and resources that assist community members returning from incarceration.

I would like to see more funding allocated to:

- Expand funding for low-barrier, non-congregate,
- permanent housing
- · based on Housing First principles.
- Expand funding and Investments in disadvantaged communities in eastern Coachella Valley.





Discretionary General Fund: Fiscal Discipline Recognized

Fitch Ratings upgraded the County's credit rating in May:

- General Government to AA from AA-
- Issuer Default Rating (IDR) to AA from AA-
- Pension Obligation Bonds (POBs) to AA from A+
- County Asset Leasing Corporation (CORAL) AA- from A+

"The upgrade ... primarily reflects the continued strong financial operations resulting in significantly improved reserves ... "The rating also incorporates a positive additional analytical factor notch recognizing the county's size, strength and stability and the importance of its large economy."

Post-Budget Adoption Action

Increased Investment in Inmate Health:

- health costs in the jails. Detention Health receives \$13.4 million for mental health costs in the jails. Both Correctional Health currently receives \$50.7 million in discretionary general fund revenue for medical departments will receive additional revenue (\$6.2 million) to offset increased labor costs, with future increases paid with discretionary general fund revenue.
 - The Medical Center will receive funding for the costs associated with providing inmate medical care (\$18.6 million) and will receive discretionary general fund for these expenses in future fiscal years.

Increased Investment in Indigent Medical Care:

- The Medical Center currently receives \$1.8 million in discretionary general fund revenue for the Medically Indigent Services Program.
- The Medical Center will receive additional support for this program in the amount of \$28 million and this cost will be funded in future fiscal years by discretionary revenue and adjusted as necessary.

Repayment of Waste Resources Loan to Medical Center

- The Medical Center received a \$28.9 million loan from Waste Resources in 2013.

The Medical Center will receive funding in the amount of \$14.8 million to pay the balance of the loan. Costs associated with Presidential Election:

- The Registrar of Voters will receive \$3 million in additional discretionary general fund revenue to support enhanced operations, security and other costs associated with the 2024 Presidential Election.

Pressures

Pressures

- State budget deficit will have impacts that we continue to analyze.
 - Federal budget agreements will likely remain a moving target.
- Long-term economic forecast is uncertain and difficult to predict definitively.
 - Labor negotiations and retention/recruitment review continues.
- Deferred and/or delayed maintenance projects must be addressed.
 - Visionary priority capital improvement projects becoming a reality.
 - Ever increasing demand for new and improved services.
 - Revenues beginning to flatten.


