BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. The donation to the Eastvale Chamber of Commerce (\$500.00) will support the National Day of Prayer, which was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress and signed into law by President Truman to gather with faith leaders, business owners, first responders, and community members.
2. The donation to the Temescal Heritage Foundation (\$4,000.00) will be used to support the Temescal Valley Community Faire to bring together the community and local businesses to learn more about the unincorporated community, service providers, and development plans within the region.
3. The donation to the Riverside County Youth Commission (\$4,000.00) will be used to support the 27th Annual Youth Summit, which addresses the issue of career uncertainty by providing high school students with opportunities to attend a college and career forum and participate in a financial literacy courses.
