**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary**

In addition to establishing fees and penalties, Ordinance No. 779, **Attachment A**, includes the basis for operating regulations that include waste inspection, salvaging and safety. To verify that the current refuse rates are appropriate to offset expenses, the Department prudently reviews its operations annually and forecasts capital improvements, expansion projects, and future expenses and liabilities with a projection of 20 years. Since revenue from in-county tonnage delivered to the landfills represents the majority of the Enterprise Fund's total revenue, it is important to accurately project future tonnage growth or decline. Due to stricter regulatory compliance aimed at increasing landfill diversion to 75%, the Department expects no tonnage growth in the coming years.

In FY 2024/2025, the Department opted out of the annual CPI increase and instead commissioned a rate study that evaluated the current tipping fees charged by the County's landfill system and the need for annual rate adjustments based on CPI. The study, prepared by MSW Consultants, Inc., found that the current tipping fees are not adequate to meet the Department's present and future financial obligations, and that the Department should continue its practice of adjusting its landfill tipping fees each year based on the CPI in order to generate enough revenue to cover annual operating and capital expenditures, as well as post closure and legacy sites liabilities, and maintain an adequate net operating cash reserve balance.

The Department's operating costs have increased significantly due to inflation and other market factors, including increases in capital improvement projects, salary increases, stricter regulatory compliance requirements, increased fuel costs, permitting fees and heavy equipment costs. Another key financial factor is the annual cost for the County for disposing approximately 40% of its waste at the El Sobrante landfill, adjusted by 90% of the CPI each year.

Even without projected tonnage growth, the Department anticipates an increase in traffic volume will continue to rise as residential customers take advantage of the County's low disposal rates and home development continues to encroach closer to landfills.

Based on the above reasons and the findings of the Rate Study, the Department proposes an increase in landfill disposal fees by the percentage change in the CPI for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario index, calculated over the 12-month period ending January 2024. This adjustment, set at 2.88%, will take effect starting July 1, 2025. This delay allows the Department



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to align the fee increase with the budget already approved by the Board of Supervisors in 2024, as the 2025 budget approval is not expected until June 2025. The proposed rates are summarized below. Additionally, long-term contractual Waste Delivery Agreements, which handle approximately 70% of the in-county waste stream, will be adjusted according to the terms in the contracts, details of which are available in **Attachment B – Contracted Rates**. It's worth noting that even with these changes, the Department's proposed non-contract rates (per ton rate and flat rate fees) remain lower than those of neighboring counties, as shown in **Attachment C – Landfill Rate Comparison**.

The Department continues to operate a composting facility at the Lamb Canyon landfill and has plans to start a composting facility at the Badlands Landfill. The composting process requires a continuous supply of clean green material to feed the compost pile. The Department will continue to provide a discounted rate of \$15.00 per ton for processed ground material from approved commercial haulers. Receiving green material that has already been processed provides a cost savings to the Department in labor and equipment costs.

The Department operates the Idyllwild Grinding Facility (IGF) primarily to address bark beetle infestation and fire control. Green/woody waste disposal at IGF costs the Department \$110.26 per ton, yet the current rate is only \$35.30 per ton. Instead of closing the facility, the Department proposes aligning the rate with the disposal cost by increasing the fees by \$25.00 per ton over the next three years. In this regard, the Department coordinated directly with the three main contractors who handle 95% of the tonnage at IGF. These contractors service Southern California Edison, the State of California (CalFire & CalTrans), and Riverside County (RCParks), which are their primary customers. Through discussions with these contractors, the Department ensured that the proposed rate increase is understood and that a gradual cost increase is preferred over closing the facility.

Notice of the public hearing was published in the Desert Sun and Press Enterprise. Upon conclusion of the Public Hearing, the Department will bring the rate request back to the Board for consideration in February or March 2025.

**California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Findings**

The proposed rate increase (Project) has been reviewed and determined to be exempt from CEQA under CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) and Section 15273 (Rates, Tolls, Fares,



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and Charges). The proposed rate increase is for the purpose of meeting operating expenses, and a Notice of Exemption will be filed with the County Clerk and the State Clearinghouse upon Board approval of the Project.

**Impact on Residents and Businesses**

Waste Disposal Fees are reviewed annually, and are subject to CPI adjustment which, for this period, is 2.88%. Fee increases are needed in order to offset impacts due to inflationary factors while meeting the need for capital improvements, expansion projects at County landfills, equipment purchases, increasing program expenses which allow for the continued protection of the general public health and welfare by efficient management of Riverside County's solid waste system. The proposed Waste Disposal Fees charged under Ordinance No. 779.25 continue to be the lowest in the Southern California region, and the Department does not anticipate an increase in illegal dumping as a result of these fee increases.

**REASONS FOR EXEMPTION:**

**Section 15061(b)(3) - General Rule Exemption**

The activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA.

