**BACKGROUND:**

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Rotary Club of Murrieta, Foundation-** \$5,000- The funds will be used to support the Field of Honor event. An event that honors those who have died in military service.
  
2. **Hemet San Jacinto Community Health Foundation-**\$2,500- This allocation will support the Heart Alliance Program, a program that seeks to reduce cardiac arrest death by training volunteers to administer CPR and creating a group of community responders.
