- 4. Direct the Clerk of the Board to file the Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk and Office of Planning and Research within five (5) business days.



BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Riverside County Workforce Development Board (RCWDB) is a private sector led policy and oversight body that supports the development of the regional workforce. The RCWDB is governed by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA). Federal funds received under WIOA are allocated to activities that link resources, people, businesses, and education resulting in a competitive workforce. Related programs and services benefit workers and employers in Riverside County.

The California Workforce Development Board (CWDB) is responsible for *designating* Local Workforce Areas, or geographic areas that receive WIOA funding and administer related programs and services to job seekers and employers. The CWDB also is responsible for certifying Local Workforce Development Boards, which provide oversight to WIOA activities in their geographic area. The CWDB designated Riverside County as a Local Workforce Area and certified the RCWDB as a Local Board initially in 2015. In 2016 through 2018, Riverside County was certified for one-year periods. Then, in 2019, 2021 and 2023, the county was certified for two-year periods each. The current designation and certification is set to expire on June 30, 2025.

To request continued designation and recertification, the CWDB requires submission of an Application for Local Area Subsequent Designation and Local Board Recertification (Application). The RCWDB has met requirements set forth in the Application, including performing successfully, sustaining fiscal integrity, engaging in regional planning processes with San Bernardino County Workforce Development, and meeting Board membership requirements. The RCWDB approved this Application on April 16, 2025, and authorized its submission for approval. The Chair of the RCWDB and the Chair of the Riverside County Board of Supervisors (as local Chief Elected Official) must sign the Application, which is attached hereto. The Application is due to CWDB for approval on or before May 26, 2025.

Subject to CWDB's approval of the Application, subsequent designation and recertification will be effective July 1, 2025, for a two-year period, ending June 30, 2027. Staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors approve the Application and authorize the Chair to sign it.

SUBMITTAL TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE. STATE OF CALIFORNIA

The proposed Application was reviewed and determined to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), Common Sense, General Rule Exemption. The project relates to the provision of leadership activities supporting the workforce system and strategic partnerships, and it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the aforementioned services may have a significant effect on the environment and will not lead to any direct or reasonable indirect physical environmental impacts, as they will have purely financial and administrative impacts.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

Renewed designation of Riverside County as a local workforce development area enables the County to continue receiving WIOA funding to provide residents and employers with workforce services. Recertification of the RCWDB allows its continued role of providing oversight of the County's workforce development system, benefiting job seekers and employers in Riverside County.

Additional Fiscal Information

There is no cost related to the Application, no County General funds are used for WIOA programs, and no budget adjustment is necessary.



Reasons Why Project is Exempt: The proposed Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA specifically by the State CEQA Guidelines as identified below. The Project will not result in any specific or general exceptions to the use of the categorical exemption as detailed under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2. The Project will not cause an impact to an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern nor would the Project include a reasonable possibility of having a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances. The Project would not result in impacts to scenic highways, hazardous waste sites, historic resources, or other sensitive natural environments, or have a cumulative effect to the environment. No significant environmental impacts are anticipated to occur with the WDB Application through the partnership between the County and State Board.

Section 15061 (b) (3)- "Common Sense" Exemption: In accordance with CEQA, the use of the Common Sense Exemption is based on the "general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment." State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b) (3). The use of this exemption is appropriate if "it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment." Ibid. This determination is an issue of fact and if sufficient evidence exists in the record that the activity cannot have a significant effect on the environment, then the exemption applies and no further evaluation under CEQA is required. See No Oil, Inc. v. City of Los Angeles (1974) 13 Cal. 3d 68. The ruling in this case stated that if a project falls within a category exempt by administrative regulation or 'it can be seen with certainty that the activity in question will not have a significant effect on the environment', no further agency evaluation is required. With certainty, there is no possibility that the Project may have a significant effect on the environment. The WDB activities support workforce services provided by the Count through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. The WDB Application will provide a subsequent recertification of the WDB between the two entities that allow for the implementation of workforce services in Riverside County. The WDB Application subsequent recertification will not result in any direct or indirect physical effects. Therefore, in no way, would the Project as proposed have the potential to cause a significant environmental impact and the Project is exempt from further CEQA analysis.

Based upon the identified exemptions above, the County of Riverside, HWS/Workforce Development Division hereby concludes that no physical environmental impacts are anticipated to occur and the Project as proposed is exempt under CEQA. No further environmental analysis is required.

The Inland Empire Regional Planning Unit (IERPU) is comprised of the San Bernardino County Workforce Development Board (SBCWDB) and the Riverside County Workforce Development Board (RCWDB). The two WDB's of the IERPU created a vision statement for the region to set the strategic direction for planning and implementation.

The workforce development vision for the Inland Empire is a reinvented regional system that engages business and industry in identifying high quality jobs and designing training programs to prepare a competitive workforce. The IERPU partners will prepare the workforce by ensuring that

services address barriers to employment and promote education attainment to create pathways from dependency to prosperity.

As part of a four-year planning process, the IERPU developed a regional workforce development plan to address the needs of the Inland Empire community. The purpose of this planning process and regional plan creation serves to develop equitable, regional, sector-based career pathways in target sectors, ensuring access and inclusion for all the region's residents, businesses, and organizations.

Our team initiated the planning process by implementing an inclusive approach, actively gathering input for the regional plan from partner organizations, employers, and other key stakeholders through a series of interactive virtual meetings. Participants were encouraged to share their ideas on how the region's workforce system could address community needs across four critical areas: developing career pathways to the middle class, ensuring access and inclusion for all, preparing for the future workforce, and establishing a high-road workforce system.

The Inland Empire Regional Planning Unit (IERPU) collaborated as members of both the Riverside County Workforce Development Board and the San Bernardino Workforce Development Board, synthesizing the feedback gathered and integrating it into the plan. This IERPU 2025-28 plan serves as a strategic framework for current regional coordination and implementation.

Additionally, the Regional Organizers and Workforce Development Board (WDB) administrative leadership from both Riverside and San Bernardino Counties reviewed past goals and assessed current trends prior to engaging with the state to negotiate regional performance measures. These collaborative discussions ensure a comprehensive review and foster regional consensus as both counties move forward.

Local Area Assurances