**This project is exempt under Section 15061(b)(3) because:**

The Project proposes to increase landfill disposal fees by the percentage change in CPI for the Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario index for the 12-month period ending January 2024. The percentage change in CPI is calculated to be 2.88%. The Project proposes to increase landfill disposal fees/rates consistent with the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for certain solid waste streams. Direct haul/non-contracted rate for routine refuse, for example, is proposed to increase from the current \$49.75 per ton to \$51.18 per ton.

The Project also proposes to establish flat rate fees for three different vehicle types and implement other fee structural changes. Changes in the fee structure would not have an effect on environmental resources. Additionally, existing long-term contractual Waste Delivery Agreements, which represent approximately 70% of the total in-county waste stream, will be adjusted.

Based upon the entire record, the Project would not result in the potential for any significant effect on the environment. This determination is an issue of fact and sufficient evidence exists in the record that the activity will not have a significant effect on the environment. As such, the exemption applies and no further evaluation under CEQA is required. See *Muzzy Ranch Co. v. Solano County Airport Land Use Comm'n* (2007) 41 Cal. 4<sup>th</sup> 372.

**Section 15273. Rates, Tolls, Fares, and Charges**

CEQA does not apply to the establishment, modification, structuring, restructuring, or approval of rates, tolls, fares, and other charges by public agencies which the public agency finds are for the purpose of:

- Meeting operating expenses, including employee wage rates and fringe benefits,
- Purchasing or leasing supplies, equipment, or materials,
- Meeting financial reserve needs and requirements,
- Obtaining funds for capital projects, necessary to maintain service within existing service areas, or
- Obtaining funds necessary to maintain such intra-city transfers as are authorized by city charter.

**This project is exempt under Section 15273 because:**

The Project involves the modification and restructuring of fees and approval of rates for the purpose of meeting operating expenses, and other inflation factors including salary increases, stricter regulatory compliance requirements and increased permitting fees. As such, due to the administrative nature of the Project, no environmental resources will be affected; therefore, the Project meets the scope and intent of Section 15273, Statutory Exemption.

**FINDINGS:**

1. Based upon the identified exemptions and justifications above, the RCDWR, on behalf of the County, hereby concludes that no physical environmental impacts are anticipated to occur and the Project as proposed is exempt under CEQA. No further environmental analysis is warranted.
2. The proposed Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3), and statutorily exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15273.
3. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this Project would have a direct, indirect, or cumulatively significant effect on the environment; therefore, the activity is exempt under CEQA as previously identified.



The Rural Site Access Commercial Card shall be necessary for admittance to the Oasis Landfill for all non-permitted/contracted entities hauling commercial waste. For use by commercial entities of Oasis, Mecca, North Shore, and Thermal. Business address must be provided at time of commercial card purchase.

**COMMERCIAL CARD REGULATIONS:**

A Rural Site Access Commercial Card provides for disposal of commercial waste generated within the remote service areas and is required unless a permitted waste hauler or other large commercial users have negotiated a separate contract for disposal access to rural landfills with the County.

- Number of Uses** - The Commercial Card allows twenty-four (24) ½ ton available uses.
- Expiration Date** - There is no expiration date for the Commercial Card.
- No Refunds** - There are no refunds on partially used cards. If a commercial operator goes out of business, there shall be no refund for the unused card punches.
- Cost** - The Commercial Card fee is six hundred fourteen dollars and seven cents (\$614.07).
- Payment for Card** - The card shall be purchased in advance of usage. Cards may be purchased at any time of the year. Acceptable forms of payment at the landfill include money order, cashier's check, and credit/debit card. Credit/debit card payments include a processing fee of 1.5% of the transaction amount. Additional forms of payment, including cash and personal/business checks, are accepted at the Department's business office.
- Lost Cards** - Lost cards are to be reported immediately. The customer will not be responsible for unauthorized use of a card after it is reported lost to the Waste Resources business office located at 14310 Frederick St., Moreno Valley, CA. (951) 486-3200.
- Uncovered/Unsecured Load Fee** - A fee of \$10.00 will be assessed per uncovered/unsecured load of refuse which has exposed material which in the opinion of the General Manager-Chief Engineer or his/her designee may litter roadways to the landfill or along landfill roads to the dumping pad. Load must arrive at the pay window covered and/or tied/strapped down.
- Restrictions on Use of Card** - Hazardous waste, tires, or other hard-to-handle waste will not be accepted at the Oasis landfill from commercial haulers.

