#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### Summary

The Agricultural Commissioner's Office performs regulatory inspection and outreach services within Riverside County through grants and contracts administered by the California Department of Food and Agriculture and the California Department of Pesticide Regulation. This fiscal year, the department had the opportunity to increase service with work performed in an additional contract, resulting in increased revenue in the amount of \$200,981.

The anticipated revenue is delayed due to the current model of contract invoicing and payment by the California Department of Food and Agriculture. Each program invoice must be created and submitted "no later than 30 days after the end of the coinciding reporting period."

This revenue will be used to cover employees' salaries and benefits that were increased due to provisions in the newly negotiated Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the Service Employees International Union (SEIU), Local 721, that resulted in an additional salary increase. This increase was then applied to both Laborers' International Union of North America (LIUNA), Local 777, employees and the Exempt Management, Management, and other Unrepresented employees. This impacted the Agricultural Commissioner's office in Fiscal Year 2023/2024. The result of the increases in salaries for all represented and unrepresented employees within the department was a net shortfall of \$179,028. Since these costs were negotiated with the labor unions, the department was obligated to absorb the expense.

Furthermore, a portion of the funding will be used to cover fleet expenses, as the department's costs for the maintenance and service of vehicles lead to increasing expenditures.

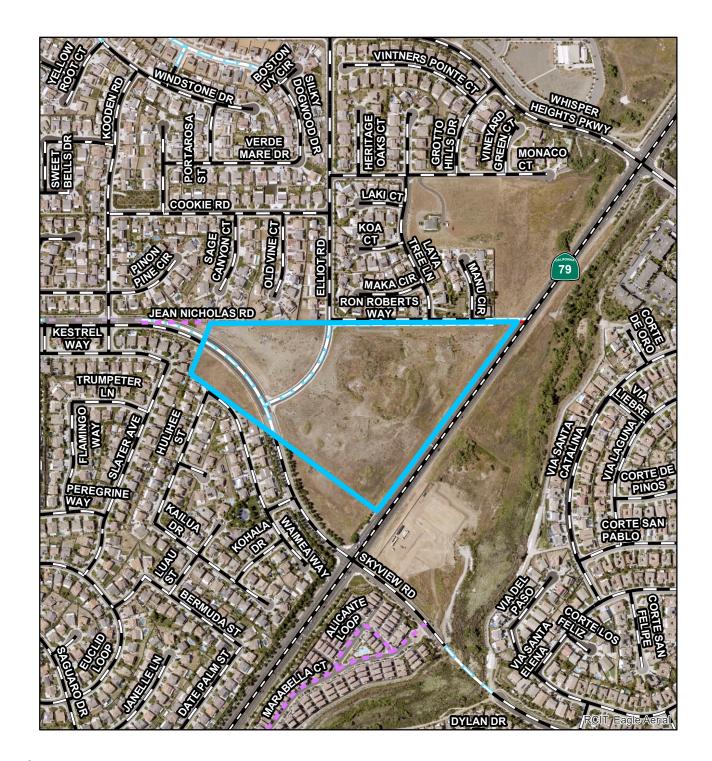
