BACKGROUND:

Summary 3 1

The D5 Furry Pets Foster Care program will provide approved county residents with a stipend of \$25 per night for fostering pets in need or up to \$50 per night if residents foster a pair of dogs or cats or a litter of puppies or kittens from the San Jacinto Valley Animal Campus. Approved county residents will be provided basic supplies to foster pets as well.

Residents must complete a sign up and approval process to enroll in the program. The sign up and approval process can be done in person or online and is available in English and Spanish.

Residents can foster for up to 21 days and fosters are encouraged to serve as adoption ambassadors to help their foster pets find their new homes. During the three weeks, foster parents will be asked to seek adoption placement for the animals in their care. This could include posting pictures and information on social media sites, introducing foster pets to friends and family interested in adoption, or taking them to pet friendly locations in the community. If a foster can get their foster pet adopted into a new home within two weeks or less, a \$150 bonus will be given.

If a potential adopter wants to adopt a foster pet, Animal Services will complete the adoption process for the adopter at no charge. After the three weeks, if an adopter is not found, the foster parent can choose to adopt the pet(s) at no charge or return them to the animal shelter. Adoption paperwork can be completed in person or online.

The D5 Furry Pets Foster Care program's aims to achieve the following goals: increase adoptions and help pets in District 5 find homes, reduce the number of pets housed in kennels in the shelter each night to allow other stray animals to get the help they need, and lastly, prevent euthanasia of adoptable pets by finding temporary placements for these animals.

To participate in the D5 Furry Pets Foster Care Program individuals must: choose a pet from the San Jacinto Valley Animal Campus, complete the Animal Services' sign-up form (available online), watch a brief orientation video- this can be done from home and be 18 years or older.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

This program supports the Department of Animal Services mission "Working Together to Improve Riverside County for People and Animals," and increases the department's efforts to help move pets from shelters into stable, forever homes.

The program will benefit citizens and animals by providing a toolkit and supplies for foster parents to use to help promote foster pets. It also aims to assist in managing/addressing the pet population and encouraging county residents to foster and adopt pets.
