**SUBJECT:** RIVERSIDE UNIVERSITY HEALTH SYSTEM - BEHAVIORAL HEALTH: Ratify and Approve an Increase to the Contract Aggregate for Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Services from \$70,000,000 to \$80,000,000 for FY 2023/2024, and Approve the Budget Adjustment for FY 2023/2024, All Districts. [Additional Cost of \$10,000,000 for FY 2023/2024, Up to \$8,000,000 in Additional Compensation, 89% Federal Funding, 11% State Funding] (4/5 Vote Required).

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Ratify and Approve an increase to the Contract Aggregate, for the vendors as listed in Attachment A, to provide Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Services, in the amount of \$10,000,000 for FY 2023/2024, from \$70,000,000 to \$80,000,000 for the term of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024;
2. Authorize the Purchasing Agent, in accordance with Ordinance No. 459, based upon the availability of funding and as approved by County Counsel to: a) issue a Purchase Order for goods and/or services rendered; b) move the allocated funds among the vendors listed in Attachment A while staying within the approved aggregate; and c) sign amendments that exercise the options of the Agreement including modifications of the statement of work that stay within the intent of the Agreement; and do not exceed the sum total of ten percent (10%) of the approved annual aggregate through June, 30, 2024; and
3. Approve and direct the Auditor Controller to make the budget adjustments as shown on Schedule A.

**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

Riverside University Health System – Behavioral Health (RUHS-BH) operates a continuum of care system that consists of County-operated and contracted service providers delivering a variety of Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) services within each geographic region of Riverside County.

The objective of RUHS-BH is to maximize services to consumers and to provide support to their families, and significant others, within the level of resources of the department. RUHS-BH provides care for those who meet medical necessity and are assessed as requiring treatment in a substance abuse recovery environment. Evidenced-based practices (EBP) and intensive case management are utilized and tailored to each target population as they move through their recovery process.

On February 1, 2017, RUHS-BH began participation in the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) 1115 Waiver. DMC-ODS is Medi-Cal's effort to expand, improve, and reorganize its system for treating people with a substance use disorder (SUD), offering more comprehensive services than the limited set of services provided under the standard Drug Medi-Cal program. DMC-ODS SAPT services include Outpatient, Intensive Outpatient, Residential, Perinatal Residential, Medication-Assisted Treatment, Opioid Treatment, Withdrawal Management, Care Coordination, Physician Consultation, and Recovery Services.

On January 1, 2022, the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) implemented reform across the Medi-Cal program via CalAIM, California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal. CalAIM seeks to transform health care for California's most vulnerable residents through an array of supports and services. RUHS-BH has been identified as a provider within the County of Riverside that can provide the required facilities, equipment, and personnel necessary to deliver CalAIM services. With the CalAIM rollout, RUHS-BH now has the ability to utilize subcontractors for services that were not previously billable through Medi-Cal. With County support, several RUHS-BH providers have opted-in to provide the following new levels of service effective July 1, 2022: Early Intervention, Peer Services, and Contingency Management.

On August 6, 2019 (Agenda Item #3.32), the Board approved a \$50,000,000 annual contract aggregate for SAPT services through June 30, 2022. On October 26, 2021 (Agenda Item

#3.18), the Board ratified and approved six additional agreements, also awarded as a result of competitive bid, which included new levels of SAPT services for FY 2021-2022 for a total of \$2,221,233 without increasing the SAPT contract aggregate.

On August 30, 2022 (Agenda Item #3.59), the Board ratified and approved an aggregate increase of \$10,000,000 for a new aggregate amount of \$60,000,000 for SAPT services for FY 2022-2023.

On June 27, 2023 (Agenda Item #3.73), the Board ratified and approved an aggregate increase of \$150,003 for FY 2022-2023 and approved an aggregate of \$70,000,000 for SAPT services for FY 2023-2024.

RUHS-BH has improved access to high-quality evidence-based care and increased the number of consumers receiving services countywide and expanding accessibility by adding new service-providing contractors and sites. Continuity of SAPT services for this most vulnerable population is crucial therefore, RUHS-BH is requesting that the Board of Supervisors ratify and approve an increase to the Contract Aggregate in the amount of \$10,000,000 for FY 2023-2024, from \$70,000,000 to \$80,000,000 through June 30, 2024.

**Impact on Citizens and Businesses**

These services are a component of Behavioral Health's system of care aimed at improving the health and safety of consumers and the community.

**Additional Fiscal Information**

RUHS-BH will utilize Federal and State funding for DMC-ODS Services. No additional County funds are required. Attachment A provides the maximum agreement amounts for each qualified contracted provider. All contracts include termination provisions in the event funding becomes unavailable.

**Contract History and Price Reasonableness**

On October 29, 2018, RUHS-BH in conjunction with Riverside County Purchasing released Request for Qualifications (RFQu) #MHARC-238 for DMC-ODS services. Notification was sent to 175 organizations to inform them of the funding opportunity. The RFQu was accessed and downloaded by 64 organizations, located on the Public Purchase website. Email notification was sent to 113 individuals who were on the RUHS-BH SAPT DMC Bidders list. The RFQu closed on January 15, 2019, and 17 qualification packages were received. The Evaluation Committee recommended 14 bidders be awarded a contract for DMC-ODS services. The rates proposed by the chosen contractors were deemed reasonable and competitive by the RFQu Evaluation Committee based upon average industry costs and the nature of the services being provided for each of the proposed levels of care.

On September 21, 2020, RUHS-BH in conjunction with Riverside County Purchasing released RFQu #MHARC-261 for DMC-ODS services. Notification was sent to 225 organizations to inform them of the funding opportunity. The RFQu was accessed and downloaded by 62

organizations, located on the Public Purchase website. Email notification was sent out to 128 individuals on the RUHS-BH SAPT-DMC Bidders list. The RFQu closed on December 3, 2020, and nine qualification packages were received. The Evaluation Committee recommended all nine bidders be awarded a contract for DMC-ODS services. The recommended bidders include three existing contractors increasing services and six new contractors. The rates proposed by each of the contractors were deemed reasonable and competitive by the RFQu Evaluation Committee based upon average industry costs and the nature of the services being provided for each of the proposed levels of care.

One-year contract extension for the current Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) providers to prevent a gap in services until awards can be made under the new Request for Qualifications (RFQu) for these services. DMC services include Outpatient, Intensive Outpatient, Residential, Perinatal Residential, Medication for Addiction Treatment, Opioid Treatment, Withdrawal Management, Care Coordination, Clinician Consultation, Recovery Services, Early Intervention, Peer Support Services, and Contingency Management.

6. **Unique features of the supply/service being requested from this supplier.**

The requested contractors have been individually evaluated via a formal bid process within the last four years for qualifications to provide specific levels of care within the Drug Medi-Cal System. Certification with the Department of Health Care Services is a requirement of these providers, and these providers have been vetted for these appropriate certifications for these mandated services. Proposed contractors provide services spanning across all regions of the County and have existing experience with County referrals and systems as well as consumer relationships. These DMC services are needed to meet the needs of Riverside County consumers.

7. **Reasons why my department requires these unique features from the vendor and what benefit will accrue to the county:**

The new RFQu #MHARC-286 for the SAPT-DMC services was released on April 6, 2023. However, due to the complexity of these services, it is anticipated that an award will not be made until the end of FY 23/24. Utilizing existing contractors would provide crucial continuity of substance abuse prevention and treatment services for this most vulnerable population.


