BACKGROUND:

Summary

Between 2014 and 2020, 51 of 58 California counties and approximately 28 California cities filed lawsuits seeking to abate the opioid crisis. On July 21, 2021, the litigation resulted in a settlement from Johnson & Johnson of \$26 billion payable to the counties and cities who filed the lawsuit. The funding will be disbursed to the various entities over an eighteen-year period, of which no less than fifty percent will be used toward Opioid abatement.

On October 3, 2023 (M.O. 3.2), the Board approved a spending plan, which included these funds to be used to increase capacity and enhance existing programs within Behavioral Health with the purpose of supporting treatment of Opioid Use Disorder and any co-occurring Substance Use Disorder (SUD) or Mental Health issue(s). To date, \$15,921,223 has been received from the settlement.

Correctional Health Services (CHS) and Behavioral Health (BH), under the umbrella of the Riverside University Health System (RUHS), provides effective, efficient, and professional physical and mental health care and SUD treatment to adults and juveniles incarcerated in Riverside County. A portion of the Opioid Settlement funds will be used to enhance the existing Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for Correctional Health Services and Behavioral Health. The department is requesting \$3,307,910 for the enhanced MAT program.

As part of the MAT program, RUHS has also contracted with a vendor to provide methadone to clinically indicated patients in custody. The intended use of this medication is to stop and prevent withdrawal and reduce opioid cravings. The department will increase staffing by adding a Registered Nurse and Behavioral Health Specialist IV at existing detention sites for MAT services and oversight of mobile Opioid Treatment Program services to the Banning Detention Facility. The department is requesting \$321,000 for the enhanced MAT program.

Friday Night Live (FNL) is an existing program under the RUHS-BH Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Program offered to any school in the County that wishes to have a FNL chapter and activities on campus. FNL is a youth development program, designed for high-school youth to prevent alcohol and other drug use. As an extension of FNL, RUHS also offers Club Live (CL) directed toward middle school-aged students, FNL Kids, focusing on 4th through 6th grade youth, and FNL Mentoring, which co-engages middle and high school-aged students. The primary focus of the FNL Mentoring program is to form youth-adult partnerships with young

people, to provide programs rich in opportunities and support, so young people will be less likely to engage in problematic behaviors, more likely to achieve in school, and more likely to attend higher education or secure a full-time job. FNL's vision is to work hand-in-hand with young people so they are both problem free and fully prepared.

An entire FNL team is comprised of the following staff: (1) Administrative Services Assistant, (1) Behavioral Health Specialist IV, (3) Community Services Assistants, (4) Health Education Assistant II, (6) Health Education Assistant II, (1) Office Assistant III, (1) Program Coordinator I, (1) Program Coordinator II, (3) professional Student Interns. Funding from the Opioid Settlement will go toward expanding the FNL program to serve Mid and South County school districts. The department is requesting \$1,580,000 for this enhanced program.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

These services will provide treatment to some of the county's most vulnerable populations to help aide them on a road to recovery.

Additional Fiscal Information

RUHS is not requesting any general fund support at this time. Funding for the ongoing costs in future years is contingent upon available Opioid funding.

Schedule A

The requested budget adjustment will increase appropriation two within the Riverside University Health System Correctional Health Systems and Behavioral Health.
