BACKGROUND:

Summary

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 into law. Riverside County's share of the American Rescue Plan funding is \$479,874,599, of which the first installment of \$239,937,299 was received on May 10, 2021, and the second installment in the same amount was received on June 6, 2022. The funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026.

On October 4, 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved the Second ARPA installment funding which allocated \$33 million per district for projects that include infrastructure, homelessness, workforce development, business revitalization, and other needs for the County.

The Kabian Park Improvements Project (PKARC-271) opened bids on July 9, 2024, and four bids were received. The Board of Supervisors approved the construction contract on August 27, 2024, by Minute Order 13.4.

The Santa Ana River Trail Wayfinding Signage Program Project (PKARC-274) opened bids on August 5, 2024, and three bids were received. The Board of Supervisors approved the construction contract on September 10, 2024, by Minute Order 13.3.

Included in this agenda item is a comprehensive budget for both projects. The budgets include costs associated with the following: planning, specification, and estimates (PS&E), staff costs for project administration, construction, construction allowance, and inspections. No additional funding is being requested or allocated.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Both projects aim to enhance the quality of life for Riverside County residents by ensuring clean, safe, and equitable outdoor recreational opportunities. It will also strengthen RivCoParks by prioritizing strategic investments that promote alternative transportation methods, economic growth, and resilience. To achieve these goals, RivCoParks will need to fully close Kabian Park for approximately nine months, starting in September 2024. This closure will temporarily restrict access to the park. The Santa Ana River Trail will remain open during construction.

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Additional Fiscal Information

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in the amount of \$1,000,000 were allocated to the Santa Ana River Trail (SART) Wayfinding Signage Program Project on May 23, 2023, by Minute Order 13.1. However, due to cost savings, the total project cost is below \$1,000,000 and \$58,594 will be reallocated towards the Hidden Valley Nature Center Modernization Project via a separate Minute Order. ARPA funds in the amount of \$1,300,000 were allocated to the Kabian Park Improvements Project on July 11, 2023, by Minute Order 3.1. Additionally, on August 27, 2024, the Board of Supervisors approved an additional ARPA allocation of funds in the amount of \$731,383 from the First District's Second ARPA allocation to bridge the gap in the Kabian Park Improvements Project. Overall, the SART Wayfinding Signage Program Project has a budget of \$941,406, and the Kabian Park Improvements Project has a budget of \$2,030,000. These revised budgets include the costs for Planning, Specifications, & Estimates (PS&E), Administrative Costs, Construction, Contingency, and Inspection.
