BACKGROUND:

Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Sheriff's Special Events** - \$2,500- The funding will be used to support the Heroes Among Us Annual Awards Ceremony. A ceremony that honors officers and community members for their courageous and humanitarian acts of service throughout the county.
2. **Riverside Area Rape Crisis Center** -\$2,500- This allocation will support the RARCC 43rd Annual Dinner and Auction Gala, an event that raises funds to provide victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, and child abuse with mental health care and supportive services.
3. **Santa Rosa Plateau Foundation, Inc. DBA The Nature Education Foundation**-\$10,000- The funding will be used to support the Promoting Environmental Protection Through Education (PEPE) program. PEPE educates students in grades 3-12 about climate change and habitat loss, by allowing the student to study specific habitat areas in the Santa Rosa Plateau and providing them supplies such as journals, clipboards, round trip transportation to and from the fieldwork sites, and iPad for recordation of data.
4. **Boys & Girls Club of Southwest County**- \$1,750- The funds will be used to support the 2024 Our Kids Rock Gala & Auction, an event that raises funds to provide mentorship and afterschool programs for youth in need.
5. **Student of the Month Program**-\$550- This allocation will support Menifee Student of the Month Program, by providing scholarships to high school seniors.
6. **Voices for Children**-\$10,000- The funds will be used to support the CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) Program, which provides children in foster care with caring adult volunteers, who advocate for their best interests.
7. **Riverside County Foundation on Aging**-\$5,000- The funds will be used to support the Riverside County Office on Aging Material Aid Program, which serves senior residents in District 3 with home repair, prescription costs, utility bills, etc.
8. **Thessalonika Family Services DBA Rancho Damacitas and Community Mission of Hope**- \$10,000- The funding will be utilized to support the Empowerment Village Housing Program. This program assists at-risk struggling single mothers and their children.
9. **Western Eagle Foundation**-\$10,000- The funds will be used to provide emergency food bags for low to moderate-income Third District recipients.

10. **Brighton Hill Academy Sports and Learning Center DBA First Tee-Inland Empire-** \$2,500- Funds will be used to support the First Tee Inland Empire Junior Golf Program, a program that provides golfing equipment and classes to low-income youth ages 5-17.
11. **Family Services Association-** \$4,000- Funds will be used to support the HOPE for the Holidays program, a program that provides foster care children with essential items such as clothing and hygiene products.
12. **Feeding America Riverside and San Bernardino Counties-**\$10,000-This allocation will be used to provide holiday meals to food-insecure individuals and families within the third district.
13. **Women Organizing Women, Inc.-**\$11,500- This allocation will support the Lydia Project Women Outreach 2024, a project that provides culinary arts training to underprivileged women, at-risk youth, and adults with disabilities.
14. **Treasure Box Angels-**\$2,500-The funding will be used to support the 2024 Christmas Wish Tree program, a program that provides Christmas dinner to individuals and their families who are undergoing oncology treatment.
15. **Lead Your Ship Ministries Inc. -** \$1,000- The funds will be used to provide pregnant women in Alternative to Domestic Violence Shelters with essential items for themselves and their infants.
16. **Freedom Writers Foundation-**\$5,000- The funds will be used to bring the Freedom Writers Dairy program to the Dorthy McElhinney Middle School.
17. **Valley Resource Center DBA EXCEED-**\$5,000-The funds will be used to support the Art in the Park-Murrieta program, this program will provide adults with disabilities with a nurturing and inclusive environment where they can explore their creativity and develop their artistic skills.