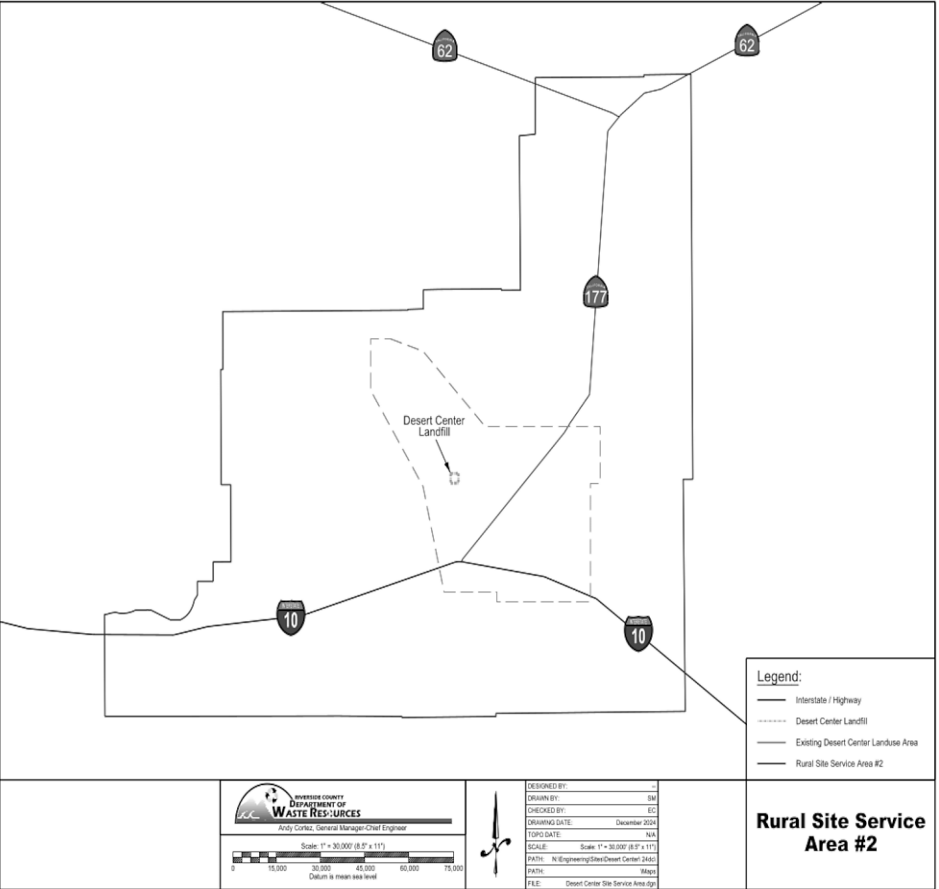
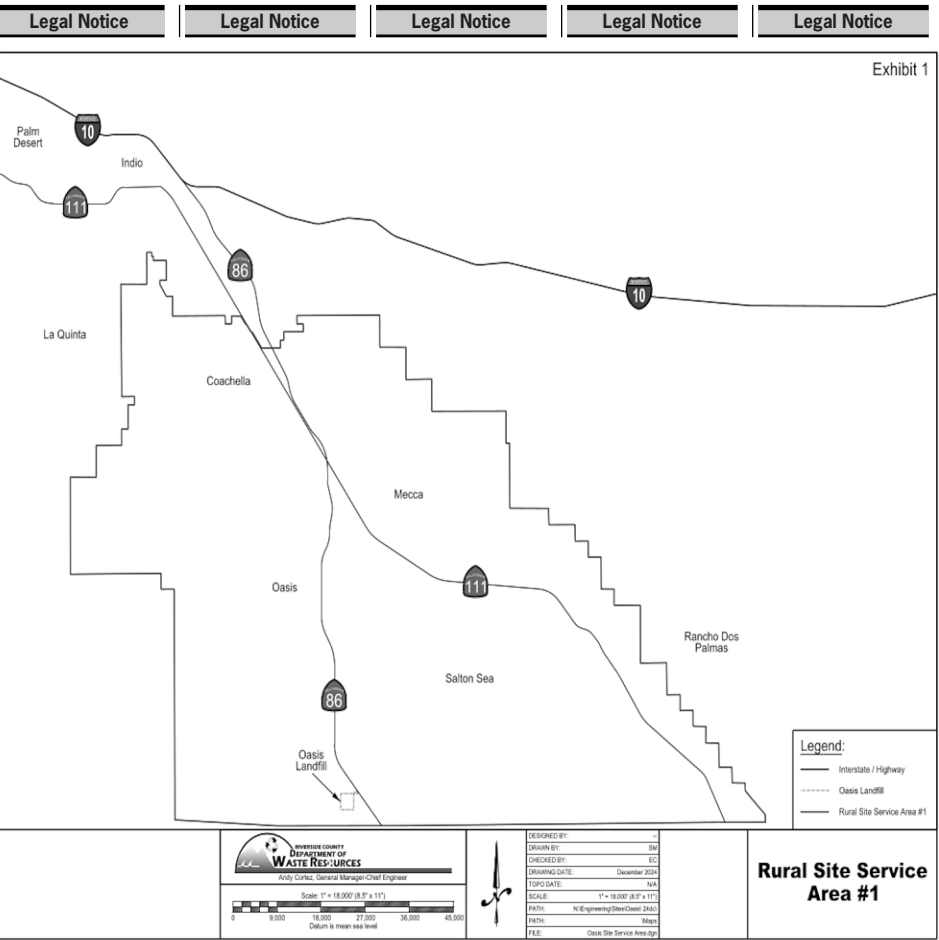


