- 3. Authorize the Emergency Management Department to administer the grant including pass-through funds awarded to the OA.

BACKGROUND:

Summary 5 1 1

The purpose of the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) program is to support comprehensive emergency management at the State, Tribal and local levels, and to encourage the improvement of mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery capabilities for all hazards. Funding from this grant is available to all jurisdictions through the Operational Area. As defined in Riverside County Ordinance No. 533 (as amended through 533.7), "Operational Area Level' means an intermediate level of the state emergency services organization, consisting of a county and all political subdivisions within the county area". The FY 2024 EMPG Program's allowable costs support efforts to build and sustain core capabilities across the Prevention, Protection, Mitigation, Response, and Recovery mission areas. All projects enhance and sustain Emergency Management Operations through the provision of equipment, personnel for the cities' emergency response operations and emergency operation centers and provide training for emergency management personnel. All matching funds are the responsibility of the awarded agency or jurisdiction.

The amount applied for has been pre-determined by CalOES through a funding formula which considers both a base and the county population. On August 30, 2024, CalOES awarded the Riverside County Operational Area the FY 2024 EMPG subaward in the amount of \$548,711. As the lead agency, EMD will retain funding to administer the grant and the remaining will be distributed among the cities throughout Riverside County through an application and selection process.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

EMPG funds are used to sustain capabilities for the county-wide Emergency Management Program. EMD participates in many of the residents and provides emergency management training and information. One such training is the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program, which teaches residents to be self-sustaining and have the ability to help their neighbor during a catastrophic incident. These trainings are offered on a regular basis and throughout the county.

Additional Fiscal Information

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The EMPG grant is a federally funded dollar-for-dollar local cash or in-kind match. Each agency that is awarded funding is responsible for providing the dollar-for-dollar cash or in-kind match requirement. The dollar-for-dollar match portion of funding dedicated to the EMD will be derived from Emergency Services Coordinators' regular salaries as budgeted in the FY24/25 approved budget.

The OA uses the same type of formula as the state in order to pass funding through to participating cities and the OA accordingly. All cities are invited to participate in this grant program. The match for this pass-through amount will come from 100% City funds.

SUBJECT: Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)

Dear Ramon Leon:

In California, EMPG funding supports response capabilities, emergency operations centers, mutual aid agreements, public outreach campaigns, and community alert and warning notification systems. These funds are allocated yearly to all counties and tribal nations to support these very important efforts. EMPG, together with California's dollar-for-dollar funding match, has supported vital state and local initiatives to protect all Californians.

On April 16, 2024, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security released the FY 2024 EMPG Notice of Funding Opportunity. California was allocated \$24,465,792, a decrease of \$2,876,287 from the FY 2023 EMPG allocation of \$27,342,079.

The EMPG is a critical grant program that enables state, local, and tribal governments to prepare for all hazards. Historically, the annual EMPG funding is allocated between Cal OES for statewide initiatives and Operational Area objectives. To address the 11.8 percent FY 2024 decrease, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) will take a larger portion of the overall funding decrease. Cal OES's allocation will decrease by \$1,876,287 and the allocations for Operational Areas will decrease by \$1,876,287 and the allocations for Operational Areas will decrease by \$1 million. The enclosed chart delineates the FY 2024 EMPG allocation to Operational Areas, with a comparison to the FY 2023 allocation.

Thank you for your continued cooperation and support. Through our collective efforts, we can build towards a safer and resilient California.
