#### BACKGROUND:

On November 17, 2020, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors (Board) directed the Executive Office to implement an Unincorporated Communities Initiative (UCI). The UCI is a focused, ongoing, and coordinated effort to improve the infrastructure and services provided to the residents of unincorporated communities, with emphasis on Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs). The UCI receives authorized General Fund/Net County Cost (NCC) monies from the County during the annual budget and quarterly budget revision process.

On December 15, 2020, the Executive Office presented a proposed framework for planning and implementation of the UCI. With the support of the Board, the Executive Office established a team of staff and department heads to facilitate the UCI program. Through March 31, 2021, the Executive Office team held 15 community meetings and conducted online surveys to better understand community needs for services, infrastructure, and infrastructure maintenance. On May 25, 2021, the UCI Team presented the needs assessment to the Board.

On June 27, 2023, the Board adopted the FY23/24 Budget, which included the allocation of \$10,000,000 in NCC General Funds to the Unincorporated Communities Initiative. The \$10,000,000 was to be divided evenly between the five Supervisorial Districts for each Supervisor's use within their unincorporated communities.

Based on the foundational work completed by the UCI Team and further analysis by this office, \$17,000 of the remaining available UCI funding for the Fourth District will be allocated to the following project:

• \$17,000 to the Coachella Valley Volunteers in Medicine (VIM) to assist with interior repairs at their Indio Medical Center located at 82915 Avenue 48, Indio CA.

Coachella Valley VIM is the only free healthcare center providing healthcare to medically underserved Coachella Valley adult residents. Coachella Valley VIM is a member of Volunteers in Medicine, a national nonprofit alliance with more than 90 free clinics across the U.S. The Indio Medical Center services all Coachella Valley residents, including residents of unincorporated Riverside County.

## Impact on Residents and Businesses

The Coachella Valley VIM is proposing to complete repairs to their Indio Medical Office located at 82915 Avenue 48, Indio CA. The repairs include the installation of two interior walls, installation of two interior doors and door frames, and the painting of interior walls and ceilings. The need to maintain a clean and suitable office is critical for the health and safety of its patients and personnel.
