#### **Election Update**

The ROV leadership team has met and will continue to meet critical deadlines per Election Code and Law to successfully conduct the November 5, 2024, Consolidated General Election.

#### Vote By Mail Ballots

September 20: Military and Overseas Ballots were mailed.

#### Voter Information Guide (English/Spanish)

- September 16-20: The California Secretary of State mailed guides.
- September 26: The County Voter Information Guide, English version, was mailed starting September 26<sup>th</sup>. The Spanish version was mailed starting September 28<sup>th</sup>.

## Public Logic and Accuracy Testing

 October 4: ROV conducted and tested all components of the voting system to ensure accuracy. The public and media were invited to observe.

#### Vote by Mail Ballots

October 7: Ballots mailed to over 1.34 million registered voters.

## Early Voting (Several Dates)

Registrar of Voters office was open to the public for in-person voting beginning October 7<sup>th</sup>. ROV will be open on the following weekends from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. for in-person voting October 25-26 and November 2-3. Alternatively, voters may drop off their voted ballots in one of two secure drop boxes outside of the ROV office available 24 hours a day/7days a week.

 October 23: ROV will be conducting a Media Tour which will be open to members of the media.

   A total of 19 Vote Centers will operate throughout the County.
- November 2-November 5: 4-day Vote Centers
   A total of 150 Vote Center locations will operate throughout the County.
