**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The donation to Girls on the Run Riverside County (\$4,000.00) will support positive youth development for girls in third through eighth grade through mentorship and engaging group activities throughout Jurupa Valley.
2. The donation to the Eastvale Chamber of Commerce (\$2,500.00) will support the continued enhancement of the community by strengthening businesses and city living by promoting an environment for business retention, growth, and success.
3. The donation to Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, Post 10267 Jurupa (\$4,000.00) will support the preservation of the mission and history of the armed forces of the United States through services that give back to our military and community programs.
4. The donation to the Rotary Club of Jurupa Valley (\$4,000.00) will be used to provide scholarships to students as well as valuable services for those in need in the community.
5. The donation to the Riverside National Cemetery Support Committee (\$5,000.00) will be used to support assistance and maintenance of the Riverside National Cemetery through their annual event to celebrate liberty and freedom in the United States.
6. The donation to the Lake Elsinore Valley Chamber of Commerce (\$3,000.00) will be used to support engagement in various projects and services provided to local businesses including the Workforce Development Program, Business Support Services, and Community programs and outreach.

10. The donation to the American Legion Mira Loma Post 500 (\$4,000.00) will be used to resurface the parking lot and update the parking stalls with handicap markings to make it safe for members of the community to safely utilize the location.

The donation to the Corona Norco Unified School District Parent Center (\$5,000.00) will be used to support the Parent Center Heart Closet to provide clothing, toiletries, and food to families and students who are low-income and provide schools with tools, resources and professional development to engage with their parent community.
