BACKGROUND:

Summary

Ordinance No. 458 establishes policies, procedures, and standards for regulating development in designated special flood hazard zone areas and implements the provisions of the NFIP within the unincorporated areas of the County of Riverside ("County"). The NFIP is administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and makes federally backed flood insurance available to homeowners, renters and business owners in participating communities. The Ordinance also designates the Director of the Department of Building and Safety for the to administer, coordinate, implement and enforce the ordinance by granting or denying development permits in accord with its provisions.

If the Ordinance amendment is Initiated, TLMA, County Counsel and the District will coordinate to prepare, process, and implement the amendment to the Ordinance.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

By updating the Ordinance, residents and businesses will be better protected and informed about existing flood and erosion hazards.

<u>Additional Fiscal Information</u>

There are minimal administrative costs limited to staff time and the necessary processing of documents associated with amending the Ordinance. There is adequate departmental funding for this activity. No General Fund dollars are allocated for this effort.
