BACKGROUND:

Summary

On September 17, 2024 (Minute Order 3.17), the Board of Supervisors approved and authorized the Director of Housing and Workforce Solutions or designee to implement the S.O.N.G. (Sparking Originality in New Generations) Camp Program including authority to execute the Professional Services Agreement that has been approved to form by County Counsel for an aggregate program funding amount of \$148,400.

Riverside County Housing and Workforce Solutions/Workforce Development Division (HWS/WDD) has partnered with Andy Vargas Foundation to implement the S.O.N.G. (Sparking Originality in New Generations) Camp Program per Agreement #WDARC-PSA-0003845 on September 17, 2024, through December 31, 2026. The central objective of the S.O.N.G. (Sparking Originality in New Generations) Camp Program is to empower and harness the raw, untapped musical potential of young underserved high school youth, in District 5 by offering music education and mentorship through a focused six-week program specifically designed to expose these youth to: teamwork skills, resilience, self-expression, and hands-on training on songwriting, music production, recording, performance skills, and to create a career pathway

into the music industry. An estimated 72 individual youth will benefit from this program throughout District 5. Youth will be provided with a venue, scholarships, transportation, electronic and music equipment and supplies to enable participants to fully participate in program activities.

With Board approval, this item will allow Contactor to hire essential staff for the effective operation of the program and allow HWS/WDD staff to administer the program for FY 24/25 through FY 25/26.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

On October 4, 2022 (Minute Order 3.44), the Board of Supervisors approved the distribution of the 2nd installment allocation of ARPA funding.

On June 11, 2024 (Minute Order 3.5), the Board of Supervisors obligated \$148,400 from the 2nd installment of ARPA funding to the Department of Housing and Workforce Solutions/Workforce Development Division (HWS/WDD) for the implementation of the S.O.N.G. (Sparking Originality in New Generations) Camp Program in the fifth supervisorial district.

On September 17, 2024 (Minute Order 3.17), the Board of Supervisors approved and authorized the Director of Housing and Workforce Solutions or designee to implement the S.O.N.G. (Sparking Originality in New Generations) Camp Program including authority to execute the Professional Services Agreement that has been approved to form by County Counsel.

Additional Fiscal Information

The proposed full cost of this program for all designated fiscal years is \$339,600. The funding source is strictly ARPA funds.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR THE S.ON.G. (SPARKING ORIGINALITY IN NEW GENERATIONS) CAMP PROGRAM By and Between COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE And ANDY VARGAS FOUNDATION

This First Amendment to the Professional Service Agreement for S.O.N.G. (Sparking Originality in New Generations) Camp Program is entered into by and between COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, a political subdivision of the State of California, by and through its Department of Housing and Workforce Solutions/ Workforce Development Division ("County") and Andy Vargas Foundation, a California non-profit corporation, ("Contractor"). Contractor and the County are individually referred to herein as a "Party" and together as the "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors on September 17, 2024, pursuant to Minute Order 3.17 approved the Professional Services Agreement (Agreement) with Andy Vargas Foundation, and approved allocation amount of \$148,400 of Fifth District American Rescue Plan Act Funds (ARPA) to implement the Agreement;

WHEREAS, the COUNTY entered into that certain Professional Service Agreement with Andy Vargas Foundation effective September 17, 2024. Contract ID #WDARC-PSA-0003845, whereby County agreed to provide ARPA funding in the amount of \$148,400 to Contractor;

WHEREAS, the COUNTY issued an advance payment in the amount of \$37,100 to Contractor on October 16, 2024 for initial operating costs;

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to amend Agreement to increase funding by \$163,200 for a new total amount of ARPA funding in the amount of \$311,600 to allow CONTRACTOR to include essential staff for the effective operation of the program and amend Exhibit A Description and Scope of Services and Exhibit B Program Budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the promises and mutual covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth, the Parties hereby do agree as follows:

- 1. Recitals The recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. <u>Compensation</u> Section 3.1 of the Agreement is hereby deleted in its entirety as amended as follows: The COUNTY shall pay the CONTRACTOR for services performed, products provided, and expenses incurred for the Scope of Services as defined in Amended Exhibit A, pursuant to the Program Budget set forth in Amended Exhibit B. Maximum payments by COUNTY to CONTRACTOR shall not exceed \$311,600 for the duration of the contract term, including all expenses. The COUNTY is not responsible for any fees or costs incurred above or beyond the contracted amount

- and shall have no obligation to purchase any specified number of services or products, unless agreed to by the COUNTY in writing.
- 3. <u>Sexual Abuse or Molestation (SAM) Liability.</u> Section 23.1.E of the Agreement is hereby deleted in its entirety as amended as follows: If the work will include contact with minors, and the Commercial General Liability policy is not endorsed to include affirmative coverage for sexual abuse or molestation, Vendor/Contractor shall obtain and maintain a policy covering Sexual Abuse and Molestation with a limit no less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence or claim. The Policy shall name the COUNTY as Additional Insured.
- 4. Exhibit A-Description and Scope of Services. Exhibit A of the Agreement is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the "Amended Exhibit A Description and Scope of Services" attached hereto and incorporated by reference.
- 5. Exhibit B-Program Budget. Exhibit B of the Agreement is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the "Amended Exhibit B Program Budget" attached hereto and incorporated by reference.
- 6. <u>First Amendment to Prevail.</u> The provisions of this First Amendment shall prevail over any inconsistency or conflicting provisions of the Agreement.
 - <u>Effective Date.</u> This First Amendment to the Agreement is effective upon the date signed by both Parties which is determined by last date signed.
- 7. Entire Understanding. The First Amendment and the Agreement set forth and contain the entire understanding and agreement of the Parties hereto. There are no oral or written representations, understandings, or ancillary covenants, undertakings, or agreements, which are not contained or expressly referred to within this First Amendment and the Agreement.
- 8. <u>Further Assurances.</u> The Parties agree to execute such other documents and to take such other actions as may be reasonably necessary to further the purposes of this First Amendment.
- Agreement in Full Force and Effect. Except as otherwise expressly modified herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
- 10. USE OF ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES: This Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which will be an original, but all of which together will constitute one instrument. Each party of this Amendment agrees to the use of electronic or digital signatures that meet the requirements of the California Uniform Electronic Transactions Act ("the Act") Cal. Civ. Code §§ 1633.1-1633.17), for executing this Amendment. The parties further agree that the electronic or digital signatures of the parties included in this Amendment are intended to authenticate this writing and to have the same force and effect as manual signatures. The Act authorizes use of an electronic signature for transactions and contracts among parties in California, including governmental agencies. For purposes of this section, a digital signature is a type of "electronic signature" as defined in subdivision (i) of Section 1633.2 of the Civil Code.


Description and Scope of Services

- CONTRACTOR agrees to provide outreach, recruitment, hands on songwriting, music production, recording, performance skills from industry experts, and other services necessary to youth for the S.O.N.G. Camp Program in the following service area.
 - Riverside County Supervisorial District 5 of the County of Riverside including the cities of Moreno Valley, Hemet, San Jacinto, Calimesa, Beaumont, and Banning.
- 2. CONTRACTOR must conduct eligibility and suitability assessment with individual youth recruited based on the following criteria:
 - a. In school High School youth between the ages of 14-18, residing within District 5.
- CONTRACTOR will partner with local school districts and other community organizations within the service area to implement an integrated and seamless service delivery process for youth enrolled in the S.O.N.G. Camp Program.
- 4. CONTRACTOR must use all reasonable endeavors to conduct outreach, recruit, and identify a minimum of 72 eligible youth for the S.O.N.G. Camp Program residing within supervisorial district 5. Youth must remain enrolled in secondary education, within the period of performance from September 17, 2024, through December 31, 2026.
- 5. CONTRACTOR is responsible for providing a venue, outreach, transportation, scholarships, electronic and music equipment and supplies to enable participants to fully participate in program activities.
- CONTRACTOR is responsible for awarding a total of twelve (\$2,000) scholarships to six high school
 graduates during the FY 24/25 and to six high school graduates during the FY 25/26 periods. These
 scholarships are for students who enroll in higher education/vocational training post high school.
- 7. CONTRACTOR must maintain accurate and up-to-date records throughout the term of this contract. Such records shall include, but are not limited to, financial records (budgets, receipts, expenditure reports, financial statements), personnel records (employee documentation, timesheets, contracts), participant records (enrollment forms, attendance records, progress reports), program documentation (activity reports, evaluation reports), compliance documentation (ARPA compliance reports, monitoring records) and provide reports detailing program activities, expenditures, outcomes, and compliance status to HWS/WDD and Board of Supervisors, as required, on a timely basis.
- 8. The CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all safety, legal, and regulatory requirements related to the

transportation of minors. The CONTRACTOR is responsible for providing transportation services for minors and must ensure that all drivers involved have a valid and current driver's license appropriate for the type of vehicle used. Additionally, the CONTRACTOR must ensure that all drivers maintain a clean driving record with no major violations, DUIs, or license suspensions. The CONTRACTOR is also required to maintain valid automobile insurance with coverage that meets or exceeds state requirements for any vehicle used to transport minors. Failure to meet these requirements may result in the suspension or termination of services.

AMENDED EXHIBIT B Amended Program Budget

- COUNTY agrees to reimburse CONTRACTOR based on a pay-for-performance model each month during Period of Performance as defined in Paragraph 2.1. The COUNTY shall pay the CONTRACTOR for services performed, products provided, and expenses incurred as outlined in Exhibit A – Scope of Work.
- CONTRACTOR shall be paid only in accordance with an invoice submitted to COUNTY by CONTRACTOR
 within fifteen (15) days from the last day of each calendar month, CONTRACTOR agrees to include as
 applicable: outreach and resources provided or other outlined expenses per line item as defined in
 Exhibit B Section II.
- 3. CONTRACTOR understands that COUNTY can submit requests for additional supporting information for invoices with formal notice given to CONTRACTOR of at least 10 business days.
- 4. CONTRACTOR must ensure scope of work and performance metrics, as defined in Amended Exhibit A, are fully executed within the allotted program compensation amount as defined in Paragraph 3.1 and outlined in Amended Exhibit B, Section II of this agreement.
- CONTRACTOR understands that budgeting and expenditure of program funds must be conducted on a timely basis at <u>least 1 month prior</u> to program term completion unless formal notice of program extension is presented by the COUNTY.
- 6. CONTRACTOR understands that COUNTY can make additional requests of information necessary for program implementation with formal notice given to CONTRACTOR of at least 10 business days. Information may include but not in not limited to; budget modifications, marketing information, supplemental data collection, supplemental documents, supplemental reports, supplemental invoice information.
- 7. COUNTY issued CONTRACTOR a one-time twenty-five percent (25%) advance payment of the program budget, in the amount of \$37,100 to begin implementation of program and cover initial expenses as determined by CONTRACTOR. The advance will be recouped from the full amount of each monthly invoice that is submitted. No additional payments will be made until the advance is completely recouped.
